#### ANNUAL REPORT 1941

To His Worship the Mayor, Commissioner, and City Council:

Gentlemen:

I beg to submit herewith the Annual Report of the Parks'

Department for the year 1941.

The chief accomplishments of the Department during the past year was the building of a Caretaker's cottage at the Queen's Park Cemetery, together with considerable grading and gravelling of roads, the development of a large area immediately within the entrance for purely ornamental purposes, the grading and plotting of areas for burial purposes and the installation of a water system.

New playgrounds were also established at 17th Avenue and Centre Street S., at 3rd Street East and 8th Avenue, and a size prepared at the Eau Claire property 1st Avenue and 5th Street W.

Very little relief labour was available this year (44,936 hours as compared with 152,000 hours in 1940 and 346,000 in 1939) but as provision was made for noid labour in the estimates it was possible provision was made for paid labour in the estimates it was possible to carry on the normal work of the Department in a very satisfactory way.

Weather: On the whole the season was a favourable one from a horticultural point of view while it lasted, but very short. Strange to say, the unseasonable mildness of the early months did no apparent damage to trees and shrubs, but this was probably due to the fact that the warm weather continued right on into the spring and there was no reversion to winter conditions. Precipitation for the year was much below normal, but heavy rains occurred during those seasons when vegetation was at the height of its growth, and consequently did not appear to suffer to any serious extent, a clear indication that the amount of precipitation is much less important than having that precipitation at the proper time.

Additions to Park System: Portion of Lot 6, Block 236, Plan 5700 A.G., Section 17, Sunalta.

The slopes north of the Bow River from Langevin Bridge to 10th Street West.

All available land on the south of the Elbow River from 4th Street

West and 34th Avenue to Elboya Bridge.

It was suggested that plans be prepared and an appropriation made in this year's estimates for the improvement of the slopes on the north side of the Bow River between Langevin Bridge and 10th Street West. If a heavy growth of trees and shrubbery could be established on these slopes, I feel sure that much of the slipping of the banks would be prevented. It was also suggested that a scheme for the development of the land on the east bank of the Elbow River from 34th Avenue S.W. to the Elboya Bridge should be prepared. These matters are receiving attention.

Trees & Shrubs: A power sprayer was acquired, but rather too late in the season for any very effective work to be done. However, with this machine now available, it will be possible to deal effectively and at the proper season, with any infestations that may occur. In fact, prevention being always better than cure, we hope to be able, to a large extent, to prevent such infestations.

Weed Eradication: The use of Sodium Chlorate as a weed killer on roads and paths has been continued with good effect, but the chemical is all the time becoming more difficult to obtain. The use of Ammonia and Iron Sulphates on grass areas was also continued and there was certainly a considerable decrease in the number of dandelions in those portions of the lawn in Memorial Park that have now been treated for two years in succession. By way of extending the experiment a large, weed-infested area in the Union Cemetery was treated. The growth of the grass was certainly greatly stimulated by the applications but their effect on dandelions cannot be determined at present ined at present.

ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND PARK:

The floral display was very satisfactory, the beds of Salvias and Snapdragons attracting the farticular notice of the public.

Five hundred and forty-eight trees and shrubs, including 105 Spruce, were planted on the Island, the Spruce being used mainly around the Zoo area.

Fifty-seven large picnics were held during the season. No record was kept of the small ones but there did not appear to be as many of these as in previous seasons.

#### ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND PARK: (Cont'd)

Several of the buildings were painted, the summer house roofs stained, and a new partition placed in the wading pool a elter.

The beds of Lilium tigrinum were replanted and the gaps in the

Peony beds filled in. Two hundred rock plants were planted on the rip-rapping along the roadside. The driveway was oiled once during the season and it proved very beneficial in that it prevented the foliage of trees and shrubs becoming coated with dust as has been the case in previous seasons, their beauty being thereby destroyed to a very large extent. Footpaths and sides of driveways were weeded twice during the season and fences were repaired, some having to be entirely rebuilt. A new fence was built at the south end of the bridge on 12th Street. Now that the old concession building has been removed there is apparatually for a state of the south end of the bridge moved there is opportunity for some planting on either side of the bridge approaches.

More picnic tables, shelters and refuse containers are urgently needed. The caretaker's residence is badly in need of repairs and painting. As a matter of fact the building is getting into a deplorable condition and it will require a considerable sum of money spent on it if it is to continue habitable. The wiring in this building was overhauled and put in condition by the Electric Light Department during the past season.

#### ST. GEORGE'S ISLAND ZOO:

Another fossil house has been constructed by the Zoological Society similar in size, style and outward appearance to the one previously constructed, but with scenes painted on the back of the structure depicting what is supposed to have been the appearance of the earth's surface during its several geological periods. This structure is now housing the remainder of the Cutler collection of fossils, so arranged that the specimens correspond as regards the period of their existence on the earth with the scene depicted behind them. Considerable planting should be done behind and on either side of the buildings to give them a proper setting.

The floors of the cages housing wolves, coyotes, bears, bob cats, foxes and cougars have been concreted, thus rendering these cages much more sanitary. A sump was constructed to provide drainage from the Polar bear pool.

There was a very bad epidemic amongst the birds, particularly the peafowl, during the early part of the season. The advice of the Provincial Poultry Commissioner was sought and he was very frank and definite in his statement that the conditions under which the birds were being kept was more unsatisfactory. Dr. T. L. Jones, Provincial Pathologist and Doctors G. Anderson and Lola McLatchie gave considerable assistance without charge in treating the affected birds. Mr. J. P. Cross kinds were to birds. birds. Mr. J. B. Cross kindly undertook to care for birds that were convalescing. About a foot of the surface soil was removed from all bird pens and replaced with fresh material. This was a very big undertaking but very necessary in view of the fact that many of these runs had been in use for 10 years.

The Island has become very crowded indeed and it is very difficult to find accommodation for the many visitors that throng there during the summer season. Under these circumstances any further encroachment by the construction of animal pens for specimens that require a large space should be discontinued. In fact, in my opinion, pens for such animals as deer, antelope, sheep, etc., should be removed from the Island altogether. There is plenty of space of a very suitable nature to be had across the river on St. George's Heights and this could be utilized at small cost and with considerable advantage.

The roof of the fossil house constructed some years ago is leaking very badly and needs requiring. The interior of the monkey house should be painted during the coming season and much repair work is necessary. Expenditure .... The following description of the Dinosaur models at St. George's Island furnished by Mr. C. M. Sternberg of Ottawa may be of interest.

"Alberta has long been famous as an ancient home of that group of remarkable reptiles known as the dinosaurs. These creatures, which ruled the lands of both the Old and New Worlds for some 50 million years, appeal to popular imagination by their great diversity of form and size. Some of the marsh-dwelling types were larger than any land animal before and since, and are only equalled in bulk by some of the largest whales. Others which walked and ran on their hind feet were the largest and most ferocious of all known flesheaters, whilst still others were remarkable for the armament of bony plates that encased a part of their huge bulk. Yet all were egg-laying reptiles, allied on the one hand to the crocodiles and on to the other to birds.

Alberta owes its reputation as good hunting ground for dinosaurs to the physical conditions that existed at the time of dinosaur life. Throughout most of Upper Cretaceous time a shallow sea lay in the eastern part of the Great Plains whilst the western part was a shifting lowland of sea and marshland and coastal plain in which deltas and sand planes debouched from Cordilleran mountains that lay west of the present Rockies. The Red Deer valley cuts through the Belly River formation, one of the ancient deltaic and fluvial deposits, and the badlands along Red Deer River have yielded more fine specimens of dinosaurs than any single field in the world.

The specialist who studies the skeleton of these creatures can readily conjure up in his mind the appearance of these animals in the living state. Not so the layman, and the public is greatly indebted to this present effort of the Calgary Zoological Society, under the leadership of Dr. O.H. Patrick, to present in attractive and striking foshion a management of great training foshion a management of great training forms of the total leadership. fashion a representation of some typical forms of that long lost

dynasty of strange reptiles.

The centre of the exhibit is the "Fossil House" where the mounted skeleton of a hooded duck-billed dinosaur (Corythosaurus) and a number of other fossils are on display. This dinosaur, discovered by C.H. Sternberg in 1915, north of Jenner, Alberta, was mounted by the Geological Survey of Canada. It is one of the few dinosaur skeletons that have been preserved with little crushing, although the tail and one hind foot were destroyed by erosion before discovery. These missing parts were restored with bones or casts from other specimens. Otherwise the skeleton is embodied in the original rock matrix. The duck-billed dinosaurs were vegetable feeders that inhabited the swamps and bayous and were the only group adapted for swimming, as may be seen in the compressed tail and webbed feet. There were both flatheaded and hooded forms, the latter seemingly specialized for underwater feeding, since need passages extended up into the hood in the form of S- and U-shaped bends, which could function as air-traps, preventing water from Thooding the lungs.

The Fossil House contains as well numerous specimens of plants, invertebrate and vertebrate fossils from Alberta and elsewhere, which were collected by the late W.E. Cuttler of Calgary.

In the grounds beyond the Fossil House the dinosaur life is reconstructed by means of concrete models that approximate natural size. These models were all constructed by local men. The most recent one presents the contours of one of the duck-bills. Looking west from the main entrance one is confronted by a Brontosaur, one of the giant vegetarians that had elephantine feet, long neck and tail, and relatively small head. A brontosaur would weigh 40 tons or as much as five African elephants and would require some 700 pounds of soft vegetation a day to keep from starving.

North of the Fossil House is Stegosaurus, one of the large, walking armaments, with two rows of vertical plates along his back and nodules of bone in his skin. The head, small for his ponderous bulk, shows that he must have relied more on his armour than on his

brains for eluding his ferocious flesh-eating cousins.

Near the south end of the exhibit is another bulky, plated dinosaur - Palaeoscinous - of which the restoration is based on a specimen collected from Sand Creek, east of Calgary. This beast was

encased in bony, flat plates, embedded in the skin. Along with

Stegosaurus he probably lived in the swamps.

Across the lagoon from Palaeoscincus is Chasmosaurus, which represents still another type of vegetarian. His weapons of defense were confined to his head, which unlike the other plant feeders is of abnormally large size. It is provided not only with horns, but it has a great bony crest or shield, which extended back over neck and shoulders. This reconstruction was based upon a miniature model made by Dr. L.S. Russell. Alberta is particularly rich in horned dinascure. by Dr. L.S. Russell. Alberta is particularly rich in horned dinosaurs and over a dozen genera have been gathered, the animals ranging in length from 5 to 30 feet. The race of horned dinosaurs securingly was born in Asia and later migrated to America through Alaska. One of these early Asiatic ancestors, Protoceratops, is shown here near Chasmosaurus. It is a form that was collected in Mongolia along with clutches of eggs for which one of his kind is believed to have been clutches of eggs for which one of his kind is believed to have been responsible. In this early type horns had not yet develoged although the parrot-like beak reculiar to the group is already in evidence.

Towards the western end of the park are two European dinosaurs -

Hypsilophodon and Compsognathus. Hypsilophodon is believed by some specialists to be arboreal and is thus shown in a tree. At least it presumably had the habit of climbing fallen trunks. Two Alberta genera belonging to the same family have been discovered, both larger than their European cousins. Compognathus is a small, lightly built flesheating form that lived in Upper Jurassic time. Another Jurassic flesheater, Ceratosaurus, is shown. It is one of the larger forms that walked on the hind limbs."

This also is the story as furnished by Mr. William Halliday, Indian Agent, Alert Bay, B.C., of the Totem pole that was transported from Campbell River, Vancouver Island some years ago and erected on St. George's Island through the efforts of the Zoological Society.

"This Totem is known as the "Kuloose" due to the fact that, at the

summit of the pole is the figure of a bird somewhat like an eagle known as the Kuloose. This bird signifies to the tribe of Indians the origin of the clan which adopted it. Nearly all Totems have representation of some bird, usually an eagle, at the top, the significance being that a bird rises over everything and is not dragged along the ground or through water.

The legend is to the effect that this Kuloose came to earth as a bird and was transformed into a man who was then given the name of Hakuweela. This man wandered around for a considerable time looking for a mate and finally found a woman who belonged to the Nowayakay or Cape Mudge Band, though he found her at the extreme end of Vancouver Island at a place known to the Indians as Gukwakileese. He married and had a family. Hakuweela, the man, had a dream and in this dream he was told that he must always be very careful to be on the watch at low tide. He did as him aroam told him, coming out every night to watch when the tide was at its lowest. One night he saw an object that appeared to be on fire. In fear he ran into his house but after a time he came out again to see what was making so much noise. When he went out the noise stopped, but the object which had seemed to be on fire and now had taken the form of a log was standing outside his house and, looking out to sea, he was surprised to see a canoe full of people. Seeing that it was these people that had brought him fire, he thanked them. They then told him that there was a nest on the top of the log and he was to use it as some people were coming to make war on him. Then, much to his surprise, the canoe turned into a whale and swam away. The whale is shown on the Totem.

Not long after some nearly knowing that he had lots of food

Not long after, some people, knowing that he had lots of food, made war on him, but when he and his family saw the enemy coming they climbed to the nest by way of a ladder which they had made out of cedar bark rope and carried huge stones up with them. Thus, when their enemies attacked them, they were ready and threw their stones down on them and conquered them. After this whenever Hakuweela had any particular project in mind he would dream about it and the log would tell him what to do.

On the Totem pole there is also a raven. This bird belonged to the Wowayakay Band and had the ability to tell Hakuweela whatever was going to happen, especially warning him when a flood was coming."

RILEY PARK: The floral displays in this park were very fine, some beds of snapdragons being particularly outstanding. The wading pool was the Mecca for children from all parts of the city during the holiday season, as many as 300 being counted in the pool at one time. The cricket pitches were used intensively throughout the season being much patronized by the men of the R.A.F. Training

Schools who regularly played patches with local teams.

The fence was repaired. 250 pickets being required. Some returfing of the cricket pitches was necessary. The only progress made with regard to the changing of the east entrance was to place wooden curbing along the inner edge of the new borders within the entrance. Portions of the driveway were gravelled but much more of this work requires to be done. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 2822.35 Material \$ 423.25 Total \$ 3245.60 Relief labour 2,372 hours.

CRESCENT PARK: The improvements made during the past season were quite extensive, these improvements following the plan prepared some years ago for the development of this park. Six new shrubbery beds were prepared and planted at the south end, and the paths which these beds were intended to define were excavated; 3,204 sq. ft. of turf being removed and used at Queen's Park Cemetery. The path extending from the east side to the south-west corner was gravelled. The boundary shrubbery borders were extended on the inside by a strip approximately 6 feet in width halfway round the park, the ground being trenched and prepared for the planting of perennial flowering plants, the idea being to introduce some colour into the park, this having, so far, being conspicuous by its absence. This work made available an additional 57,408 sq. ft. of turf for use at Queen's Park Cemetery. One hundred and seven trees and shrubs were planted, fencing was repaired and a gate was placed near the south-east corner of the curling rink to prevent cars driving into the park during the winter months. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 1056.25 Material \$ 192.71 Total \$ 1248.96 Relief labour 1,016 hours.

KILLARNEY PARK: The borders were disced and harrowed and 147 trees and 275 shrubs were planted. The wading pool was cleaned and filled with fresh water every second day during the season. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 52.81 Material \$ 1.13 Total

MT. PIEASANT PARK: The Petunias and Carnations were particularly outstanding features of the floral display in this park.

Six thousand, three hundred and sixty annuals were used, 30 trees and shrubs were transpointed from the north end of the playground to the borders, and 33 additional trees and shrubs planted. A large portion of the steep slope on the south side of this park was turfed, effecting a very great improvement. The turf throughout this park showed considerable improvement, the constant topdressing with soil and fertilizer and the sowing of lawn seed over a period of years having the effect of gradually exterminating the original prairie sod.

Expenditure .... Labour \$ 491.16 Material \$ 135.26 Total \$ 626.42 Relief labour 1,460 hours.

J. H. WOODS PARK (Elbow Boulevard Park) A playground gymnasium set was erected on the vacant piece of land at the extreme end of the park, with the object in view of attracting the older lads away from the Elbow Swimming Pool Grounds, where they are disposed to monopolise the apparatus and thus prevent its use by the smaller children for whom it is primarily intended.

Expenditure .... Labour \$ 626.68 Material \$ 67.92 Total \$ 694.60 Relief Labour 778 hours. Relief labour 778 hours.

MEMORIAL PARK: The outstanding floral display in this park during the past season were the beds of Cannas. The planting of the rose beds on the north and south sides of the Library building was completed, 351 bushes being used. One thousand feet of the wooden curbing was replaced.

Expenditure .... Labour \$ 1456.61 Material \$ 499.58 Total \$ 1956.19 Credit: Interest on Cenotaph Fund: \$74.08 Gross Expenditure 2030.27 Relief labour 2,162 hours.

SOUTH CALGARY PARK: Another 3 acres of this park was ploughed, graded and seeded to lawn, the water service being extended to take care of this additional strip. There now remains about 42 acres to be improved. The tree and shrub border surrounding the park, which has had very little attention in recent years, was spaded and thoroughly cleaned Expenditure .... Labour \$ 886.09 Material \$ 138.35 Total \$ 1,024.44 Relief labour 16 hours.

ROSEVALE PARK: Considerable improvements were made to this park. The hockey rink was moved to a new location, the new area being first graded. The location of the softball field was also changed. Extensive repairs were made to the Community building and the whole structure painted, the Community Club providing part of the cost of the work. A shrubbery border was prepared by trenching on the south side of the new rink site. The boundary shrub borders were thoroughly cleaned and cultivated and 1,075 feet of rustic fence erected.

Expenditure .... Labour \$ 533.55 Material \$ 129.05 Total \$ 662.60

Relief labour 1,776 hours.

TUXEDO PARK: Turf was laid on the east and south sides of the wading pobl and 50 trees and shrubs planted around the shelter.

Expenditure .... Labour \$ 163.40 Material \$ 23.51 Total \$ 186.91 Relief labour 414 hours.

CAPITOL HILL PARK: The borders were manured and cultivated, fence repaired. Three hundred and eight trees and shrubs and 219 herbaceous perennials planted. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 263.16 Material \$ 120.86 Total \$ 384.02 Relief labour 331 hours.

TOMKINS GARDEN: The poplar trees removed in 1940 were replaced with Green Ash last spring. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 186.18 Material \$ 35.18 Total \$ 221.36 Relief labour 304 hours.

TRIANGLE PARK: A large flower bed was prepared so that some colour can be introduced into this park which, up to the present, has been entirely lacking. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 284.69 Material \$ 9.02 Total \$ 293.71 Relief labour 176 hours.

SUNALTA PARK: No work outside of very ordinary maintenance was done on this park. There is room for considerable improvements. Expenditure .... Labour \$4.71 Material \$ Nil. Total \$4.71 Relief labour 16 hours.

HILLCREST PARK: Rustic bridges were reconstructed, 110 trees and shrubs planted, principally on the cutbank at the end of 29th Avenue West. A water connection was made to provide for the watering of this planting. The rank growth of grass and weeds was cut throughout the park in the late fall to prevent risk of fire.

Expenditure .... Labour \$ 177.09 Material \$ 72.39 Total \$ 249.48 Relief labour 184 hours.

CARTIER PARK: Here again there was considerable fire hazard until the dried grass was cut in the fall. This is very necessary work, otherwise the natural growth of trees and shrubbery that is struggling to establish itself is repeatedly destroyed by fire. Another area at the north end of the park was cleaned, manured and graded in readiness for seeding. Considerable grading was also done at the south end and a flight of rustic steps with hand rail constructed to provide access to Champlain Street from Premier Way. Expenditure ..... Labour \$451.27 Material \$33.75 Total \$485.02 Relief labour 216 hours.

RIDEAU PARK: All old trails were cleared and graded and a number of new trails cut, linking up with those in Mission and Romboro Parks. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 91.17 Material \$ Nil. Total \$ 91.17

RIDEAU ROAD PLOT: The rlantation was thoroughly overhauled and overgrown trees and shrubbery removed. The perennial flower borders were
also replanted. A new water service was installed.

Expenditure .... Labour \$83.38 Material \$32.33 Total \$115.71

Relief labour 64 hours.

GARDEN CRESCENT: The residents having finally unanimously agreed to the proposed improvements, the whole central area was cleared of the very much overgrown trees and shrubbery, the ground deeply trenched and heavily manured, a rustic fence built along the centre line, vines planted along this fence and a quantity of choice flowering trees and shrubs and perennials planted. There is no doubt whatever that this will prove most attractive as it develops.

Expenditure .... Labour \$ 318.04 Material \$ 177.71 Total \$ 495.75 Relief labour 1,417 hours.

TALON AVENUE ROCK GARDEN: The rockeries were thoroughly overhauled and replanted in the fall.

CITY HALL GARDEN: The iron picket fence was completed. The protection afforded by this fence to the flower beds resulted in a very noticeable improvement in their appearance. Some additional vines were planted on the building.

RAVINE GARDEN (Sunalta Savine) One hundred and twenty-three shrubs and 3,777 perennials were planted.

BANKVIEW PLOT: A large number of overgrown trees were removed and replaced with shrubs.

ELBOW PARK CAR LOOP: At the request of a nearby property owner the fence on the north side was removed and replaced with 200 feet of rustic fencing several feet farther south, to provide a wider approach to this particular residence.

ELBOW RIVER WALK: The path was cleared and levelled and fence repaired.

SUNNYSIDE SUNKEN GARDEN: A quantity of alpine plants were placed on the rockeries. A water connection is badly needed. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 41.74 Material \$ Nil. Total \$ 41.74 Relief labour 8 hours.

BRIDGE APPROACHES:

Louise Bridge: Three new beds were prepared during the fall, one for shrubs and two for flowers.

SUNNYSIDE MEMORIAL DRIVE: The water service was extended 300 feet. It has been requested that more flower and shrubbery beds be established on the open grass areas to prevent the playing of baseball, football, etc.

WESTMOUNT BOULEVARD: An extension of the water service is badly needed. Both the east and west ends suffered badly during the dry weather.

HIDDEN TRIANGLE: The border at the back of this plot was widened by removing 138 sq. ft. of turf (relaid at Queen's Park Cemetery) and planted with an additional 70 trees and shrubs.

Expenditure ..... Labour \$ 31.56 Material \$ 21.00 Total \$ 52.56 Relief labour 24 hours.

SCOTIAND STREET PLOT: The turf border was taken up and the space filled with flowering plants. The sod that was lifted was used to repair the lawn at Mt. Pleasant Rotary Park.

Expenditure .... Labour \$ 87.10 Material \$ Nil. Total \$ 87.10 Relief labour 103 hours.

GLENCOE TRIANGLE: Twenty-seven flowering Crabs were planted. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 47.74 Material \$ 13.63 Total \$ 61.37

SHORT STREET PLOT: The work of preparing this plot was completed, water service installed, 505 perennials planted and the lawn area seeded.

Expenditure .... Labour \$ 223.90 Material \$ 25.76 Total \$ 249.66 Relief labour 354 hours.

GIENCOE GARDEN: Four flower beds were laid out after the design of the Coronation Shield. A V-shaped bed was also made near the point of the triangle and the whole planted in a patriotic red, white and blue arrangement. This scheme presented a very pleasing appearance and elicited much commendation. Fifteen trees, 76 shrubs and 152 perennials were planted by way of enlarging the border on the south side.

SUNNYSIDE GARDEN: (Triangle, 9a St., 1st Ave. N.W.) Instructions having been received to put into effect the request contained in the petition submitted to the City Council last year, this plot was fenced in and seeded to lawn. A petition has now been received to clean up another plot in this vicinity which is, at present, very much of an eyesore.

SUPERIOR AVENUE PLOT NO. 1: The flower bed was moved to a more central position on this plot.

SUPERIOR AVENUE PLOT NO. 2: This is a triangular piece of land at the east end of Block 236, Sunalta, corresponding in size and shape to that at the west end which was improved some years ago. A portion of Lot 6 was purchased by the owner of Lot 5 on condition the city retained the balance of the lot and developed it as an ornamental area. Accordingly it was trenched, graded, seeded to law and a flower bed prepared in the centre.

RINKS: During the past 10 years the Parks' Department has maintained rinks as follows: 1931-32 - 51; 1932-33 - 38; 1933-34 - 71; 1934-35 - 70; 1935-36 - 84; 1936-37 - 78; 1937-38 - 93; 1938-39 - 85; 1939-40 - 85; 1940-41 - 60; 1941-42 - 89.

In view of the above it is not to be wondered at that Calgary has been the noted city of the west for the production of so many first rate hockey stars who are now playing in the major and minor professional leagues, also many fancy and speed skaters of considerable fame. Most if not all of these have learned to skate on our municipal rinks.

In the fall of 1940 a Community Hockey League was organized and the response was very gratifying. This League consisted of 22 teams which were divided into three sections, Midgets with 8 teams, Juveniles with 8 teams and beginns with 6 teams. Trophies were donated by Aldermen McCullough, Freeze, Weir and Lancaster, one for each division and one to be used for some playground activity. This winter the League is again being organized and has, to date, 8 Midget teams and 6 Juvenile teams. The number of teams in the League is below that of last year, probably due to the fact that the majority of the men who were interested in coaching and handling these teams are now in His Majesty's Forces.

in His Majesty's Forces.

During the season of 1940-41 the 60 rinks maintained were very popular and all very well attended. A list of these rinks is

attached showing locations, areas and uses.

This season 89 rinks have been maintained. Of these 14 are enclosed rinks with portable sides suitable for hockey. These are erected each fall on regular sites. In the spring they are taken down and taken to the Parks' Department Shop for storage after being checked over and repaired. Eight of these hockey rinks have sufficient illumination to provide for hockey playing at night. Prid supervision is maintained at 4 rinks. Except on our regularly established sites we do not provide rinks unless requested to do so by residents in the

particular neighbourhood. Many of these rinks are quite small and suitable for the smaller children so that they can be kept close to their homes. In cases such as these it is sometimes the policy of the Department to loan hose, scrapers, etc. to the individuals interested in the maintenance of the rink. In the case of the larger rinks the Department with some few exceptions provides hose, scrapers, goal posts, nets and shelters. In other cases the community provides these requisites and in most instances the cost of lighting is paid for by the community.

Bridgeland Recreation Ground Rink: Considerable complaint has been made by the hospital authorities from time to time with regard to noise on this rink during the winter months, and also because many of those using this rink travelled to and fro through the hospital grounds. The

Bridgeland Community Club was notified that no rink would be persitted on this area, but the Community Club asked for the opportunity to state their case and, accordingly, a meeting of the City Commissioner, myself, the Hospital Superintendent and representatives of the Club was called and the matter thoroughly discussed. It was finally agreed that the Club should carry on for the winter of 1939 and 1940, providing the rink was closed at 10 o'clock and, during the hours that it was open, close supervision should be provided, and that arrangements be made to transfer this rink before the end of 1941 to the south-west corner of the grounds. This has been done and the new location seems to be satisfactory to all parties, no further complaints having been received.

PLAYGROUNDS: There has been considerable emphasis of the playground work by the Department in recent years, largely in response to public demand. In 1931, \$2,960.15 was expended on playgrounds. In 1941, \$6,566.32 was spent, this being augmented by \$1,337.96 donated by the Rotary Club of Calgary. In 1931 we had 8 equipped playgrounds. We now have 28 playgrounds fully or partially equipped, with requests for 6 additional ones this year, 4 wading pools, a public swimming pool an outdoor checker board and a number of open areas where such pool, an outdoor checker board and a number of open areas where such games as softball and football can be played, 14 enclosed hockey rinks, besides a large number of open skating rinks.

A petition was received requesting that a portion of the Bow River be dammed for the purpose of providing an area for swimming, but it was considered impractical by the City Engineer. In this connection it may be pointed out that the city now has a public swimming pool, and that during recent years the Rivanis Ciub have donated to the Parks' Department the following wading pools:

New playgrounds have been established at the intersection of 8th Avenue and 3rd Street East and at Centre Street and 17th Avenue. The provision of these playgrounds was not contemplated when the annual estimates were prepared. The cost of the former was \$258.ll and the latter \$1884.44; \$1337.96 of which was provided by the Rotary Club of Calgary, the Club providing the following: 6-swing senior unit, 3-swing senior set, 3-swing junior set, gymnasium, 16 ft. slide, 8 ft. slide, giant stride, 4-plank teeter, 2-plank teeter and 325 feet chain-link fercing: feet chain-link fencing

The car, purchased for the use of the Playground Director in the early part of the season for the sum of approximately \$1,000 has been loaned to the Engineer's Department for the winter months. It is to be hoped that this car will be returned to the Parks' Department in the spring as it is very essential to the efficient performance of the Playground Directors work.

Twelve supervised playgrounds, (one more than last year) were opened on July 2nd and continued throughout the month of July and up to the 12th of August when it was necessary to close the playgrounds due to the ban that was placed on us by the Government because of the poliomyelitis epidemic which required that children under the age of seventeen be probibited from using places of public assembly. The supervisors were in attendance at their grounds daily from 10 a.m. to 12 noon; 1.30 to 5 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m., except Monday mornings when a weekly supervisors meeting was held at 9.30 o'clock.

Attendance figures were computed on the same system as last year, namely, according to the method devised by the National Recreation

Association of America, New York City.

While it is difficult to make a comparison of attendance with that of 1940, still it can be seen that, had we been able to continue to operate the playgrounds till the end of August, as in previous years, we would, I believe, have bettered the mark established in 1940. With the grounds open 37 days during 1940 and only 25 in 1941, 75,360 (34,850 cirls and 40,510 boys) were registered during 1941; as against a total in 1940 of 111,692 of which 51,104 were girls and 60,588 boys. and 60,588 boys.

The playground children were allowed the free use of the Calgary Municipal Swimming Pool daily from 11 a.m. to 12 noon, thus giving every child registered at the playgrounds one hour of free swimming each week. That this policy was popular and worthwhile is evidenced by the figures which show that 907 girls and 1,191 boys took advantage of this opportunity, or a total of 2,098, and this in only 22 days before the ban necessitated closing of the Pool to children under 17

years of age.

The scarcity of late teen-age boys and girls at all playgrounds was very noticeable this year. It is possible that the reason for this is that many of these older lads that have been in the habit of attending our playgrounds have joined some branch of His Majesty's Forces, whilst others have secured work, which previously, was unattainable.

During the winter of 1940-41 the Department organized three hockey leagues and, during the summer season helped organize and run two softball leagues which were made up of eleven teams. The Department was also instrumental in forming a Track and Field Club for the young boys and girls of the City. Practices were held four times a week with regular tabloid meets being run off weekly. The Recreation Department was also instrumental in helping the Calgary Junior Rugby League through its most successful season.

An entirely novel feature in so far as our playground activities are concerned was the "Mutt" show held on August 7th in Hillhurst Park. There were approximately 500 children present and quite a sprinkling of adults. One hundred dogs were entered and prizes were provided by the Dr. Ballard Dog Food Factory. Alderman Chauncey and Mr. R. Haughian acted as judges. Many amusing incidents occurred and an afternoon of real fun was enjoyed by all present.

Visits were made to some of the industrial plants of the city by

some of the playground groups.

The following are amongst the activities carried on in the

playgrounds:

Softball, boys and girls, senior, junior and juvenile. Football Basketball Paddle tennis Handball Dodgeball Weaving Singing games Horseshoes **Volleyball** Track & field events Swimming Hockey Skating Hikes Picnics Raffia work First Aid classes Reed work Sewing cards Fret saw work Wool work Clay modelling Wood carving Insect collecting Races String work Butson making Group & team games

A library of books was maintained at some of the playgrounds. Due to abuse of playground apparatus by adults, a bylaw was passed prohibiting its use by persons over the age of 16 years.

Mr. R. M. Haughian who held the position of Playground Director during the past two seasons left us on October 15th to join His

Majesty's Forces and was replaced by Mr. B. Shaw, who, until its closing was in charge of the Municipal Swimming Pool.

#### Improvements & Recommendations:

East Calgary Rotary Playground: A piece of land in close vicinity to this playground was graded for a softball diamond, sufficient room on the playground itself not being available.

There is need for extension of the water service on this playground and oiling of the surface would be of great benefit as this
is a particularly dusty area.

This is a very popular playground and the facilities provided
are used intensively. I am sorry to say, however, that a great deal
of vandalism occurs, considerable damage being done to the apparatus
and grounds. Complaints are frequently received with regard to noise
and bad language which goes on at night and sometimes continues till
the early morning hours. the early morning hours. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 336.28 Material \$ 71.22 Total \$ 407.50

Roxboro Playground: The playground has been abandoned and most of the apparatus removed as much of the area is now sold and dwelling houses erected on it. As a result we now have in stock available for use next year the following: - 3 2-swing-unit swings, 1 gymnasium set and two 3-swing units. Expenditure ..... Labour \$ 42.36 Material \$ Nil. Central High School Playground: Due to an addition to the building we were requested to remove the playground apparatus. Expenditure ..... Labour \$ 19.78 Material \$ Nil. Total \$ 19.78

King George Playground: The east end of the playground, previously too rough to be used for play purposes was levelled.

Lougheed Playground: The surface was levelled, requiring the use of the Public Works Department equipment six days. The whole area was then ploughed and surfaced with 60 cu. yds. of surplus soil removed from boulevards. A close board fence, 147 feet in length, was built and painted on the west side and 135 feet of wire fencing placed on the north side.

Elbow Park Swimming Pool Grounds: This is a very popular resort throughout the warm summer season, children congregating here in great numbers from all parts of the city, attracted principally, of course, by the bathing facilities, though the play apparatus and open air checker board are used intensively. Earl Grey Community Grounds: Due to the fill at the south end having subsided this area had to be regraded.

Roxboro Tennis Courts: The Community Club that operated these tennis courts being now defunct, the courts are abandoned and have become very dilapidated. This is to be regretted as there is quite an investment in the courts, fencing and buildings.

The total number of relief labour hours utilized in the maintenance of all playgrounds was 1,437.

SHAGANAPPI PARK MUNICIPAL GOLF COURSE: This year has been a very successful one and a very substantial increase has been shown over the previous year. This increase no doubt has been due to the condition in which the Course has been kept and also to a large extent by the improvements made on fairways, and by the use of the watering facilities which were installed on the first nine holes this summer. A considerable amount of small piping yet remains to be laid to complete the water system over the entire course. Trees can now be planted down the sides of the fairways or in clusters and will add materially to the beauty of the course. The bridge over the gully should be painted without further delay. The club house is in fairly good repair, but the locker room needs to be re-floored and the walls lathed and plastered. The kitchen and bedroom require painting. During the winter months Mr. J. Hutton worked for the Western Command R.C.A.F., but has been permitted to continue to occupy the premises.

Improvements & maintenance: Fourteen barrels of heavy oil, 12 barrels of used motor oil and 60 cu. yds. of sand were used for resurfacing greens. This was done twice during the season. Clay, 6 inches deep was excavated around Gent's green No. 4 and 50 sq. yds. of new turf was laid. A door and steps providing admission to the ladies locker room were constructed on the south side of the club house. a 10 ft. extension to the shack was constructed to provide accommodation for the caretaker's car. A stove was installed and gas pined to this building. All tree plots stove was installed and gas piped to this building. All tree plots were dug over in early spring. Eight hundred and four trees and 583 shrubs were pruned.

MEWATA SWIMMING POOL: The Pool was opened on June 4th with 32 paid admissions on that date. It was closed to the public on September 1st. From September 1st to 12th it was utilized by the R.C.A.F. from No. 2 Wireless School free of charge. During June a staff of 8 consisting of manager, assistant manager, one lady attendant, two life guards and three operators was employed. During July the staff was increased by one lady attendant and one life guard. This made it possible to have an attendant at the pool 24 hours a day and two life guards on duty during the time it was open to the public.

Records have been kept as follows:-accumulative record of attendance and cash receipts, daily record of temperatures of atmosphere and water taken at specific times, notations on chlorine

treatments, weather conditions, etc.

During the month of July the men of No. 31 S.F.T.S., R.A.F. were given the use of the Pool in the mornings from 6.30 a.m. to 7.30 a.m. on Mondays and Fridays. It was also agreed that the children of the supervised playgrounds be given the use of the Pool from

ll a.m. to 12 noon each day during the months of July and August.
On August 21st No. 2 Wireless School, R.C.A.F. sponsored an interclass Swimming Gala in which 131 contestants participated. There were 115 spectators who were charged .10 each for admission. Bleacher accommodation is badly needed for such events as this.

The number of tourists from the United States patronizing the Pool this season was very noticeable and these people were much

The season's attendance showed an increase of 9,242 admissions over last year and the revenue was increased by \$1,164.89. This was undoubtedly due to the fact that the Pool was in operation a month and a half longer than in 1940.

A perusal of the statistics given below will indicate that there has been a loss on operations of \$1,606.35. This is almost entirely due to the cost of heat and power during the period of time that the Pool is not in operation.

MEWATA STADIUM: Infield was topdressed with fertilizer both in the fall of 1940 and 1941 and this has had the effect of preserving grass in good condition in spite of intense use and wear during unfavourable weather conditions. Considerable repairs were needed to the fences. We are unfortunate in the loss of Mr. Thos. Taylor who passed away January last. He was a very effecient caretaker of the stadium and kept it in excellent condition. His death is a great loss to the Department.

The following is, in part, the report of the Secretary of the Stadium Commission:"During the season of 1941, the Stadium was used on a much larger scale by members of his Majesty's Forces than previously.

The Commission still left the operation of the ball park in the hands of the Military Authorities, thus confining their activities to jurisdiction over the Stadium proper.

It was unfortunate that the School Rugby could not be carried on

in 1941, owing to steps taken by the Health and Educational Authorities at the commencement of the school year.

Only one meeting of the Stadium Commission was held during the season and the policies laid down by the Commission were carried out by the various committees. The Reservations Committee met on several occasions to deal with applications for use of the Stadium.

HILLHURST ATHLETIC PARK: The park was used by the R.C.N.V.R. for drill almost daily during the early part of the season. A new backstop for baseball was erected. Skating rink was well patronized and the hockey rink was in use when the ice was in condition. Hockey and practice games played, approximately 200; baseball games played. 17. Expenditure .... Labour \$ 249.87 Material \$ 68.12 Total \$ 317.99 Relief labour 64 hours.

BOULE VARDS: In my annual report last year I pointed out that tree pests of several kinds were very much on the increase and were assuming a serious menace to the tree growth of the city. As a result, the Department was authorized to purchase a power sprayer. It was quite late in the second before one sould be second. It was quite late in the season before one could be secured, but very effective work was done after its arrival on trees both on public property and in private gardens.

Thirty-four Birch and 26 Cotoneasters were planted on the new

boulevard to complete the planting in the vicinity of the British American Oil Company's property. The Company is assisting the Department by caring for these trees, shrubs and boulevard generally.

Statistics regarding the pruning, heading back and removal of trees and shrubs are contrined in the contrined to the contrined to

trees and shrubs are contained in the early part of this report.

The heading back of trees to clear overhead wires has now become a formidable and very expensive task to the Department. Originally, the Departments concerned with the clearance of these wires notified this Department and reimbursed us for the cost of the work. the work. Later, the Electric Light Department changed its policy and employed its own men to do the work. After one or two serious accidents to the personell of its staff, it reverted to the original system, but now refuses to pay for the cost of the work. I do not think this is in accordance with the practice of other cities. For instance, I have before me the 1941 Annual Report of the Vancouver Parks' Department in which the following paragraph appears: "Each winter we carry out for and at the cost of the Utilities Companies winter we carry out for and at the cost of the Utilities companies a considerable program of tree pruning where branches interfere with the electric wires." Having to do this work inflicts a real hardship on this Department due to the fact that most of the time the small skeleton staff of competent men retained during the winter is occupied on this work, and the essential work of attending to the trees and shrubbery in the parks has, as a consequence, to be neglected. If the work was paid for by the Electric Light Department the staff could be augmented to the enterior required.

CEMETERIES. GENERAL:

Areas for the burial of personell of the Active Forces and ex-

service men and women:It may be of interest at this time, to detail what has been done

this regard since the last Great War.

During the last war the Canadian Legion, then known as the Great War Veterans' Association, approached the city with the request that an area be set aside in the Union Cemetery for the burial of exservice men. The City granted this request and provided space for 200 burials. Burials were made in this area only on instructions of the Association. For a time payments were made by the Association for improvement and maintenance as burials were made. At a later date the city undertook to maintain this plot at its own expense. This area has long been filled and another provided in Burnsland Cemetery

where 667 burials have been made to date. The Cross of Sacrifice was erected on the plot in the Union Cemetery in 1920.

In October, 1918 a communication was received from Ottawa requesting the reservation of a plot for burial of men in the Active Forces and the City Council again agreed to provide 300 grave spaces for this purpose in the Union Cemetery. Some 30 burials were made in this area on instructions of the local military authorities. The war having ended and demobilization having taken place, it seemed very unlikely that further burials would take place in this area and application was made to Ottawa to restore it to the City. After considerable delay this was agreed to, but only on condition that space for 233 burials of Active Force personell be provided adjoining the Field of Honour in Burnsland Cemetery.

In the meantime an agreement had been drawn up between the City and the Trustees of the Field of Honour defining exactly the position with regard to the administration of this area. Whilst the Trustees agreed to assist with the maintaining of this plot "whenever and as far as they are able", the City has, so far, borne the whole

cost of maintenance.
On September 7, 1938 three officers of the R.C.A.F. from Regina visited the City and started negotiations towards securing a separate and distinct area for the burial of the personell of that branch of His Majesty's Forces. Exception was taken by the Trustees of the Field of Honour to any distinction being made as to place of burial of the several branches of the Forces and it was eventually decided that burials are the several branches of the Forces and it was eventually decided that burials be made of all branches of the Services in the one plot.

Recently application has been made by the Trustees for the reservation of an area in the new Queen's Park Cemetery. This has been agreed to but, as space will not be needed for some considerable time, no definite area has, as yet, been defined. There is still space for 342 burials in the Field of Honour, Burnsland Cemetery.

UNION CEMETERY: Decoration days were held on May 30th (American Womens' Club), July 6th (B.P.O.E.), August 17th (I.O.O.F.), August 23rd (Citizens' Memorial Day). The usual assistance was given by the staff on these occasions and on August 23rd all soldiers graves were marked with flags and wreath frames supplied to the Committee to the extent that they were required.

Sixty lineal feet of concrete curb 8" x 12" was laid at the east entrance and a border of turf 3 feet wide placed inside the curb, 180 square feet of sod being used. This gives the approach a much better appearance. The old wooden culvert at the intersection at the east end of Section B was replaced with 30 feet of steel culvert. The spraying of the gutters with calcium chlorate during the season proved very effective in eradicating weeds and saved considerable labour. Eighty-nine overcrowded trees were removed.

QUEEN'S PARK CEMETERY: The property at the entrance to this cemetery was purchased, the old dwelling house and other buildings sold for removal and a new caretaker's house constructed on the site.

An entirely new entrance was made to the cemetery by constructing a driveway diagnonally from 4th Street N.W. at a point approximately opposite 31st Avenue. The approach from 4th Street was boulevarded and planted with Birch trees. Temporary gates were erected. A considerable quantity of coarse gravel hauled to the cemetery some years ago was spread on the roads, 14,400 sq. ft. being covered with a layer six inches deep. Considerably more filling will be required to bring much of the roadway to a proper grade and the whole will require surfacing with fine gravel. Culverts were installed at the require surfacing with fine gravel. Culverts were installed at the intersections of some of the roads.

Within the entrance considerable turfing was also done, the sod having been acquired as a result of improvements made at Crescent

having been acquired as a result of improvements made at Crescent Park. In all 7,230 sq. ft. of turf was laid.

A good deal of grading has been done around the cottage. Gate posts were erected at the entrance to the service yard.

A border for trees and shrubbery 20 feet wide has been trenched 2 feet deep completely around the area that is proposed to be used as a service yard and this border is now ready for planting during the coming spring. Trees were planted on the driveways as far as these have been extended. Considerable grading was done with machinery on the areas that it is proposed to use for burial purposes, also on the central plateau intended for ornamental purposes only. This latter was loamed and seeded and flower beds were established. All newly seeded areas have been mulched and covered with fertilizer during seeded areas have been mulched and covered with fertilizer during the winter months. A temporary garage was erected for the use of the caretaker. A flagstone path was laid connecting the entrance of the office and house with the driveway.

The following areas have been surveyed and plotted; Blocks 2,3,4,7,8,9, and 10 in Section A, Blocks 1-12 in Section C and Blocks 1-5

in Section D.

ST. MARY'S EXTENSION: The gravelling of the driveway was continued. 12,000 square feet being surfaced with a layer six inches deep; 18,640 square feet was seeded to grass just within the entrance. Considerable improvement was made to that portion of 31st Avenue which had previously been legally closed. This now becomes a part of the Cemetery and makes it possible to provide a suitable entrance. The ground was prepared for lawns and flower borders were trenched and, by the end of the season, both grass and plants were well established. The total area treated in this was was 1,180 square feet. Ornamental iron gates are in the course of being made and suitable gate posts are being constructed with stone from the old Lindsay home on the south bank of the Elbow River. south bank of the Elbow River.

CHINESE CEMETERY: Tree borders were forked, cultivated and watered during the season. Replacements and new planting was done where required. Rough grass was cut with motor scythe at intervals during the season.

Expenditure ..... Labour \$ 239.10 Material \$ 18.94 Total \$ 258.04 Relief labour 24 hours.

NURSERIES: Spring work in the nursery was commenced earlier this year than usual. Tree lifting was started on the 9th of April. Not much nursery stock for street planting was purchased this year as sufficient home grown trees that were large enough for this purpose could be supplied by the Civic nursery.

The following material was used for permanent planting in parks, cemeteries and streets; 1,632 trees, 2,913 shrubs, 38,902 perennial flowering plants and 1,565 bulbs. Of these, 315 trees and 675 shrubs

were purchased.

Three thousand nine hundred and seventy trees and shrub cuttings were made and planted. A very high percentage of these rooted. Considerable transplanting of seedling trees and shrubs was done; 2.892 plants of 68 species and varieties were lined out. Many of these were raised from seed procured by donation from the Dominion Arboretum, Ottawa, the Royal Botanic Garden, Edinburgh, and Montreal Botanic Garden. Four thousand one hundred and fifty-seven seedling perennial flowering plants were planted out in the nursery. More than 500 kinds and varieties of seeds of flowering plants were collected, also quantities of tree and shrub seeds.

collected, also quantities of tree and shrub seeds.

As in other years the practice of exchanging seeds with various Parks' Departments, Botanical Gardens and horticultural establishments

was continued; 533 packets being received in this way.

Nursery stock was supplied to the Calgary Horticultural Society to be given as prizes in the garden competitions. The value of stock in nursery as at December 31, 1941 is estimated at \$ 10,877.85 Expenditure .... Labour \$ 4,589.10 Material \$ 692.67 Credit for trees, shrubs, perennials supplied to parks, boulevards etc., \$ 1,880.88 Net Expenditure .... \$ 3,400.89 Relief labour 1,132 hours.

WORK SHOP: The following new equipment was purchased and put into service: One Ransome motor mower, 1 Allen motor scythe, 1 Dobbins power sprayer, 1 spiked roller and 2 extension frames for Trojan mowers. We now have 4 motor scythes. These prove exceedingly useful, particularly when grass on boulevards etc., has become too long to be cut by lawn mower. The power sprayer; though acquired somewhat late in the season proved very useful in controlling tree pests which were unusually prevalent last year. The extension frames were attached to the Golf Course mower converting what was previously a 3-unit machine to one of 5 units. Fencing was erected by the shop staff as follows: City Hall, -156 feet iron picket fencing; 9a Street-1st Avenue N.W., - 110 feet chain link fencing: Mt. Pleasant Rotary Recreation Grounds, - 455 feet chain link fencing; Lougheed playground, 136 feet chain link and 149 feet of board fencing; City Hall playground, - 244 feet of chain link fencing.


<u>POLICING</u>: Use of the Commissionaires to patrol the parks and playgrounds during their hours of duty was continued and these men gave very good service.
