Wins of the Week Highlights, Successes & Milestones

- Calgary Police Service and Transit Public Safety officers are continuing the overnight safety partnership initiative that is focused on reducing social disorder issues on the Transit system.
- The Community Outreach Team (COT) visited a client who is currently in custody at Calgary's Remand Centre. With the help of the COT team, the client has been enrolled in a program to maintain sobriety and mental stability. He will go directly from remand to the program.
- The Transit Public Safety recruitment project is in its final stages. A total of 28 Transit peace officers have been hired since the project began in September 2022 representing a 25 percent expansion of officers. Later this month, 14 of these new recruits will graduate and be deployed on the system.

Starting Feb. 27, Alberta sheriffs will join Calgary police officers in downtown patrols for a 3-month pilot. Transit Public Safety is exploring the possibilities and options to work collaboratively with Alberta Sheriffs and Calgary Police Service with this opportunity related to transit safety.
