

Construction Site Safety Fill in the Blanks

1. The outer area of the city is made up largely of **RESIDENTIAL** construction.
2. **COMMERCIAL** buildings, including high-rises make up most of Calgary's downtown.
3. The City of Calgary **SAFETY** Codes Officers ensure safety rules are followed when building homes, schools, offices, etc.
4. You should **NEVER** enter a fenced construction site.
5. All construction sites requiring fencing are required to post **CONTACT** information.
6. One of the simplest ways to maintain public safety around a construction site is **COMMUNICATION**.
7. A tidy construction site is a **SAFE** construction site.
8. **SCAFFOLDING** is used by construction workers to get to hard to reach places, this equipment can be very dangerous if unsecured.
9. **HOARDING** might look like art or advertising space outside a construction site, but this temporary wall is an important barrier to keep the public safe from the construction site.
10. The City of Calgary issues permission to construct buildings by way of a **PERMIT**.
11. To ensure safety, permits are required to construct as well as **DEMOLISH** buildings.
12. There are many risks on a constructions site, including natural elements. **WIND** can create hazards when arriving unexpectedly with the power to send materials into the air.
13. A condition that could endanger a life, limb or health of any person allowed to be on a property is considered **UNSAFE**.
14. City of Calgary Safety Codes Officers monitor construction sites to ensure minimum safety standards are met. These site visits are called **INSPECTIONS**.
15. Before construction begins, **PLANS** are reviewed by City of Calgary Safety Codes Officers to ensure the safety of all Calgarians.
