

Wins of the Week | Highlights, Successes & Milestones

• Transit peace officers responded to a text from Calgary Transit Ambassadors that there were people loitering at Whitehorn LRT Station. When the officers arrived at the station, they found a subject with a garbage bag full of unopened liquor bottles. Transit dispatch contacted Calgary Police Service (CPS) and inquired if there had been a theft complaint from a nearby liquor store. CPS confirmed there had been a liquor theft and took custody of the male and \$240.00 of stolen property. Calgary Police charged the person with the stolen liquor with theft. The accused was transported to arrest processing.

The increase in staffing reflects in more station patrols and responses to call for service.

A frantic parent used the help phone at the Zoo LRT Station to report that she
had been separated from her special needs children while boarding the train.
Transit peace officers intercepted the train at Franklin Station and located the
children. The officers disembarked with the children at Franklin station, where
the mother was reunited with her children.

Recent Initiatives

- Last week, additional measures were introduced to increase riders' feelings of safety and confidence in taking Transit. These include:
 - Expansion of the Calgary Transit and Calgary Police Joint Overnight Safety Initiative.
 Paired police officers and Transit peace officers to increase overnight patrols from four nights to seven nights a week.
 - Redeployment of peace officers from other operational areas to Transit areas of high concern along 7th Avenue.
 - Doubling of contracted security guards at stations from 8 to 16 and increasing to 24 by the end of April.
- Improvements to the design, maintenance of operation of Transit infrastructure (with the goal of preventing crime) were also announced. These include:
 - Safety announcements and increased cleaning at Ctrain stations.
 - Rapid response to vandalism of Transit infrastructure.
