


## Transit Safety Snapshot For the period of Jan. 23 -29, 2023











Wins of the Week Highlights, Successes & Milestones

- The Transit Public Safety recruitment unit attended a Careers in Law Enforcement Information Event in Calgary. The event was organized by Voice of Immigrants in Canada for Empowerment (VOICE), an immigrant-serving organization. This was an opportunity to engage with a more diverse pool of potential candidates and encourage them to apply for peace officer positions with The City.
- A good news story about Transit's Help button, and the safety services it connects riders with, was published in the City Newsroom.
- The Community Outreach Team (COT) participated in the "Pop-Up Care Village" one-day event at the downtown Kerby Centre. The event – which is for anyone experiencing systemic vulnerabilities such as homelessness, addiction, mental health issues and poverty – attracted more than 400 people needing services and resources.
- The COT team also attended "Coffee with a Uniform" at Brookfield Place. These events help to enhance community trust and build partnerships.

## Recent Initiatives

- Calgary Police Service and Calgary Transit Public Safety continue to work in a joint operation during overnight hours to help address social disorder issues after regular revenue service hours.
- With temperatures dipping below -19°c, the Extreme Cold Weather Strategy was activated, and Transit-provided shuttles transported people experiencing homelessness from LRT stations to shelters. A member of the Downtown Outreach Addictions Partnership (DOAP) team and a Transit peace officer were stationed on each of these buses to provide support and assistance.
