

3rd Quarter 2022 Statistical Report

Executive Summary

- There were six homicides during the 3rd Quarter of 2022, a 3% increase from the five-year average. By the end of the 3rd Quarter the number of homicide victims for 2022 rose to 21, up 25% over average; this represents eight additional homicides over the first three quarters of 2021. Four of the 21 homicides were domestic-motivated.
- Reported sexual offences increased 11% over average for the 3rd Quarter and were 24% higher than average for the year-to-date period. The increase in 2022 has been the result of an increase in both assaults with a weapon or causing bodily harm and Level 1 (common) sexual assaults.
- Assaults were at average levels, although assaults with a weapon or causing bodily harm, assaults against peace officers and discharge of a firearm with intent registered increases during the Quarter.
- The presence of weapons in violent crime continues to remain higher than expected. The presence of firearms registered a 30% increase. The presence of edged weapon remained in line with average and substantially lower than last year during the same period. The presence of blunt weapons and other objects increased this quarter.
- Non-physical violent crime such as extortion, criminal harassment, harassing communications, and uttering threats increased notably under the influence of the pandemic. Throughout 2022, criminal harassment and uttering threats have been trending back downwards to average levels.
- Robberies overall trended downwards in the 3rd Quarter following noteworthy increases in the first two quarters of 2022 in both commercial and person robberies.
- The number of victims of domestic violence dropped 7% from the previous year and 10% from the 5-year average. Sexual offences and Level 2 (assault with weapon or causing bodily harm) increased notably at 11% and 12%, respectively. Reports of domestic conflict also increased by 8% over average.
- Property crime volumes has begun to rise following the significant lows recorded during the pandemic, although the 3rd Quarter shows an overall decrease of 11%. With the exception of fraud, all property crime categories recorded decreases. Break & enters of dwelling were 41% below average and commercial break and enters were 20 and 24% below average levels. Vehicle thefts were down 9%.
- The number of young offenders identified was 37% lower than the five-year average; with the reduction in property crime involvement driving the overall decrease with a 60% reduction. The number youth offenders identified in violent crime dropped 23% from average.
- The total number of police service requests was 11% lower than the five-year average. Citizen use of the online reporting system grew by 36% in the 3rd Quarter. During the 3rd Quarter police attended an average of 1,121 calls a day. Online citizen reports averaged 62 per day.
- There was a 6% reduction in calls about disorderly behaviours. Calls about mental health concerns, unwanted guests, threats, disturbances and property damage increased. Reductions were seen in the number of unwanted guests, intoxicated persons, indecent acts, suspicious activity, noise, and party complaints decreased most notably. Disorder calls accounted for an average of 273 calls a day from the public.

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REPORT NOTES

Most of the statistical data in this report is derived from the Calgary Police Service records management system (SENTRY). Disorder data is derived from the Computer aided Dispatch (CAD) system. Data is compiled by the Corporate Data and Analytics Team of the Bureau of Service & Community Support.

Reporting is based on the most serious offence in the incident. Please note that offences are assigned to the month in which the offence was *reported*, which is not necessarily the month the offence occurred. The reported date is the first point in time at which the police were notified of the offence and reporting lag may vary due to circumstances (these are typically property crimes where the victim did not report the offence until a later date, or was unaware of the loss until a later date, or late-reported sexual assaults). Also note that "attempted" offences are included in these totals. Violent crime, excluding robbery, is counted by the number of victims, using the most serious offence against the victim. Robbery, and all other crime, is counted by incident using the most serious offence in the incident. Of note, cases are often cleared months and sometimes years later. Consequently, clearance rates for previous years may appear to be much higher than those of the present year. Cases "cleared by charge" and those "cleared otherwise" are included in these clearance rate totals.



The implementation of the new provincial legislation (Provincial Administrative Penalties Act) has resulted in a significant reduction in impaired offences under the Criminal Code as most first time impaired drivers will be subject to only an IRS:FAIL (the specific administrative penalty under the Traffic Safety Act for criminal level impaired driving offences), unless the incident results in death or serious bodily harm or other significant aggravating factors in which case criminal charges should also be pursued.
