

We're making changes to TIPP

Tax Instalment Payment Plan

Your January to June instalments now include The City's 2023 budget decisions. This change creates greater stability in your monthly payments by spreading them more evenly over the year.

As a TIPP participant, you pay the same amount as your annual property tax bill, but instead of one large lump sum payment in June, you pay smaller monthly instalments. Smaller monthly payments save you time and money by making your budgeting easier and removes the risk of late payment penalties.



We'll review your monthly payment amount again in May to ensure you pay no more or less than your annual property tax bill.

In January, we'll finalize and send out your property assessment notice. In the spring, the province will release their budget, indicating the amount of provincial property tax The City is required to collect on their behalf.

These are the final pieces of information we need to calculate your property tax bill and calculate your July to December TIPP payment. Your annual property tax bill will be mailed to you at the end of May and will include your adjusted instalment amount starting July 1.
