ANNUAL REPORT 1940

To His Worship the Mayor, Commissioner, and City Council:

Gentlemen:

I beg to present my 27th Annual Report dealing with the work of this Department.

The outstanding features of the year were the appointment of a permanent head supervisor of Playgrounds and the opening of the Municipal Swimming Pool, both of which proved an eminent success. Both of these activities are dealt with in detail later on in this Report.

There has been a considerable reduction in relief labour as compared with the previous year as the attached graph reveals. In 1939, 346,206 hours were utilized. In 1940, only 193,691 hours were made available, a decrease of 152,515 hours. Based on the experience of the last few months of 1940 and the early part of 1941, it would seem that not more than 25,000 relief labour hours would be available for the year 1941.


Weather: Whilst the precipitation for the whole year was light, plant growth did not appear to suffer greatly as a consequence, due, no doubt, to the fact that the greater part of the rain that fell came at the season when it was of greatest benefit. January was quite cold with very little precipitation. The early part of February was comparatively mild but sub-zero temperatures prevailed during the last week. March was unusually mild. April was a stormy month with much snow and sleet. May and June were cool with moderate precipitation. July was a very wet month. A hail storm on July 13th did much damage to the bedding plants and retarded the floral display considerably. There was only a trace of rain during the month of August. A terrific hurricane on the 7th did considerable damage, uprooting many large trees. September was quite wet. October was normal but there was a period of sub-zero weather in November with a return to milder weather throughout December.

Tree pests are very much on the increase in this city. This was particularly noticeable as regards spruce which were very severely attacked last season with spruce aphids and red spider. Requests for advice and help poured into the Department all summer long from citizens, but very little help could be given because of lack of adequate equipment. If this Department was furnished with a large power sprayer it would be of great assistance in combatting these pests, and would be a really good investment, because not only would the park and boulevard trees be saved from disfigurement and, in some cases, loss, but a very valuable service could be rendered to citizens. If a small charge was made for the spraying of trees on private property, which, I am sure, would be gladly paid, the city would, over a period of years, be reimbursed for the initial outlay.

Floral Displays: Annuals were very slow in getting established because of the cool spring and the hailstorm in July, but they eventually made a very fine showing, which, due to unusually favourable weather conditions in the fall, was prolonged well into the month of October.

Weed Eradication: Sodium Chlorate was used quite successfully as a weed eradicator on driveways, paths and gutters in several parks. This chemical can only be used in such places as it destroys all vegetation and is effective for some considerable time after each application. For the past several years experiments have been made with a preparation of Ammonia and Iron Sulphates with a view to ridding grass areas of dandelions and this has been proved quite effective if the preparation is used for a sufficiently lengthy period. To be permanently effective of course its use must be continuous as there is constant infestation from surrounding areas. Experiments were also made with Leyton 1-2 as a cure for brown patch and snow mould on grass areas and this preparation proved very effective.

Weeds were removed from St. Mary's School Grounds, the school authorities paying for this work. Weeds and refuse were removed from a number of vacant lots.

ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND PARK:

The flower beds and borders were particularly effective during the past season. The annuals were late in developing but, due to a very mild autumn, the display was continued for a much longer period than usual.

Picnics were held by 60 large organizations. No record was kept of the number of family picnics that were held, but there must have been hundreds of these.

The parking problem is as acute as ever. On the opening day of the Stampede no less than 479 cars had to be accommodated in the parking ground at one time. It has been possible to use relief labour to a great extent to regulate the traffic on busy days. Now that this labour is no longer available the difficulty of taking care of automobile traffic will be very greatly increased.

The horseshoe pitches established on the Island a year or two ago have proved exceedingly popular and are continuously in use.

There was a certain amount of vandalism which expressed itself on one occasion in the releasing of the coyotes which resulted in considerable destruction of specimens, particularly birds. Other acts of vandalism were, -damage to the dinosaurs and burglarizing the buildings. The concession building was broken into twice during the season. In three instances the police were able to recover tools stolen by relief workers.

Much in the way of improvements that had been planned had to be relinquished due to the shortage of relief labour.

The planting along the rockery wall on the north side of the main driveway was extended.

The baseball diamond was graded and a new back stop was erected. It is unfortunate that this diamond is situated on St. George's

Island, as, no matter how well it is kept, it constitutes an eyesore in this park and there is much more suitable land available in the vicinity.

The comfort station was put in a thorough state of repair and the interior painted and kalsomined throughout. The exterior is very badly in need of paint.

A large summer house was constructed at the west end of the Island to act as a shelter during showery weather. More buildings of this kind are needed.

The roof of the log cabin and that of the model of Fort Calgary were painted. The entrance gates were also painted.

A window was made in the west wall of the concession building for the purpose of facilitating service at this building. A lattice fence was built to protect the shrubbery in the vicinity of this building.

The construction of an open-air checker board, such as we have at the present time in Elbow Boulevard Park would be greatly appreciated. The residence is in a very dilapidated condition and should either be wrecked or restored. The same applies to the bandstand.

ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND ZOO:

The public still take a keen interest in the Zoo, as indicated by the large number of visitors to the Island at all season of the year.

The health of the specimens has been reasonably good, though there seems to be considerable tuberculosis amongst the pea fowl.

The thanks of the City and the Zoological Society are due to Dr. G. Anderson, who gives his professional services whenever required, E.D. Cotterel, Esq., of the C.P.R., who donated the metal fence posts for the new fences that were erected, R. Page, Esq., who donated the wire netting for these fences, the Union Milk Company and the British American Oil Company who donated drinking vessels for the several monkey houses, also to the many donors of feed of various kinds, a list of which is attached.

The most outstanding additions this year were: a polar bear cub, a hyena, 2 lynx kittens, a pair of green pea fowl, a pair of mute swans (later killed by wolves) and 3 or 4 new species of pheasants.

Eighty-nine pheasants, 14 chickens, 17 pea fowl, a number of quail, 4 deer, 1 mouflon sheep and 4 wolves were raised. Two lion cubs were born, but were destroyed by the mother shortly after birth.

There were three unfortunate occurrences during the past season,-- one of which has already been mentioned, namely the releasing of the coyotes,--which greatly depleted the specimens. On another occasion the wolves escaped and destroyed most of the water fowl, including swans and geese and seventeen other birds. The exhibit of native birds was almost completely wiped out by weasels. The coyotes were responsible for killing most of the young pheasants, pea fowl and guinea pigs. Dogs worried birds on one or two occasions and there were a number of thefts of young birds.

Spruce trees were planted in the pheasant pens, in the pea fowl runs and in front of the cat cages.

Some of the bare spaces in the vicinity of the dinosaur models were planted with trees and shrubs. In all 150 Spruce were planted.

The paths in front of the cages were oiled, which made it much more pleasant both for the inhabitants of the Zoo and visitors to the Island, and also had the effect of keeping the trees and shrubs in a cleaner and better looking condition.

An open-fronted shelter 60 feet long and with six 75-foot runs was erected for the pea fowl. Considerable improvement was made to the pheasant pens and two sections were joined by the construction of two entirely new pens. All woodwork was painted and minor repairs were made to all buildings.

The monkey house was thoroughly disinfected and painted inside and out, a coal chute installed, 6 windows made to open for ventilation, inside damage caused by the occupants repaired, and adjustments made to facilitate cleaning. The wooden partitions are gradually being replaced with metal ones. The store house basement that is being used as a butcher shop and the leopard house were kalsomined.

The damage done by the occupants of the rodent pens was repaired. The fence of the deer paddocks was repaired, the line of fencing on the south side being straightened and made a uniform height, 560 feet of heavy fox wire fencing and metal posts set in concrete being used. The pedestrian walk in front of these paddocks was widened and graded. An additional paddock was added on the west end.

Two hundred and forty feet of heavy fox wire fencing and metal post were used to replace the wooden fence extending from the bird houses to the beaver pen. The water service was also extended 100 feet in the same direction. Sixty-four gallons of paint was used throughout the Zoo.

A service building, consisting of a central storage, with facilities for cleaning utensils, etc., is very urgently needed.

RILEY PARK: Due to shortage of labour very little progress was made with the alteration at the east entrance, though this change should be completed as rapidly as possible, not only for the sake of appearance, but for the safety and convenience of traffic.

CRESCENT PARK: The fence was repaired, 45 new posts being used and a number of groups of trees and shrubs planted on the central area of the park.

MEMORIAL PARK: Some 100 roses were planted in the rose garden laid out in 1939 to commemorate the visit of Their Majesties, but it was not found possible to completely plant the whole area. However, the portion already planted made a great hit with the public. The discarded greenhouse roses purchased very cheaply in 1939 wintered remarkably well. A particular lawn area was treated throughout the season with ammonia-iron sulphate mixture previously experimented with elsewhere. Whilst its effect on the dandelions cannot be determined till next summer, the preparation certainly imparted wonderful vigour to the grass, thus greatly improving the appearance of this particular piece of lawn. Much of the curbing is badly decayed and should be renewed. The surfacing of the paths with red shale should be completed. A new flag is needed for the park.

PLAYGROUNDS: The Playground movement in this city commenced in 1914 when this Department placed some simple wooden apparatus - swings, teeters, etc., - on a number of vacant lots, and, for a few years supervision, or rather play leadership was provided voluntarily. From this simple beginning a considerable playground system has been evolved, so that we now have 45 playground sites many of which are fully equipped with up-to-date metal apparatus, wading pools, etc. Paid supervision for the holiday season has been provided continuously since 1922 and this year a permanent head supervisor has been engaged who is devoting his full time, the year through, to this work. During the summer months this man is engaged in generally supervising the playgrounds, training the individual supervisors and organizing leagues of various kinds. This winter his principle activities have been to organize the children into various hockey and skating leagues, and, as soon as suitable buildings can be made available, arrangements will be made for indoor activities such as volley ball, basket ball, handicrafts, etc.

For several years considerable assistance has been rendered the playground movement by the several service clubs of the city, the Rotary Club in many cases providing apparatus and the Kiwanis Club providing funds for the construction of wading pools on a number of the playgrounds. The City, however, has spent a considerable sum in providing and maintaining playgrounds as the following figures indicate.-

Attendance figures were computed according to a method devised by the National Recreation Association of America, New York City. Because of the difficulty in obtaining exact figures, the Association, after experimentation, has worked out a system which was followed in Calgary this summer. The method is to count the attendance at the peak during the morning and multiply by two; count the peak attendance in the afternoon and multiply by 2.5; count the peak attendance in the evening and multiply by 1.5 and all these added gives the daily attendance.

It was an unusually wet summer and as a result some of the playgrounds were closed in some cases for just part of the day. In totalling the number of days open three full periods were used to constitute a day.

Bankview Playground: This site was used as a supervised playground for the first time, in place of Mewata, which had been turned over to the Government for military use. It promises to be one of the most popular centres that we have, as there is a definite need for a supervised playground here, there being so many children living in this vicinity. Over 250 children were registered in its first year as a supervised centre. A great deal of interest was also shown by parents.

Sunnyside School Playground: This site is not suitable for a supervised playground and is too close to Riley Park, making it difficult for two supervisors to know at just which of the two centres the children are registered, as they go back and forth to suit their fancies.

St. George's Island Playground: This playground continued to be one of the most popular supervised centres, despite the changing from day to day of the personnel of children frequenting this playground, due to tourists, picnics, etc.

Bridgeland School Playground: For the first month that this centre was open the attendance was disappointing due to the unfortunate condition that the supervisor was not well, finally having to give it up. The supervisor appointed for the remainder of the year was well known in this vicinity and did very well as was manifested by the increased attendance.

East Calgary Rotary Playground: While this is a very popular centre for smaller children it is not large enough for any organized activities. It is too close to St. George's Island playground, consequently, the children pass back and forth at will, taking advantage only of activities that are of particular interest to them. I believe as much could be accomplished with just the one supervisor, who should be at St. George's Island playground.

Mewata Playground: As this site has been turned over to the Government for military use it was not possible to have a playground here last year. This playground was moved to Bankview playground.

Killarney Playground: This is a popular centre. A closer check will have to be kept this year as a considerable amount of damage was done and a certain amount of unpleasantness caused the supervisor, especially near the end of the playground season. A man supervisor here may solve the problem.

Victoria Rotary Playground: This was again a very popular centre having one of the largest attendances of our supervised playgrounds. The measure of success accomplished is indicated by the fact that this centre won the majority of the awards given. A community pride and enthusiasm was manifested here by both child and parent, brought out in part probably by the unusually efficient supervisor in charge, which increased as the season progressed. Advancement in all activities was shown especially in dancing and tumbling. A small platform and tumbling mats would be money well invested.

Mount Pleasant Rotary Playground: This centre being one of our best equipped playgrounds was again very popular, though there seemed to be fewer older children attending, due probably to young men signing up. This is a very popular afternoon retreat for parents in the community.

Riley Park Playground: This playground has always been very popular with last year being no exception. Here, however, a scarcity of late teen-aged children was noticed, though there were very large crowds of smaller children. Consequently, handicraft work was extremely popular with many worthwhile articles being made. The wading pool, suitable for swimming for younger children, was in use constantly, swimming lessons being given there daily.

Tuxedo Park Playground: Tuxedo had a very successful season due in part to the fact that the supervisor had been there the previous year and consequently was well known to child and parent alike. A great deal of community co-operation exists in this district, consequently much interest was manifested by the parents in what we were attempting to accomplish during the two months the playground was open.

Mission Playground: The children of this district who had previously caused trouble, damaging the shelter, had been put more or less responsible for this centre with the result that it was one of the best conducted playgrounds in the city though no supervisor was in attendance.

Central High School Playground: This playground had to be moved to Connaught, three block west, as the School Board erected a new gymnasium on the site previously used for the playground. The move proved very successful.

Elbow Park Swimming Pool: This swimming centre was again very popular being frequented in large numbers by both children and adults alike.

Connaught School Playground: This centre was moved from Central High School and proved very successful, as can be seen by the attendance statistics which show that 375 children were registered, an increase of 225 over the previous year at Central High School. A creditable showing was made by this centre in the annual inter-playground track meet, as they finished second in total points acquired.

The following is the report of the recently appointed Playgrounds Supervisor, Mr. R. Haughian:-

"The conception of play or recreation has been altered to a great extent during the past few years. It is now interpreted as an opportunity to engage in supervised activities which are of an educational as well as an entertaining nature.

The aims and objectives of recreation work may be summarized as follows:

To develop in an interesting manner

- (1) Education, in both mental and physical development.
- (2) Sense of responsibility and qualities of leadership.
- (3) Importance of fair play and good sportmanship.
- (4) Confidence in ones own abilities and value of co-operation.
- (5) Activities for leisure time and closer harmony between parent and child.
- (6) Decreased juvenile delinquency and crime, and break down race prejudice through competition in play.

The above mentioned qualities can best be achieved in pleasant and safe surroundings of what is universally recognized as a playground.

The eleven supervised playgrounds were officially opened on July 3rd. They were open with supervision during the months of July and August, Monday to Friday from 9 to 12, 2 to 5 and 7 to 9, except Monday mornings when a weekly supervisors' meeting was held at 10 o'clock.

Every activity practiced in 1939 was used during 1940 with a few being introduced for the first time. Among those newly introduced were fretsaw work, tap dancing, tumbling, various group games and in some cases the use of a playground library. A more elaborate and complete swimming programme was introduced. Also a great deal more free publicity for playground activities was obtained through the co-operation of the local papers and radio stations. A flag pole was installed at each playground for the first time, the flag being raised at the opening of the grounds for that day and lowered at the close--accompanied by a patriotic ceremony. The free co-operation of several different industrial plants was secured and each playground was taken for at least one educational trip through each of these. Each playground had at least one picnic, weiner roast, corn roast, community night and hike during the two months in which they were open.

Daily swimming instructions were given at Riley Park pool and at the Sunshine Auto Camp swimming pool. Classes for more advanced swimmers were held on Saturdays at the Y.W.C.A. and Y.M.C.A. It is hoped that the new Calgary Municipal Pool will be available to the Playground Department during the months of July and August in the future.

Near the end of the playground season the free use of a window in the Hudson's Bay Store was obtained, in which handicraft work, done on the playgrounds, was on display for four days. During that time the voluntary aid of Mrs. Vandelinder, Miss Geneva Lent and Mrs. Palmer was secured to judge the best specimens of work in each class. There were approximately 160 pieces of handicraft work on display. They included articles in fretsaw work, wool work, basket weaving, clay work, raffia work, bead work, silhouettes, sewing cards, model aeroplanes and others.

Wednesday afternoon, August 28th, an inter-playground track meet was held at Mewata Stadium with approximately 500 children participating. Victoria Playground took most of the honours, before a crowd of about 3,000 children and adult spectators.

On the evening of August 29th, the playground season officially came to a close with a performance put on by the combined efforts of all the playgrounds. It was held at Mewata Stadium under the flood lights. On display just inside the entrance were the handicraft articles which had been adjudged first, second and third in their respective classes. A crowd of approximately 2,500 spectators witnessed the performance. All assistance for this performance was voluntary, including the services of Miss M. Potts, who instructed the children in marching, Miss D. Crist, the pianist for the evening and the use of the piano from Mount Royal College. Mrs. Harold Riley assisted by soliciting over 200 prizes from various business firms. These prizes were in the nature of \$1.00 orders for merchandise and orders for ice cream and candy. Commissioner J. Tweddle made the presentations of the trophies and shields to the supervisors of the winning playgrounds.

Inter-playground leagues were run off in softball, paddle tennis, basketball, swimming and track, with a play-off at the end of the season, the respective champs being recognized either in the form of prizes for individual performances or the name of the playground on a trophy or shield for collective effort. Playground winners were: Girls softball, Victoria Rotary; boys softball, Riverside; boys paddle tennis, Victoria; girls paddle tennis, Sunnyside; basketball, Victoria; mixed softball, Riley; track meet, Victoria; handicraft, Victoria; swimming, St. George's Island and diving, East Calgary.

Assistance from the Playground Department was given to the City and Provincial Softball Leagues and to the Interscholastic and Junior Rugby Leagues. This Department also helped several children in preparing for and getting to the Interscholastic Amateur Track Meet held in Edmonton on Saturday, September 28th. A very creditable showing was made by the entries from Calgary in that three records were broken by representatives from this City.

As this report is being composed in the middle of the winter activities, a complete report will not be available. However, a Community Hockey League has been formed, consisting of 22 teams, divided into three divisions, midgets with 8 teams, intermediates with 8 teams and seniors with 6 teams. It is the first time anything of this nature has been attempted and from the interest manifested, the plan is assured of continued success in years to come. Four trophies have been donated to the Department, Aldermen, McCullough, Lancaster, Freeze and Weir each giving one. Three will be used for hockey, one for each division while the fourth will be used for a playground activity. To date 70 rinks have been flooded with more being added daily. Of these, 18 are hockey rinks, 15 lighted for skating with 8 lighted well enough to play night hockey. It is hoped that skating lessons may be taught on one or two of the rinks.

Plans for a basketball league and other indoor activities have been made but are being delayed as no indoor facilities have been acquired to date. It is hoped that a fairly large building may be acquired that is centrally located so that a year-round programme may be carried out.

A vote of thanks is due Mr. W.R. Reader, Parks' Superintendent for his valuable advice and guidance during the year and the eleven supervisors for their splendid co-operation."

The golf season was a short one due to a late spring and much rain in the fall. Due to a favourable growing season the course showed much improvement during the season and was very favourably commented on by the players.

The City Open Golf Tournament was held on June 23rd and there were about 130 entrants and although the weather was cool in the morning it turned out to be a lovely day. The T. Eaton Rose Bowl Trophy was held by two players from the Municipal Club and was successfully defended for about 8 weeks. This trophy drew quite an interest to the Course.

The bridge over the gully on the 14th fairway, erected in 1939, proved very valuable as it speeded up the play on the last 9 holes whereas in other years there was quite a tie up at this particular hole. This bridge should be painted.

A start was made on installing the water system, approximately 1,000 feet of 10 inch pipe being laid, excavation for pump house made and power line extended. This work was not completed until quite late in the season therefore it was impossible to determine to what extent this installation will benefit the course. In any case, due to the fact that last season there was abundant precipitation the course required very little artificial irrigation. I am strongly of the opinion that something more than the mere installation of the water system is required to establish a good growth of grass on this course. Due to the nature of the soil no amount of water will improve the growth unless the physical condition of the soil is improved, and I still think that \$1,000 or \$1,500 should be spent on top-dressing the fairways.

During the past few years some costly improvements have been made and so far there has been no very evident increase in revenue. The argument put forward in favour of these several improvements that they would increase the patronage of the course is, therefore,

not borne out. As a matter of fact I consider that the course is carrying a capacity load as far as players is concerned and the only alternative by which revenue might (I use the word might advisedly) be increased is by raising the fees, a most undesirable step in my opinion and a very doubtful one as regards augmented receipts.

The caretaker is asking that the locker room be re-floored, walls and ceiling plastered and wooden lockers removed and replaced with steel ones.

The Inspector of the Liquor Control Board is very insistent that the changes in entrances etc., that he requested last year should be proceeded with before another season opens.

Improvements made in 1940: Gent's tees Nos. 4, 6 and 7 were re-constructed on new locations. All mats on tees were lifted and sand removed from under them twice during the season. All fairways were kept mowed throughout the season and the rough was cut on both sides of fairways for about 20 feet in to speed up the game. Boulders were removed from ladies' fairway No. 1 and Men's fairways Nos. 9, 10, 12 and 13; 17 loads in all being removed. Some boulders were too heavy to be removed and these were sunk into the ground. Eighteen loads of soil were used to fill in holes. Sixty trees and 50 shrubs were planted. Eight hundred and four trees and 583 shrubs were pruned. Rough between fairways was burned. Fairways were watered where water was available. Fourteen barrels of heavy oil and 12 barrels of used motor oil were mixed with 40 yards of sand and all greens were re-surfaced twice during the season and all greens kept dressed with oiled sand throughout the season. Gophers were destroyed by poison and the burrows filled in. Thirty-eight moles were trapped. The partition in the bedroom of the Clubhouse was taken down and moved two feet, rebuilt and painted.

MEWATA SWIMMING POOL: The new Swimming Pool at Mewata Park was opened on July 19 and continued in operation till September 8th. A staff of 11 was employed consisting of a superintendent, assistant superintendent, 4 operators, 3 life savers and 2 lady attendants. Arrangements were made to have one operator in attendance at all times, and 2 life savers during the periods the Pool was open to the public. Records were kept showing daily attendance, cash receipts, temperature of water and air at stated periods, bacterial test, chlorine treatment, weather etc. The total attendance for the period was 17,074. The greatest attendance in one day was 708 on August 6th. The attendance from the 1st to the 8th of September was 1,001. The daily cost of operation is constant, irrespective of the amount of revenue received and, as there was considerable loss during that period it would appear that it is inadvisable to keep the pool open after August 31st. The total operating cost from July 19th to December 1st was \$2,785.57, an average daily cost for the period of operation of approximately \$55.40. The revenue received amounted to \$1,949.51 a daily average of \$38.22. It should perhaps be pointed out that there is continuous maintenance costs during the year throughout the period that it is closed as well as during the period of operation. Another point to keep in mind is that half the month of July was lost this year in so far as revenue is concerned.

Considerable work had to be done after the completion of the structure in getting the surrounding area into shape, removing debris and surplus soil, grading, laying of concrete walks, loaming etc. The strip surrounding the pool was sodded and the front area seeded to grass.

Of the above amount expended for construction, \$13,000 was donated.

MEWATA STADIUM: It is very greatly to be deplored that the Rugby Club finds it necessary to use the grounds at the Stadium so intensively and continuously and quite irrespective of weather conditions. Last season the turf in the centre of the field was completely ruined due to the fact that this area was used, night after night, for practice. This, it seems to me, was quite unnecessary, as Hillhurst Park was always available for these practice games. If this abuse of the field is continued what has long been considered one of the finest football fields in Canada will be completely spoiled.

The infield was top-dressed with fertilizer, goal mouths re-sodded, and the centre portion re-seeded. The track was scarified and relined.

NURSERIES: Spring work in the nursery was later this year than usual. Tree lifting commenced on the 15th of April, and still frost was encountered in some places, particularly where the shrubs were very thickly branched, and shading the ground. The following material was used for permanent planting in parks, cemeteries and streets: 1,614 trees; 3,542 shrubs; 19,020 perennials; 4,298 bulbs. Of these, 300 trees, 248 shrubs and 2,540 bulbs were purchased. The rest were grown in the Civic Nursery.

It was though unnecessary to make any cuttings of poplars and the common kinds of shrubs this year, so only cuttings of the choicer kinds of shrubs were taken. Two thousand seven hundred and fifty-five cuttings were made and planted.

Experiments were conducted on cuttings treated with "Rootone". There seemed to be a decided increase in percentage of cuttings which rooted, and the growth was more vigorous. Also "Camphorite" was applied to the soil and spaded in. This preparation cleaned the soil of injurious grubs and slugs. This seemed evident as the ground that was treated was badly infested with slugs in previous years, but did not show signs of this pest after treatment. Another piece of ground untreated was very badly infested with slugs. This condition seems only to persist in a certain area in the nursery. Three thousand two hundred and ninety-three trees and shrubs were transplanted in the nursery and 707 perennial plants were propagated by division the remaining plants being distributed for permanent planting in the various parks and cemeteries.

During the year 75,734 plants consisting of 334 genera and 1,184 species were raised on hotbeds. Two thousand eight hundred and seventy-two seedling perennial flowering plants were planted out in the nursery; 648 kinds and varieties of seeds of flowering plants were collected, also 26 kinds of trees and shrubs.

Through the medium of exchange 622 packets of seed was received. Shrubs and perennial flowering plants were donated to the Calgary Horticultural Society to be given as prizes in the garden competitions. An inventory of nursery stock was completed in November. The valuation of this stock is estimated at \$11,922.56

The shop carpenter constructed over 642 pieces of equipment and articles as well as making repairs to over 123 items which would include such things as sign boards, doors, sashes, shelters at playgrounds, shelving for museum specimens at the Coste residence, playground equipment and so forth.

POLICING: The Corps of Commissionaires continued to give excellent service to the Department. Six boys were convicted for causing damage to South Mount Royal Park and 5 boys for damage to Talon Avenue Park.

MISCELLANEOUS: As in previous years it was found advantageous to utilize certain relief labour as patrolmen for swimming pools, 1,054 hours being used in this way. Truck drivers' helpers absorbed 15,466 hours and sundry duties 248 hours.
