











The Community Outreach Team (COT) has increased referrals and transports by 195% since last week. They are supporting CEMA in providing help and services for vulnerable, unhoused

- Transit Peace Officers returned confidential documents that were left unattended at the CTrain platform.
   These documents contained information on medical history as well as permanent residency for the family.
- With the assistance of Transit Peace Officers, a missing child was successfully reunited with their family.
   After speaking with the child, the officer contacted Calgary Police Services (CPS). CPS were actively searching for the child with the aid of a Helicopter Air Watch for Community Safety (HAWCS) and bike patrols.

## **Upcoming Initiatives**

- From September 17-21, Calgary is hosting the 2023 World Petroleum Congress. In preparation for the event, Calgary Police Services and Transit Public Safety have been training to provide a coordinated incident response plan.
- The Calgary Pride Parade is scheduled to take place on Sunday, September 3, 2023. The parade will commence its march at the intersection of 9th Ave and 4th St SW and will proceed towards Fort Calgary. Transit Public Safety personnel will assist at traffic intersections and be included in the command group at the tactical operations center.
