Heavy Equipment Technician - Sample

Under the direction of the Foreman and on an assigned shift, the incumbent will be responsible for the inspection, maintenance and repair of a wide variety of medium/heavy trucks. Additionally, the trucks are equipped with gas or diesel engines, automatic transmissions, auxiliary mounted equipment, propane burner systems, trailers and heavy construction equipment. Working from repair and diagnostic manuals, the successful applicant will be responsible for inspections (Preventative Maintenance, Safety and Commercial Vehicle Inspection Program), trouble shooting, repair and overhaul of various components of these vehicles and equipment. In addition, the incumbent will provide closely detailed training and assistance to Apprentices, Pre-apprentices, Servicemen and advice to other trades. The incumbent will be required to exercise considerable independence of judgment and actions in the technical aspects of the work.

Qualifications

- A certification as a Heavy Equipment Technician or equivalent Interprovincial Red Seal recognized by Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board.
- Applicants must have or be able to obtain a Class 3 Driver's Licence (or provincial equivalent) with an air brake endorsement.
- The ability to obtain a City of Calgary operator's permit, Commercial Vehicle Inspection Program (CVIP) licence to complete and sign off Government paperwork for CVIP vehicles, and a standard set of mechanic hand tools.
- A High School diploma or equivalency (e.g. GED) will be considered an asset.
- The ability to write clear, concise reports of work completed on the work order.

Pre-employment Requirements

- An offer of employment for this position will be conditional on an applicant passing a pre-employment drug test. Failure to pass a pre-employment drug test may prevent an applicant from being hired into any safety sensitive position for a period of up to twelve months.
- Successful applicants must provide proof of qualifications.
