




## Transit Safety Snapshot



















Security guard placements (based on incidents)

Wins of the Week | Highlights, Successes & Milestones

- Transit peace officers helped Calgary Police Services (CPS) to detain a suspect in the Fourth Street stabbing incident that occurred on March 15. As per the CPS media release: "Calgary Transit peace officers were incredibly helpful by detaining the suspect until police could arrive on scene." says Det. Keith Silvester with the District 7 General Investigations Unit. "With their help, we were able to resolve this incident quickly, ensure the victims received medical attention, and secure the LRT station while we investigated." - The Community Outreach Team (COT) and the Community Safety's Partner Agency Liaison (PAL) team met last week. Both teams focus on creating positive working relationships and open communication channels with numerous social agencies and businesses who work to support vulnerable populations. With realignment, both teams are now embedded in the same business unit. This affords greater opportunities for collaboration and sharing of best practices.
- The COT also met with Calgary Transit Ambassadors last week. Calgary Transit launched the Ambassador program in December, which is part of a new initiative to maintain visibility, build rapport, and support Transit customers with wayfinding or questions on trains and platforms. Members of the COT team provided the ambassadors with practical insights and resources to help them when engaging with the vulnerable population.

## **Recent Initiative**

Recently-graduated Transit peace officers have received their Provincial Peace Officer appointments and have progressed to their 12week officer coach phase. New officers will work with two assigned senior officer coaches experiencing and learning from the practical application of their training.
