# Operating Budget Updates - 2024 YTD net operating budget vs actuals:

Legal Services has a favourable operating variance of \$1.4 million. The main reasons that have contributed to the variance are savings in salary and wages resulting from intentionally managing workforce.

As of June 2024, Legal Services was challenged with the number of recruitments and time required to complete recruitments.



# Capital Budget Updates - 2024 total capital budget vs 2024 YTD spend:

Legal Services has spent 41.2 per cent of the 2024 approved capital budget. In 2024, the capital expenditures have been used to deliver: IT initiative - ProLaw replacement. It is anticipated that the remaining capital will be spent by the end of 2024.
