

# 4th Quarter 2021 Statistical Report

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### **Executive Summary**

The Calgary Police Service has been tracking the impact of the Covid-19 state of public health emergency on crime, disorder, and collision patterns in the city. Since the state of emergency was declared on March 15<sup>th</sup> 2020, general call and crime volumes have shown noteworthy reductions. Restrictions on gatherings, closures of public spaces and a large portion of the population being home-bound have increased guardianship in residential areas and reduced the opportunity for certain crimes, such as robberies, break and enters and thefts of and from vehicles, while increasing several non-contact crimes such as criminal harassment and threats. Although overall calls for service continue to track below expected levels, we are seeing increases in violent crime, citizen's reports of disorderly behaviours and non-criminal domestic conflict.

- There were twenty-one homicides during 2021, a 19% decrease from the five-year average, and thirteen fewer than in 2020. Four of the twenty-one homicides were domestic-motivated.
- There has been a notable increase in reports of Level 1 (common) sexual assaults, as well reports of sexual interference with a child. Reports of sexual offences against children increased by nearly one-quarter in 2021.
- Assaults increased to pre-pandemic levels, with common assaults and assaults with a weapon driving the increase. Assaults with a weapon, causing bodily harm and against peace officers were at six-year highs in 2021.
- There has been a noteworthy increase in the presence of weapons in violent crime through 2021. There was a 29% increase in firearms, as well as substantial increase in the presence of edged weapons, clubs, blunt objects, and other weapons.
- Non-physical violent crime such as extortion, criminal harassment, harassing communications and uttering threats have increased notably under the influence of the pandemic.
- Commercial robberies reached a six-year high; pharmacy, cannabis and cell phone stores were thematic targets.
- The number of victims of domestic violence remain stable with reporting in the previous year, as well as the average baseline. However, higher severity assaults jumped nearly one-quarter from average in 2021. Reports of domestic conflict also increased 11%.
- Property crime remained well below expected levels, down 16% from average. Property crimes have been most affected by the societal movement pattern changes and restrictions from mid-March 2020 forward. Deep reductions in break and enters, shoplifting, general thefts and vehicle-related thefts have had the greatest impact on crime volume reductions when comparisons are made to pre-pandemic numbers.
- Break and enters were 28% below average, with dwelling B&Es down 35% and commercial B&Es by 30% compared to the five-year average. Vehicle thefts remain well below the five-year average (down 22%).
- The number of young offenders identified in 2021 dropped 35%, with the reduction in property crime involvement driving the overall decrease. There has been a noteworthy increase in young offenders committing robbery.
- The total number of police service requests in 2021 was 5% lower than the five-year average. Citizen use of the online reporting system was embraced in 2021, growing by 50%. In 2021 police attended an average of 1,100 calls a day. Online citizen reports averaged 50 per day.
- Calls about disorderly behaviours rose by 5% in 2021. Calls about mental health concerns, unwanted guest, threats, and disturbances increased most notably. Disorder calls accounted for an average of 280 calls a day from the public.

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#### **REPORT NOTES**

Most of the statistical data in this report is derived from the Calgary Police Service records management system (SENTRY). Disorder data is derived from the Computer aided Dispatch (CAD) system. Data is compiled by the Corporate Data and Analytics Team of the Bureau of Service & Community Support.

Reporting is based on the most serious offence in the incident. Please note that offences are assigned to the month in which the offence was *reported*, which is not necessarily the month the offence occurred. The reported date is the first point in time at which the police were notified of the offence and reporting lag may vary due to circumstances (these are typically property crimes where the victim did not report the offence until a later date, or was unaware of the loss until a later date, or late-reported sexual assaults). Also note that "attempted" offences are included in these totals. Violent crime, excluding robbery, is counted by the number of victims, using the most serious offence in the incident. Of note, cases are often cleared months and sometimes years later. Consequently, clearance rates for previous years may appear to be much higher than those of the present year. Cases "cleared by charge" and those "cleared otherwise" are included in these clearance rate totals.
