Wins of the Week | Highlights, Successes & Milestones

- A joint operation with Calgary Police Service (CPS) resulted in an additional 6 officers on duty during the overnight (2200-0600hrs) shift Thursday through Saturday, with one peace officer partnered with one police officer working on our system.
 A total of 12 security guards were patrolling the system this week, covering morning and afternoon shifts. This number is regularly reviewed with the intent of adding security guards when possible.
- The November recruitment class of 14 Transit Safety peace officers has reached the mid-point in training. All recruits were successful in passing mid-term exams and will graduate in February.
- The Community Outreach Team and CPS are coordinating plans for inmates of the Calgary Remand Centre that will see
 them go directly into drug treatment centres upon release. In the past, releases from remand were made without supports
 or plans in place.
- In the past week, the COT successfully worked with two individuals to identify sustainable housing solutions for them. This work was done in collaboration with partner agencies.

Upcoming initiatives

- In February, the next recruit class of 12 transit peace officers is scheduled to be onboarded.
- In the coming weeks, The City is looking to add additional security guards to help patrol the transit system.
- CPS' support for night shifts will also be increased.
