 - The Urban Wildlife Management Status Report is in preparation for BAC committee response (October/November);
 - Researchers are being sought to complet a literature review and best practices for the Integrated Pest Management (IPM) and Natural Area Management Plan (NAMP)

- Wild City Mapping: Steven's work plan has on it a revision of the current City of Calgary biodiversity website
 - Current issues include determining the scope of the biodiversity website that the team must prepare for. A brief conversation about opportunities for elements of the site include past oral history initiatives
