Over the past 27 weeks, reported weapons have been trending down. Since January 2023 on Calgary Transit properties, the highest reporting of weapons observed was 15, and the lowest was this past week with one. With the increase of officers on the system, the visual presence of uniforms has increased compliance to City bylaws.

## Wins of the Week Highlights, Successes & Milestones

- During the first weekend of the Calgary Stampede, Transit peace officers patrolled 65 CTrain stations and had 193
  positive interactions with the public.
- Two children were reported missing on Transit this past weekend. Transit peace officers successfully located and reunited both missing children with their parents.
- Transit peace officers provided education and enforcement of the City's bylaws by issuing 33 violation tickets and giving 175 verbal warnings related to Stampede events and activities on Calgary Transit system.
- One of Calgary Outreach Team's (COT) clients graduated from addiction treatment and is starting a new job next week. He is very grateful and believes that his life would not have changed without COT.

## **Recent & Upcoming Initiatives**

 The onboarding of a new class of Transit peace officers is scheduled to begin on August 14, 2023.
