





Encouraging Safer Public Spaces

Understanding that undesirable behavior can be reduced or discouraged through design, please use a sticky note to tell us where and when you feel unsafe or very safe and any ideas you have about making the area safer (programming, lighting, neighbourhood patrols or hubs, increased street activity...)

One of the most effective ways to promote safety and security is to improve design using Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) principles.

CPTED is a multi-disciplinary approach adopted by The City of Calgary and endorsed by the City's Universal Design Handbook. The basic idea is that people will be less likely to break the law if there is a possibility someone might be watching them. This includes:

- eliminating dark areas or "dead spaces" where there is little or no traffic
- creating open and transparent sight lines
- encouraging pedestrian traffic in the area to create a sense of community and vibrancy.

As the Master Plan is developed, the concepts and designs will be reviewed from a CPTED perspective. We will also work with the Calgary Police Service Community Liaison Officer to identify areas for improvement.
