Definitions:

Radicalism - Description for having political-ideological views or endeavours which attempt to solve societal issues and problems down to the minute detail, i.e. with utmost zeal and single minded uncompromising attitude. Being radical can be a positive attribute, and radical movements do not necessarily violate the principles of liberal-democratic basic law.

Radicalization - The process of adopting an extremist belief system, including the willingness to use, support, or facilitate violence, as a method to effect societal change.

Violent Extremism - broadly speaking, refers to the process of taking radical views and putting them into violent action. *2014, Public Safety Canada*

Has expressed support for a gang or extremist group or cause either verbally or online (i.e. emails, texts, social media, discussion forums).

Known or suspected involvement in a gang or extremist group.

Has made statements promoting or advocating the use of violence to advance a cause or change a policy.

Has expressed intolerance, hatred, or rejection of racial/ ethnic/ cultural, political or religious groups.

Has displayed actions or made statements that he/she no longer recognizes the legitimacy of government, authorities or laws.

Has made statements that their family, identity, culture or values are under threat.

Feels victimized or marginalized.

Has expressed a more rigid or narrow view of social/ religious/ political issues than they have previously held.

Angrily criticizes Canadian or Provincial government and its policies at home or abroad; or does not recognize democratic government.

Has demonstrated an obsession with foreign conflicts.

Believes mainstream practices conflict with religious beliefs.

Anti social values/ beliefs.

Expresses the belief that they have a religious obligation to stop evil and accepts the possibility of self sacrifice or martyrdom.

Unexplained possession of, reads, or accesses propaganda material of extremist groups.

Expresses belief that we a living in an 'end time' and wants to participate in the war at the end of time.

Views/ shares extremist and/ or violent material in person or online (social media, magazines, videos, websites, music, discussion boards, etc.).

Spends more time on the internet than usual.

Significant change in behaviour and appearance.

Attempts to coerce those around them to follow an extreme ideology.

Disputes with those following a less 'extreme' version of the same ideology/ subculture.

Has been violent or aggressive, made threats, or bullied others.

Has taken part in physical/ paramilitary training/ air soft style military gaming or has expressed interest in doing so.

Possesses or displays extremist paraphernalia (i.e. flags, symbols/logos, graffiti, posters etc.).

Has become secretive.

Shown un-characteristic intolerance or lack of patience from normal.

Noticeable change in behaviour since travelling abroad.

Has attended lectures, presentations, or sermons that cause family and friends concern.

Quit job, struggles to maintain a job, or departure due to intolerant views.

Runs own blog/website or social media activity that causes concern.

Noticeable change in social activism.

Involvement in distributing material, flyers and pamphlets etc related to social activism or extremism.

Demonstrates abnormal youth rebellion

Does not have many friends or a social circle.

Has withdrawn or abandoned existing social activities, family, or friends.

Has made new friends/ contacts that cause family or friends concern.

Has confrontations with people based on extreme behaviour or ideas.

Spends more time with 'online friends' in a virtual community than usual.

No positive role model, confidant, or mentor.

Has become noticeably less talkative and introverted.

Is or has been a victim of bullying.

Involved in criminal activity or associates with known criminals.

Suspected, admitted member, or associate of a gang or extremist group, even if there has been no criminal involvement.

Known or suspected use of weapons at school/work or access to weapons.

Immediate family member is engaged in criminal or extremist behaviour.

Has been charged with a summary or indictable offence.

Has been incarcerated.

Known or attempted recruitment to a gang or extremist group.

Committed criminal offences as a youth.

Current or past mental health concerns, including diagnosed or undiagnosed mental illness (i.e. depression, anxiety, trauma, paranoia, anger, abusive relationships, victim of bullying or violence, etc.).

Intellectual impairments or disabilities (i.e. learning disabilities, cognitive impairment).

Alcohol abuse past or present.

Drug abuse past or present.

Poor ethno-cultural identity.

Lacks emotional regulation and self-control.

Participates in high-risk sexual activity.

Is easily led/ manipulated.

Overly trusting or susceptible to un-trustworthy people.

Is a thrill-seeker and/ or likes to take risks, seeks adventure.

Poor school performance, and or attendance historically.
Achieved poor grades in school, failed to graduate, or dropped out.
Multiple school suspensions or expulsions, or not attending school right now.
Immigrant or refugee from a war-torn country.
Serious family dysfunction/ spousal violence/ history of abuse/ neglect.
Is or identifies as a victim of racism.
Youth not living with parents, foster care, kinship, or live on their own.

ReDirect is a community led initiative that is supported by the resources of the Calgary Police Service in collaboration with community agencies and other law enforcement agencies.

The referral will be considered using a number of evaluative processes to determine if the client meets the parameters of the program. If successfully referred to the ReDirect program the clients case information will be reviewed by a multi-agency panel consisting of social agencies and community based support groups and services. The multi agency panel will develop a comprehensive support plan to assist individuals who are identified as being vulnerable to being

drawn into violent extremism. The support plan may include the client taking part in other existing programs within the Calgary Police Service, community based programs, or a combination of both.

Information shared with ReDirect will be kept confidential, and only shared with support groups and services with the permission of the client to develop a support plan. However, if information comes to light when working with a client of criminal acts that have occurred, or are about to occur, a decision will be made as to whether it is appropriate to notify investigators in the interest of preserving life and or property.



This personal information is being collected under the authority of Section 33(c) of the FOIP Act RSA 2000 and will be used by the City of Calgary and the Calgary Police Service to determine eligibility for ReDirect. The information will also be used to administer and evaluate ReDirect, and for contact purposes regarding other programs or services for which the referred person may be qualified. All information collected by the City of Calgary is protected by the provisions of the Freedom of Information Privacy Act RSA 2000.
