



Transit Safety Snapshot For the period of Mar. 6 – Mar. 12, 2023





Wins of the Week | Highlights, Successes & Milestones

- The Community Outreach Team (COT) has expanded its operations with the addition of a fifth Transit peace officer. Each officer is partnered with one outreach worker from the Downtown Outreach Addiction Partnership (DOAP) team from Alpha House Society. Its mandate is to connect Calgary's most vulnerable Transit users with services.
- Transit regularly receives feedback from riders regarding their experiences on the Transit system. Here is one example from this week: "A customer regularly takes the Somerset train Monday-Friday from City Hall station going to 39 Avenue station. He has noticed a positive difference in relation to safety issues. He said he saw fewer people taking shelter or creating a disturbance at the stations now. He also wants to mention that the peace officers are always very polite and nice whenever he gets a chance to talk to them".

Recent Initiatives

- The 14 newly graduated officers have received their Provincial Peace Officer appointments and have begun their 12-week officer coach phase. New officers will work with two assigned senior officer coaches experiencing and learning from the practical application of their induction training.
- Transit Public Safety will be extending an invitation for a ride-along with the COT team to all members of the council or their staff. Administration will follow up with an email invitation to councillors. A ride-along is accompanying Sergeant Aalders on the transit system to better understand the purpose of COT, the work it does to help vulnerable Transit users, and the challenges experienced.
