



## **Why Participate in the Civic Census?**

By participating in the annual census, all City residents benefit. How is the census data used?

- Census information is used by the Province for the determination of municipal per capita grants, which support areas such as police and libraries.
- City business units base decisions on population for services, such as transportation, roads, transit, fire protection, police services, recreation, etc.
- School Boards use this information for enrolment predictions, future schools, transportation needs, etc.
- Census information is valuable to The City for planning and managing future growth.

1. **TOTAL POPULATION:** an increase of 22,563 during the past year.
- ◆ Calgary's population grew from 1,042,892 in April 2008 to 1,065,455 in April 2009. This represents an increase of 2.16%.
  - ◆ Ten communities had a population increase of more than 1,000 persons. The communities are Auburn Bay (1,142), Bridlewood (1,022), Cranston (1,262), Evergreen (1,125), New Brighton (1,200), Panorama Hills (2,156), Saddle Ridge (1,271), Silverado (1,312), Taradale (1,341), & Tuscany (1,067).
  - ◆ Two communities grew more than 100%. The communities are Sage Hill (242.31%) & Silverado (100.31%).

2. **NATURAL INCREASE:** decreased slightly during 2009, but continues to be a constant source of growth.
  - ◆ Natural increase is a result of the excess of births over deaths. The natural increase during 2008 – 2009 was 9,643 persons, down 52 over the previous period 2007 – 2008.
3. **NET MIGRATION:** an increase of 12,920 persons over the past 12 months.
  - ◆ Net migration is the difference between the number of persons moving into Calgary and the number moving away.
  - ◆ Over the past 12 months, 12,920 more people moved into Calgary than moved away. This amount of net in-migration to the city is an increase of 479 from 2008.
5. **HOUSING:** housing stock continues to rise, however, the vacancy rate has increased.
  - ◆ The number of dwellings both existing and under construction is 438,663. This is an increase of 5,666 over April 2008.
  - ◆ The number of vacant dwelling units in Calgary increased from 9,199 in 2008 to 13,012 in 2009. The overall vacancy rate in the city is 3.08%, up from 2.23 % in April 2008.
  - ◆ There are now 409,881 occupied dwellings. Of this number, 291,698 or 71.14% are owner-occupied. In 2008, the comparable percentage was 71.64%.
6. **CONCLUSION:** Calgary has experienced population growth over the last year, and the economy continues to grow.

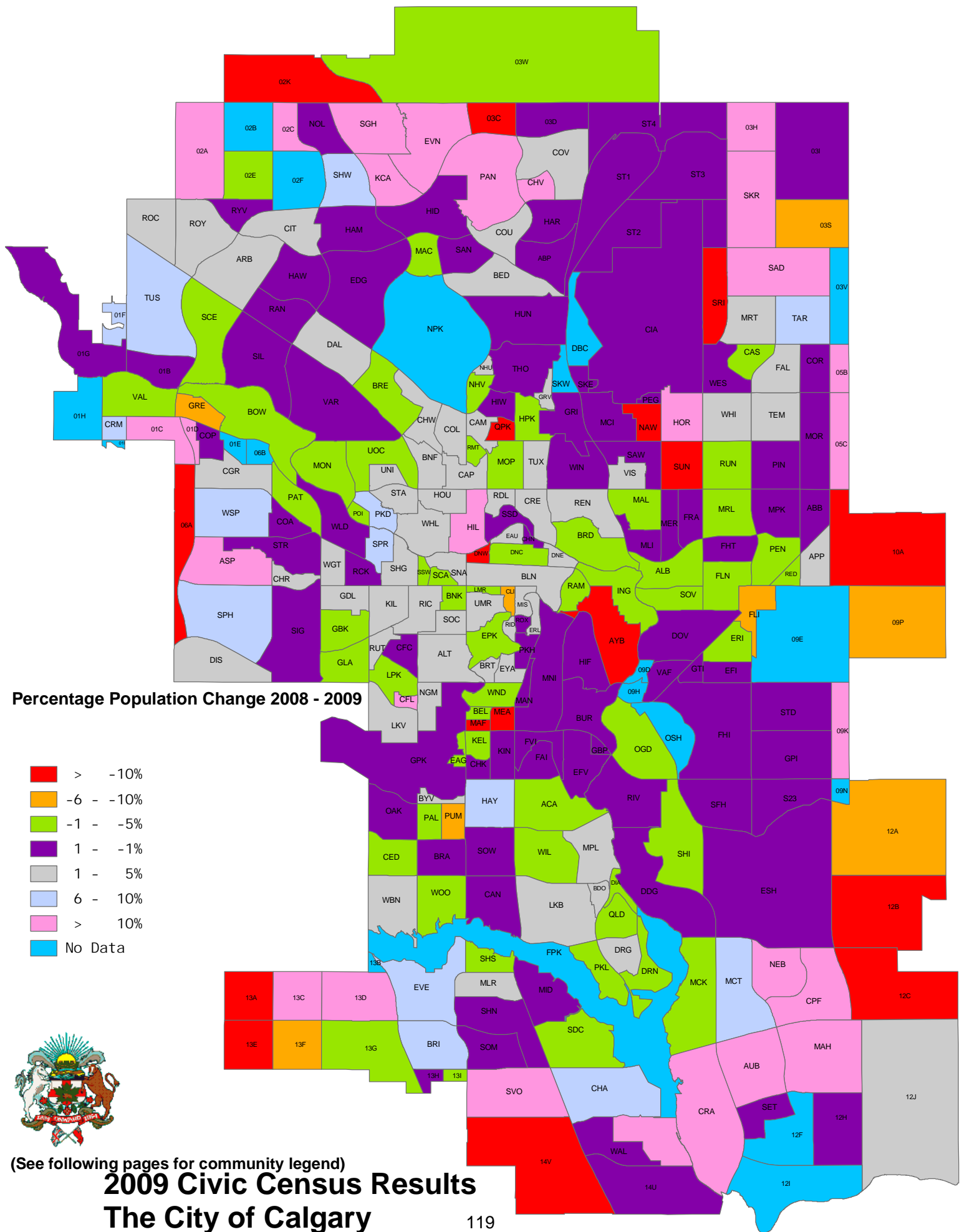

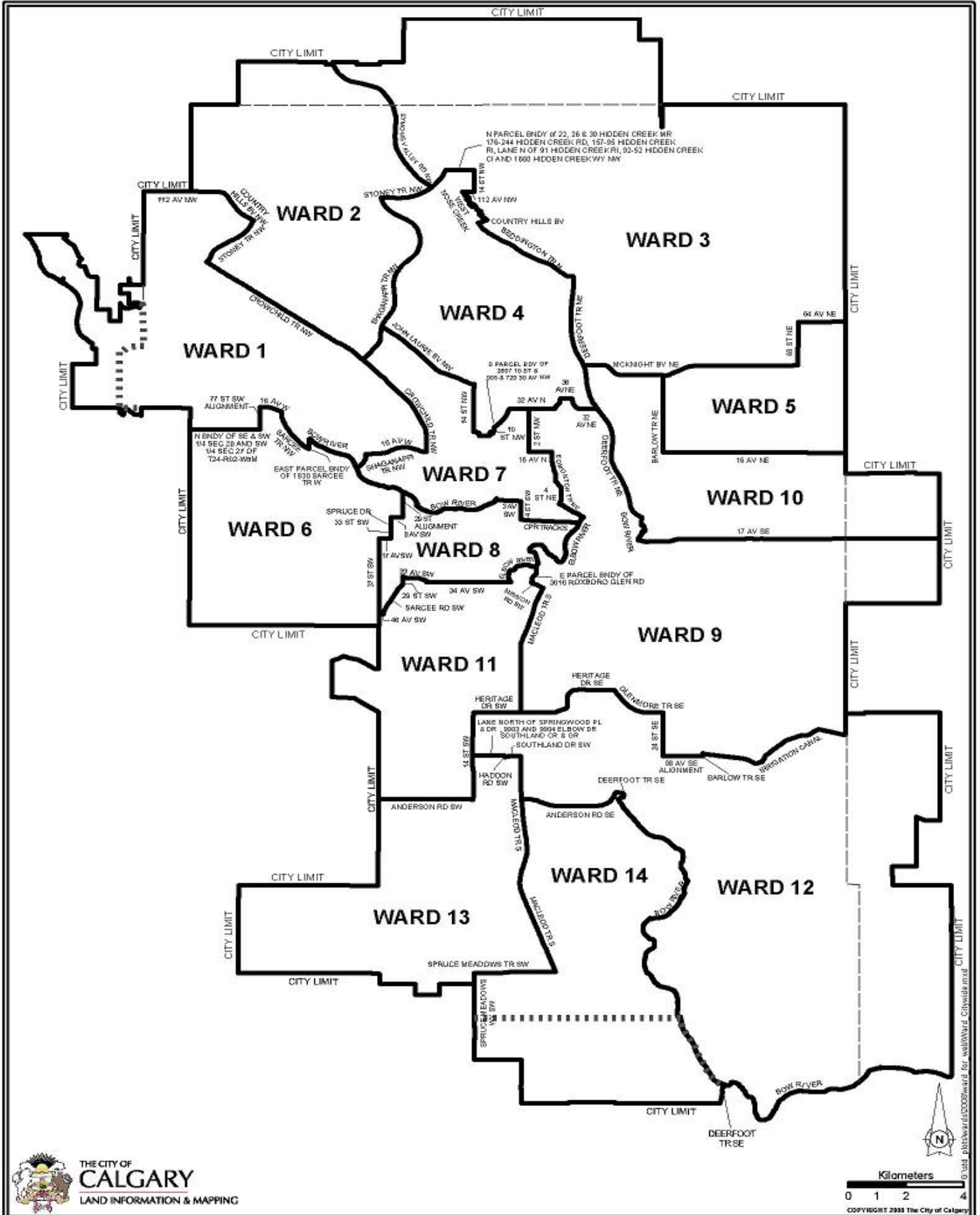


Percentage Population Change 2008 - 2009
