

# 1st Quarter 2021 Statistical Report

### **Executive Summary**

The full picture of the socio-economic impacts brought on by the public health state of emergency under Covid 19 is evolving. However, the immediate and sudden changes to the social dynamic of society, including office closures, shutting of businesses, closures of public spaces, restrictions on gatherings, and sweeping travel restrictions have had a significant short-term impact on both crime and disorder. We know that with the link between crime and the economy, particularly unemployment, and the longer-term impact of the pandemic on crime and calls for service is yet to be realized.

The Calgary Police Service has been tracking the impact of the Covid-19 state of public health emergency on crime and disorder patterns in the city. Since the state of emergency was declared on March 15<sup>th</sup> 2020, general call and crime volumes have shown noteworthy reductions. Restrictions on gatherings, closures of public spaces and the large portion of the population being home-bound have increased guardianship in residential areas and reduced the opportunity for certain crimes, such as robberies, break and enters and thefts of and from vehicles. Overall calls for service also saw slight reductions; however, there was an increase in citizen's reports of disorderly behaviours and non-criminal domestic conflict.

#### **Violent Crime**

During the first three months of 2020 crime volumes were on track with 2019 levels. The data shows that person-to-person violent crime volumes have been closely tied to the lockdown measures. During the First Quarter of 2021 violent crime remained well below the first two months of 2019 but showed a return to average levels in March. Criminal harassment, harassing communications and extortion have increased notably under the influence of the pandemic, with increases seen in non-familial relationships like business relationships, friends, and strangers.

There were three homicides in the First Quarter of 2021, a 29% decrease from the average of 4.4 for this period. One of the three homicides was domestic-motivated. Sexual assaults returned to average levels after dropping to their lowest level in four years during 2020. 'Level 1' (common) sexual assaults accounted for 95% of sexual assaults.

Assaults accounted for three in five violent crimes, with Level 1 (common) assaults making up the majority of all assaults. When compared to the First Quarter of last year, common assaults were down 5%; this type of violence has been influenced heavily by public health-related movement restrictions. More serious assaults, those with a weapon or causing bodily harm, were on par with the First Quarter of last year.

Robberies are crimes significantly impacted by the combination of closures of businesses and limited public movement. Between April 2020 and the end of the First Quarter 2021 financial robberies became nearly non-existent. Total robberies were down 30% from the First Quarter of 2020; commercial robberies dropped by 7%, and person robberies by 41% when compared to the same period in 2020.

Firearms involved in violent crime increased 12% from the benchmark average but were on par with last year. Firearms were present in 4% of violent crimes while 'other' weapons (hot beverage, other objects, vehicles, ligatures, etc.) were present in 12%, and edged weapons in 7%. Physical force remains the dominant weapon type in violent crime, accounting for more than half of all violent incidents.

#### **Domestic Violence and Domestic Conflict \***

Following on from the trend observed throughout the pandemic fewer victims have reported domestic violence than expected. The First Quarter shows a 6% reduction in domestic violence reports from the five-year average, and a 3% reduction from the First Quarter of 2020; reductions were driven largely by fewer reported 'Level 1' (common) assaults. There were, however, higher numbers of victims reporting more serious assaults.

#### **Executive Summary (con't)**

Calls made to police for assistance or for police presence in escalated domestic disputes that have not reached a criminal threshold remain elevated over expected levels; the First Quarter of 2021 shows an increase of 11% from the five-year average for the same period, and a marginal increase over First Quarter 2020. Most notably, the month of March under strict pandemic lockdown measures generated a spike in these types of calls, resulting in similar high volumes recorded during the onset of pandemic restrictions in April last year.

#### **Property Crime**

Property crime activity has been most affected by the societal movement pattern changes and restrictions from mid-March 2020 forward. First Quarter numbers from 2020 were only marginally impacted by these changes. Deep reductions in break and enters, shoplifting, general thefts and vehicle-related thefts have had the greatest impact on volume reductions when comparisons are made to pre-pandemic numbers. At the end of the First Quarter, Property Crime is 27% below last year and 19% lower than the benchmark five-year average. Enhanced guardianship of property combined with a reduction of vehicles and property in public spaces are primary factors in these reductions. A return to more normal movement patterns, combined with economic pressures and high unemployment are expected to bring property crime volumes back to pre-Covid levels.

When compared to the First Quarter of 2020, break and enters are down by 40%. This is a result of a 46% reduction in dwelling break and enters, a 40% drop in commercial break and enters as well as 31% fewer break-ins to other premises, such as detached garages and sheds.

Vehicle thefts reduced by nearly one-quarter from both the same quarter last year, as well as from the five-year average. This is a welcome reduction following a notable upward trajectory through the end of 2019, that resulted in Calgary having one of the highest rates of vehicle theft in the country. The First Quarter also registered a one-third reduction in thefts from vehicles. Shoplifting volumes were also driven downwards as shops operated at reduced capacity and with additional controls. Prior to the pandemic, shoplifting volumes had surged in 2018 and 2019. The First Quarter of 2021 resulted in 27% reduction from First Quarter 2020, and compared to the five-year average, resulted in an 8% drop.

Provincial Bill 21 introduced new sanctions for impaired driving offences under the *Provincial Administrative Penalties Act* (*PAPA*) on December 1st 2020. See page 14 for additional detail on provincial Immediate Roadside Sanctions (IRS)for impaired driving. The implementation of the new provincial legislation has resulted in a significant reduction in impaired offences under the *Criminal Code* as most first time impaired drivers will be subject to only an IRS:FAIL (the specific administrative penalty under the *Traffic Safety Act* for criminal level impaired driving offences), unless the incident results in death or serious bodily harm or other significant aggravating factors in which case criminal charges should also be pursued.

While there were 151 fewer *Criminal Code* impaired driving incidents (page 18) during the First Quarter there were 275 Immediate Roadside Sanctions (IRS) applied during this period. A total of 160 of the 275 IRS were 'IRS FAIL' contraventions and the remainder were a combination of 24-hour suspensions, novice driver and commercial vehicle sanctions for impaired driving (both of the latter are zero-tolerance thresholds).

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#### **REPORT NOTES**

Most of the statistical data in this report is derived from the Calgary Police Service records management system (SENTRY) and compiled by the Resource and Project Team/Bureau of Service & Community Support. Disorder data is derived from the Computer aided Dispatch (CAD) system.

Reporting is based on the most serious offence in the incident. Please note that offences are assigned to the month in which the offence was reported, which is not necessarily the month the offence occurred. The reported date is the first point in time at which the police were notified of the offence and reporting lag may vary due to circumstances (these are typically property crimes where the victim did not report the offence until a later date, or was unaware of the loss until a later date, or late-reported sexual assaults). Also note that "attempted" offences are included in these totals. Violent crime, excluding robbery, is counted by the number of victims, using the most serious offence against the victim. Robbery, and all other crime, is counted by incident using the most serious offence in the incident. Of note, cases are often cleared months and sometimes years later. Consequently, clearance rates for previous years may appear to be much higher than those of the present year. Cases "cleared by charge" and those "cleared otherwise" are included in these clearance rate totals.
