




Transit Safety Snapshot



This is a weekly update to critical indicators of safety for Calgarians. Transit riders are reminded that they can discreetly report immediate safety or security concerns by sending a text to 74100. Staff will assist and dispatch officers, if needed.












Both weapons-related calls and overdose responses continue to present an upward trend which presents an increased level of social disorder affecting the transit system and the community.

Wins of the Week | Highlights, Successes & Milestones

Transit peace officers continue to respond to a high volume of service requests.

- Transit peace officers responded to a call for service relating to a 60-year-old male that was refusing to disembark from a Transit bus. The male had a disability that impaired his mobility and ability to communicate. Peace officers identified the male as a missing person, notified Calgary Police Service, and transported him to his residence.
- An operator observed two unaccompanied young children on a CTrain, both in distress. The operator informed the Operations Centre and Transit peace officers were dispatched. With the help of the officers, both children were reunited with their parents.

Recent Initiatives

- Additional measures were introduced to increase riders' feelings of safety and confidence in taking Transit. These include:
 - Expansion of The City and Calgary Police Joint Overnight Safety Initiative. Paired police
 officers and Transit peace officers to increase overnight patrols from four nights to seven
 nights a week.
 - Redeployment of peace officers from other operational areas to Transit areas of high concern along 7th Avenue.
 - Doubling of contracted security guards at stations from 8 to 16 and increasing to 24 by the end of April.
- Improvements to the design, maintenance of operation of Transit infrastructure (with the goal of preventing crime) were also announced. These include:
 - Safety announcements and increased cleaning at Ctrain stations.
 - Rapid response to vandalism of Transit infrastructure.
