



## **Transit Safety Snapshot** For the period of Jul. 17 – Jul. 23, 2023




Station Patrols **Current Week** 494 Last Week 530 29-Week Trend







Transit peace officers and contract security carry Naxalone to provide first aid response to any reported drug poisonings.

Wins of the Week Highlights, Successes & Milestones

- The Community Outreach Team (COT) is assisting a homeless senior citizen and their pet to secure housing. The senior is camping and does not have any substance abuse issues. COT has secured storage for the senior's personal items until a permanent residence is found.
- During the hot weather, COT distributed bottled water to homeless persons with vulnerabilities.
- A five-year-old child boarded the train while the mother was attempting to load a stroller. Before the mother could get on, the doors closed, and the train left the station. The mother called Calgary Police Service who then notified Transit. The train travelled one stop, at which time the child was located by Calgary Transit peace officers who transported the child back to the mother.

## **Upcoming Initiatives**

- Transit Public Safety (TPS) continue their overnight safety initiative partnership with Calgary Police Service until the end of August 2023. Three teams will patrol the CTrain system seven days a week between the hours of 18:00 to 03:30 hours. The goal of the joint initiative is to increase officer visibility on transit and identify safety/disorder issues before they become significant incidents.
- TPS Downtown Safety Unit is assisting Parks by proactively patrolling parks and green spaces adjacent to Transit properties. This includes Olympic Plaza, Century Gardens, and Courthouse Park.
