Wins of the Week Highlights, Successes & Milestones

• Calgary Transit peace officers, Calgary Police Service, and security guards have been working together to enhance safety on the LRT line. This past week, a security guard observed a subject release pepper spray on a train that was travelling on 7th Avenue. The security guard followed the accused and maintained contact with peace officers and Calgary Police, providing critical information that led to the offender being intercepted, arrested and charged.

 The Community Outreach Team (COT) is working with the Calgary Remand Centre (CRC) to set up release plans for inmates who are awaiting trial or sentencing. COT supports the inmate in their court appearances and advocates for a release plan that allows the inmate to go directly into treatment or sober living upon release, thereby reducing the risk that the individual returns to drug use or homelessness.

Recent Initiatives

- On June 5, Calgary Transit launched its Downtown Safety Unit (DSU). The eightmember peace officer unit will patrol the downtown core, focusing on the 7th Avenue LRT corridor and surrounding areas
- Also on June 5, the Transit peace officers that graduated in May hit the streets for their first phase of officer coaching. The officers who graduated on February 24 have now completed their officer coaching phase.
