REPORT NOTES

Most of the statistical data in this report are derived from the Police Information Management System (PIMS) and compiled by the Centralized Analysis Unit. The numbers reported may change on a daily basis due to the dynamic nature of offences being reported and cleared. Disorder data is derived from the CAD system and is static.

To a large extent, the data in this report are based on accumulated to date information. ***(Except for the Monthly Highlights which are based on static information (i.e.: a snap-shot in time).***

- For offences based on accumulated to date information, the number of offences recorded may be higher than previously reported (i.e. in previous statistical reports) due to late reporting. Although this does not greatly affect the number of occurrences for all offences, for some categories it may be as high as a 30-40% increase. The published data for the current period can therefore be expected to increase as time passes. As a result, readers should exercise caution when making comparisons between historical data and current data (i.e. previous year to this year) as data for the historic period will now include late reported offences, but data for the current period will not at this time. To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period.
- Likewise, late reporting affects the number and percentage of offences cleared. Cases are often cleared months and sometimes years later. Consequently, clearances for previous years may appear to be much higher than those of the present year. Cases “cleared by charge” and those “cleared otherwise” are included in these totals.
- For offences based on “static” or “snap-shot” information, data totals will only reflect the number of offences reported in the original publication. They are not updated. Although late reporting may occur, and offences may continue to be cleared as time passes, these new events are not taken into account when preparing this statistical report.

A single incident may result in multiple offences, with each unique *Criminal Code* violation within the incident being counted as an offence. Furthermore, person crime offences are typically counted by the number of victims. Please note that offences are assigned to the month in which the offence "started", not the month they were reported or cleared. Also note that “attempted” incidents are included in these totals. For a more detailed explanation of the Offence counting procedure, please contact the Centralized Analysis Unit.

Monthly Highlights – STATIC NUMBER COMPARISON

To reduce the impact of late reporting, comments on this page are a comparison between the CPS June 2016 Statistical Report and the CPS June 2015 Statistical Report. To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period.

JUNE 2016

PERSON CRIME

- ◆ Reported **person crimes** for the month of June 2016 increased 16.7% when compared to June 2015 (795 offences in June 2016 vs. 681 in June 2015).
- ◆ Total **robbery** offences for the month of June 2016 decreased 17.6% when compared to June 2015 (70 offences in June 2016 vs. 85 in June 2015); During the month of June 2016 there were:
 - 4 **financial robberies** (compared to 10 in June 2015);
 - 13 **commercial robberies** (compared to 18 in June 2015);
 - 50 **person robberies** (compared to 49 in June 2015) and
 - 3 **home invasions** (compared to 8 in June 2015).
- ◆ **Assaults** increased 21.7% this month (600 offences in June 2016 vs. 493 in June 2015).
- ◆ **Sex offences** increased 18.8% this month (76 **sex offences** in June 2016 compared to 64 in June 2015).

PROPERTY CRIME

- ◆ Reported **property crimes** this month increased 2.5% when compared to June 2015 (4603 offences in June 2016 compared to 4490 in June 2015).
- ◆ **Vehicle theft** (including attempts) decreased 8.3% this month when compared to June 2015 (605 offences in June 2016 vs. 660 in June 2015).
- ◆ **Theft** offences increased 3.9% this month when compared to June 2015 (2318 offences in June 2016 vs. 2232 in June 2015).
- ◆ **Break and enter** offences this month decreased 2.2% when compared to June 2015 (784 offences this month compared to 802 in June 2015).
 - **Residential break and enter** offences this month decreased 16.2% when compared to June 2015 (275 offences in June 2016 vs. 328 in June 2015); and
 - **Commercial break and enter** offences increased 18.1% this month when compared to June 2015 (327 offences in June 2016 vs. 277 in June 2015).
- ◆ **Fraud related** offences increased 29.8% this month (279 offences in June 2016 vs. 215 in June 2015).

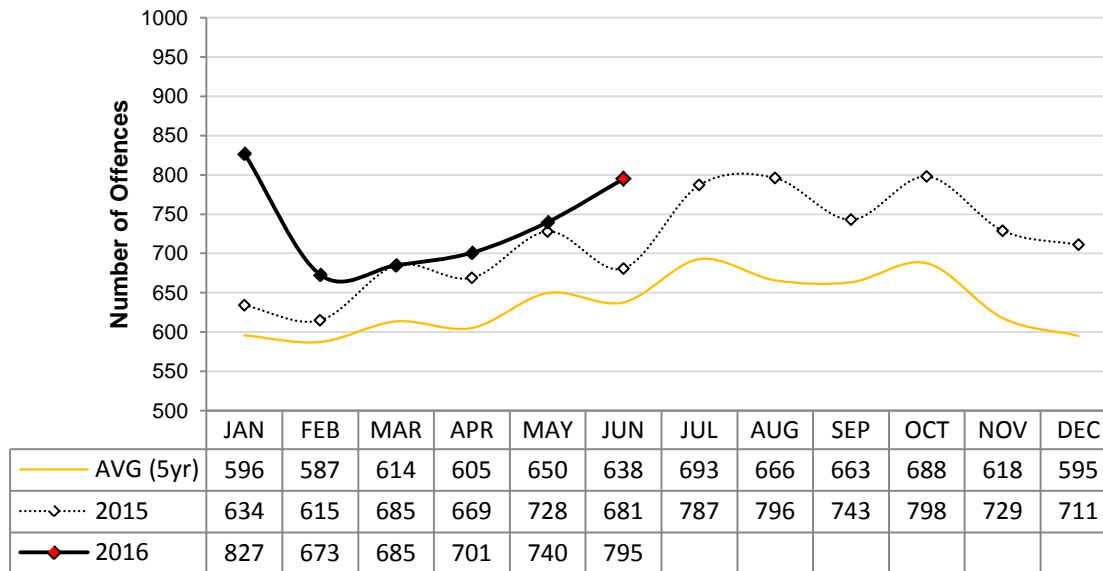
Calgary Person Crime Statistics – STATIC NUMBERS

To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period. *Due to the dynamic nature of ongoing homicide investigations these numbers may have been manually updated to reflect the current homicide count. Due to manually updating, it's possible 1 or more homicides may be reflected within the assault category. The homicide counts are provided by the homicide unit.

YTD Jan 01 to June 30 2016**



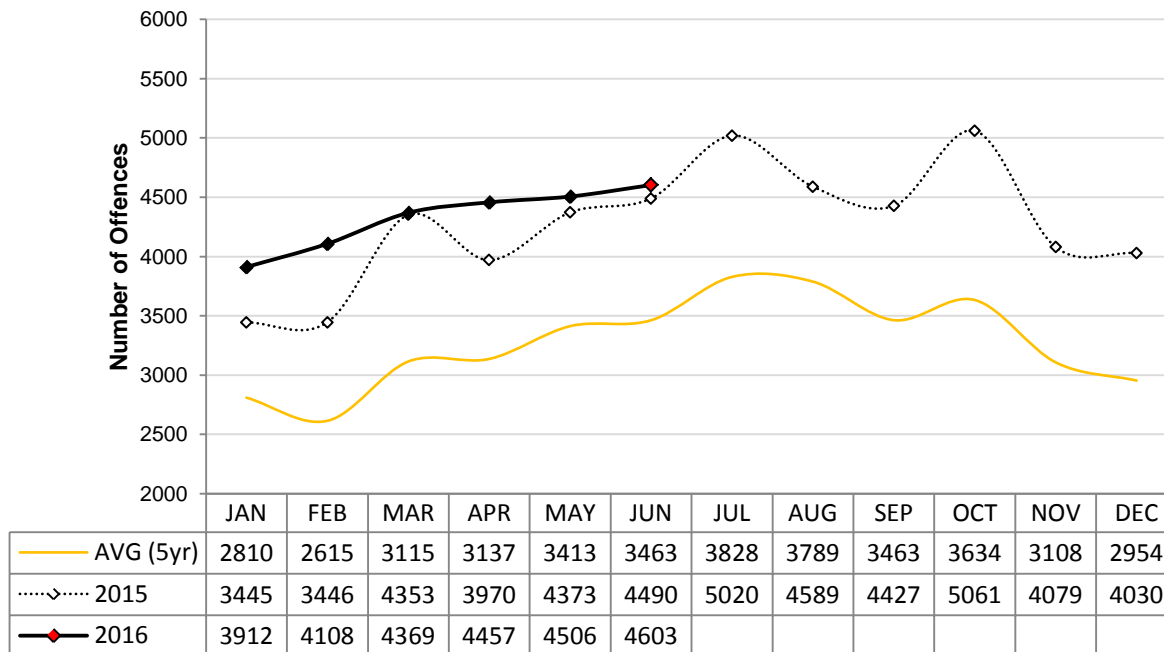

* e-Collision reporting is a data system which became operational in July 2009. At the time this report was published it was not possible to separate all collisions based on level of severity or to determine whether they occurred in a parking lot. Therefore, as e-Collision reports are completed and entered into the CPS records management system, it is determined whether or not they are reportable, and they are removed from the e-Collision count total and reclassified based on level of severity.

The locations denoted might be associated with intersections, on/off ramps, or mid-block locations, which are in close proximity but not necessarily at the exact specified locations. Collisions occurring on private property, such as shopping mall parking lots have been excluded from the data in order to strictly assess intersection related collisions.
