SUMMARY

Based on the latest Calgary Police Service (CPS) Community Safety Dashboard data, Ward 2 is trending safer than the city overall. Between January and the end of August 2026, Ward 2 saw property crime drop 17% and violent crime fall 31% compared to the same period in 2025, while Calgary experienced a 2% rise in property crime and a 7% decline in violent crime. Disorder calls in the ward were also down 3%, and domestic incidents decreased 5%. These figures reflect reported incidents across diverse neighbourhoods, from low-density communities like Ambleridge, which recorded only two thefts from vehicles and no other crime in the period, to more active areas like Hamptons, which saw a notable increase in break-and-enters but still a sharp drop in violent offences.

It's important to remember that each community differs in land use, population density, and size, which can make some areas appear to have more crime simply because they have more activity, commercial zones, or transit corridors, not because they are less safe. For example, a neighbourhood with more shops or parking lots may naturally see more thefts from vehicles, while a quiet residential enclave may report very few incidents overall. That said, a few local trends are worth noting and staying aware of, such as isolated increases in certain property offences in specific communities. All statistics cited here are drawn directly from the CPS Community Safety Dashboard for January through August 2026, with year-over-year comparisons based on the same period in 2025.

KEY POINTS

- Ward 2 property crime is down 17% (Jan–Aug 2026 vs. same period 2025), outpacing the citywide trend of a 2% increase.
- Violent crime in Ward 2 fell 31% year over year, compared to a 7% decline across Calgary as a whole.
- Disorder calls and domestic incidents in the ward decreased 3% and 5%, respectively, indicating fewer community disturbances.
- Crime levels vary by neighbourhood due to differences in land use, density, and size, not necessarily reflecting overall safety.
- Some communities show isolated increases (e.g., break-and-enters in Hamptons), but most areas recorded declines across major offence categories.
- All data sourced from the CPS Community Safety Dashboard, comparing January–August 2026 to the same period in 2025.

DATA BY COMMUNITY

Below, we have outlined key statistics for each community in Ward 2. All statistics cited here are drawn directly from the CPS Community Safety Dashboard for **January through August 2026, with year-over-year comparisons based on the same period in 2025**. I have listed the top three categories for each crime in order. If three categories are not listed, this indicates that there was no more reported crimes in the period. *All population statistics come from the 2021 census and Ward 2 has seen substantial population growth in this period 5 year period.*
