


Richmond Road SW – What we've heard

These comments were compiled from the Main Streets public engagement activities which took place from November 2014 through May 2015. The top issues, opportunities and outcomes were ranked in order of consensus and ratings from citizens. The dotted line on the map indicates the potential area to be considered for change as described by citizens (for example, potential areas for mixed use development). This input will be analyzed to inform the planning strategy for each main street.





1. Safe and vibrant main street sidewalks

An active, safe and comfortable high quality sidewalk area providing a high degree of pedestrian and bicycle mobility.



2. High quality public realm

More street trees along Richmond Road, with more public spaces along street with quality design and interesting places.



3. More green and open space

with citizens; additional analysis and research will be completed to determine future locations for change

Increase the amount of green space and enhance existing open spaces.



OPPORTUNITIES

- Focus density on larger sites
 (ends of Main Street) with low to
 mid rise residential buildings
- Traffic calming along Richmond Rd - this is needed to create a more pedestrian friendly environment
- Walkability is very important should be interesting and safe
- 4. Senior housing within a variety of

- housing types
- Become a Main Street with shops and restaurants
- Existing parking lots are an opportunity for high density
- Scale of built form if and when redevelopment does occur, respect existing building heights when constructing adjacent to existing residential properties
- Maintain and enhance existing trees - no loss of existing greenspace
- 9. Bus to downtown/return of the 108 bus
- 10. Improve the cycling network in the area (more lanes and paths)
- Local community services and amenities that promote aging in place
- Public places where people can gather to sit (particularily at commercial spaces)

ISSUES

- Transportation concerns, new development and construction of ring road.
- 2. Loss of transit, not enough transit, poor links downtown
- Transit along Richmond Road to Marda Loop - There is no public transit along Richmond Rd/33

Ave between 20 and 37 Streets

- 4. Motorists using 35 Ave in Rutland Park
- Reduce cut throughs (shortcutting)
- 6. Crossing Richmond Rd is dangerous/challenging
- 7. Concern about zoning of RC-1 sites to RC-2
- 8. Enhance the walking experience
- . Cycling/walking is difficult and should be safer
- 10. Protect pedestrians from traffic
- 11. Sidewalks are not wide enough

12. Access to the businesses is difficult (traffic, numerous accesses, lane)
