




## Transit Safety Snapshot For the period of Jul. 10 – Jul. 16, 2023





Wins of the Week Highlights, Successes & Milestones

COT is working with two outreach teams instead of four outreach teams.

- Calgary Transit received a customer commendation for Transit peace officers who helped to return a missing wallet containing \$1,900 to a citizen riding Calgary Transit Route 9 on July 7. Officers collaborated with the Calgary Transit operator to quickly locate the wallet and cash and safely return it to the owner.
- Community Outreach Team (COT) is working alongside CPS Police and Crisis Team (PACT). They have been able to successfully house six of their most vulnerable clients over the past 12 months.
- Transit Public Safety and the Calgary Police Service Traffic Unit successfully managed extremely large crowds exiting the Calgary Stampede grounds each night following the fireworks show.

## **Upcoming Initiatives**

- Cold weather response planning has started with discussions surrounding deployment options for the Cold Weather Emergency Shuttle. This program launched last year and is in partnership with the Calgary Homeless Foundation.
- Recruitment for Community Outreach Teams is underway to fill two vacant positions.
