






There is an upward trend in arrests made which may be due to the joint operation between Transit peace officers and Calgary Police Service (CPS). The 6

Wins of the Week | Highlights, Successes & Milestones

- A customer called 311 to say thank you to the peace officers. While riding on a bus, the customer noticed a few people sleeping on the bus seats. Peace officers met the bus at an LRT station and assisted the sleeping individuals.
- A grandmother used the Transit Help Phone to report that her 4-year-old grandchild had boarded a train without her. The
 train operator located the child on the train and held the train until peace officers arrived. Peace officers took the child back
 to meet her grandmother and reunited the family.
- Transit peace officers identified a woman from a Calgary Police Service "Need to Identify" bulletin, where a senior was
 robbed and assaulted by two people. The officers observed the accused at Sunalta Station and contacted CPS. Calgary
 Police arrived, arrested, and charged the woman for the robbery. Transit peace officers issued a Transit ban to the
 accused.

Recent Initiative

The Community Outreach Team (COT) has been undertaking joint outreach initiatives with Calgary Police District 3 and the Tsuu T'ina Police wrap around team. The goal of the Tsuu T'ina team is to connect people back into their community. The Tsuu T'ina Nation borders The City of Calgary. The COT team also connected a client with the Diversion Team. Diversion is an option when a homeless person requires minimal support to secure housing.
