

# 2nd Quarter 2023 Statistical Report

#### **Executive Summary**

- Total violent crime for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter was 15% higher than the 5-year average.
- There were seven homicides during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter of 2023, an exact match to the five-year average. Two of the seven homicides were domestic-motivated.
- Reported sexual offences were 9% above average in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter. Approximately 70% of all reported sexual offences were in the Level 1 category.
- Robberies in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter were almost 30% higher than the 5-year average. This was driven by the volume of person robberies, which was 48% higher than average, and 66% higher than the same time last year.
- Assaults increased by 14% during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter compared to the 5-year average. Additionally, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter of 2023 saw a 10% increase in the volume of assaults compared to the same quarter last year. While almost every category of assault increased, the largest change was a 34% increase of assault with a weapon/causing bodily harm.
- The presence of weapons in violent crime during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter was almost 15% higher than the 5-year average (this figure excludes incidents with no weapons, which also went up). The increase was driven mainly by the use of verbal threats and other weapons (e.g. pepper spray or spitting).
- The number of victims of domestic violence declined 2% from the 5-year average during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter. However, reports of non-criminal domestic conflict increased by almost 9% over average.
- Property crime volumes were 6% below the 5-year average in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter of 2023, with notable declines across most Break & Enter types (overall -24%) as well as a 12% reduction of vehicle thefts.
- The overall number of young offenders identified was 25% above the five-year average during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter with a 28% increase in violent crime (driven by a 34% increase in assaults), a 25% increase in property crime (spread across break and enter, theft and other property crime) and an 18% increase in other crimes.
- Youth victims of violent crimes also increased by 15% as compared to the 5-year average. This was driven by a 43% increase in robbery victims and 22% increase in assault victims.
- The total number of police service requests during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter was 7% higher than the five-year average. Police attended an average of 1,054 calls a day. This is 2% lower than the 5-year average.
- Citizen use of the online reporting system remained 43% higher than the 5-year average, with roughly 61 reports per day.
- Disorder calls accounted for an average of 274 calls a day from the public during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter of 2023. Compared to the 5-year average, this represents a 4% reduction in calls related to disorderly behaviours. The largest decreases were in suspicious person, suspicious vehicle, and noise complaint calls. Calls related to disturbances, unwanted guests and mental health concerns all increased.

#### **REPORT NOTES**

Most of the statistical data in this report is derived from the Calgary Police Service records management system (SENTRY). Disorder data is derived from the Computer aided Dispatch (CAD) system. Data is compiled by the Corporate Data and Analytics Team of the Bureau of Service & Community Support.

Reporting is based on the most serious offence in the incident. Please note that offences are assigned to the month in which the offence was *reported*, which is not necessarily the month the offence occurred. The reported date is the first point in time at which the police were notified of the offence and reporting lag may vary due to circumstances (these are typically property crimes where the victim did not report the offence until a later date, or was unaware of the loss until a later date, or late-reported sexual assaults). Also note that "attempted" offences are included in these totals. Violent crime, excluding robbery, is counted by the number of victims, using the most serious offence against the victim. Robbery, and all other crime, is counted by incident using the most serious offence in the incident. Of note, cases are often cleared months and sometimes years later. Consequently, clearance rates for previous years may appear to be much higher than those of the present year. Cases "cleared by charge" and those "cleared otherwise" are included in these clearance rate totals.
