Water Safety around Calgary's Waterways with Alexander Kwan

We'll even make a pretend 9-1-1 call so you can hear exactly what happens. It's like a sneak peek into the world of these emergency heroes.

You'll learn how these dispatchers make quick decisions to keep our community safe. It's like they have a superpower for handling tough situations. We want you to understand

how important it is to stay calm and talk clearly in emergencies. By the end, you'll know a lot more about how 9-1-1 works and in what situations you would have to call 9-1-1!

'Know your Safety: AHS Emergency Medical Safety Ambulance tour!' with Adam Loria

Take a sneak peek inside one of Alberta Health Services Emergency Medical Services vehicles! This ambulance tour will show you the incredible piece of our health system that our paramedics master to help save lives in our community every day!

Test your knowledge and ask questions to Adam Loria, who will guide us alongside our tour with the inside scoop to your curiosities. Learn more about the work that these superheroes/ines do every day to keep us all save, and the role we all play in helping support this critical health system that we all belong to, lean on, and need to keep having fun in Calgary!

'Online Safety 101: Hacks for fostering belonging in the online world to keep your community safe!' with Michael Kim & Alix McGurran

The topic Youth Link will be presenting about is online safety. The introduction will define social media, so students can gain an understanding of how broad it is and intertwined into daily life. The presentation will discuss the benefits of social media, and then the dangers in more detail. The students will receive helpful tips and strategies for staying safe online, such as:

Privacy settings on social media and why they are important, consequences of oversharing online and how to prevent this, who is safe to add as a friend online, how to protect yourself from online predators and scams, and the dangers and consequences of participating in social media challenges.

CALGARY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

'Emergency Preparedness' with John Acheson

The Calgary Emergency Management Agency's presentation at Safety Expo 2020 is designed to raise awareness of disaster risks in Calgary and what kids can to do prepare and be safe. This presentation will focus on four key themes: know the risks, be prepared, know what to do during an emergency, and know what to expect after an emergency.

During this presentation, participants will learn about past disasters in the City of Calgary, and how the City and Calgarians have worked to be prepared for future events. They will also learn the immediate steps they can take to stay safe, and different strategies and supports they can use to recover and build resilience after a disaster occurs.

Students will have the opportunity to interact with CEMA experts through interactive poll questions and will be able to ask questions through the chat function in MS Teams.

'Building back better: How you can use creativity and science can help us build safe communities!' with Kerrie Green

Join Kerrie from Calgary Emergency to learn how you can help to keep our cities safe through creativity, design, and problem-solving rooted in strengthening our sense of belonging and playing together! This presentation will talk about how we all contribute to building an awesome Calgary that can withstand and bounce back from hard days together through creative curiosity to increase the safety of our homes and loved ones. We will learn how to increase impact where we all have ability through design and connecting to the systems in Calgary that support us every day.

Kerrie will share tools that help all of us find our fantastically unique gifts to offer build a city that we all belong to. Students will have the opportunity to ask questions, and explore a design exercise with Kerrie, to learn how to connect to their environments, learn how we think about our built communities, and what you can do to build a better Calgary!

CENTRE FOR SEXUALITY

'Creating healthier communities through healthy friendships and interactions on social media!' with Neelam Makhani

The Centre for Sexuality has a mission and vision of educating, training, and advocating to support healthy relationships and sexuality across a lifespan. This presentation will explore the different dynamics of friendships, rights and boundaries as well as provide insight on how media can impact how we feel about ourselves. Youth will learn tools to navigate friendships, engage in healthy communication, analyze media messages and consume media safely.

CALGARY DROP-IN CENTRE

Share the Streets - Wisdom to help us all feel accepted and welcomed in the community.

The presentation illuminates the pivotal role the Drop-In Centre plays in addressing homelessness in Calgary. It delves into the nuanced understanding of homelessness, emphasizing compassionate language that distinguishes between a person's identity and their experience of homelessness, as well as some of the harmful myths and stereotypes that stigmatize those experiencing homelessness. The presentation showcases various forms of homelessness, including those sleeping outdoors, in emergency shelters, and in provisional shelter situations. It highlights the DI's comprehensive approach to offering not just emergency shelter but also essential care, health services, and housing supports tailored to individual needs. The presentation will also offer advice on how to engage with vulnerable populations.

CITY OF CALGARY FOOD RESILIENCE PROGRAM

'Super snacks: Creating and sharing your favorite snack to foster safety & belonging!'

Food is so much more than just fuel – it reflects culture, climate, relationships to our land and, most importantly, each other. Food is often a way that connects peoples and communities together to share and connect with each other, in good times and bad throughout our collective human histories. This creates a deeply emotional bond to our vital daily fuel for survival – a relationship even more complex in the face of so when it comes to food insecurity, food scarcity, and disasters. Join one of our local Food System super nerds to learn about how you can make super snacks, fostering belonging and supporting community identity and strength with the power of snacks! Just like a Scooby Snack, you'll learn about how we can all gain the power to save the day with a tasty treat!

CALGARY HUMANE SOCIETY

"How to Speak Dog" Learn about dog body language and bite prevention!' with Nabila Badr

Have you ever wondered what your dog is thinking? Well in this presentation, your class will learn the in-depth world of reading a dog's body language. We will discuss how to properly introduce yourself to a dog, ways to interact and how to respond to the cue's a dog is giving you about their emotions. During a Field Trip your class will visit with a social dog and will be able to practice reading dog body language and safe interactions. Your class will also create a dog themed craft or enrichment item for our resident dogs at CHS.

'Prevent Bullying: Pets and Peers!' with Nabila Badr

Students will discover the many similarities between bullying and animal cruelty by comparing the motivations and causes behind aggressive behaviour. This interactive, empathy building program includes real case studies and group activities which allow students to express their opinions, practice negotiation strategies, consider different perspectives, and perceive abuse from the viewpoint of the victim. We also discuss the importance of recognizing and reporting all forms of abuse and distribute contact numbers of local service agencies.

'Don't feed the bears!": Human Impacts on Wildlife.' with Nabila Badr

What really happens when you feed wild animals? Examine what happens when humans and wildlife collide. Respect, rights and responsibility are the 3 R's of animal welfare. Using case studies and engaging activities, students explore the needs of living things and learn about the importance of acting humanely towards all living creatures, both wild and domestic. Various issues will be discussed with an emphasis on co-existing with wildlife in urban areas.

'Wise Whiskers: An Animal Safety Workshop.' With Amanda Schultz

Embark on a wild adventure of knowledge as we dive into the captivating world of animal behaviour and the scientific method in our interactive workshop!

In this engaging session, fifth and sixth-grade students will unleash their inner animal whisperer by honing their observation skills and decoding the secret language of cats and dogs. Hosted by the dynamic team from the City of Calgary's Animal Care and Pet Licensing department, our workshop combines education, entertainment, and essential life skills. Developed by certified teachers seasoned in creating a blend of fun and education, the workshop guides students through the scientific method. Through handson activities and real-world examples, young minds will discover animals' cues to communicate. Get ready to observe, infer, and unleash your scientific superpowers!

'Talking Hazardous Waste with The City of Calgary.' With Michelle Dias

Join us for a look at how Calgary's waste diversion programs are protecting our environment!
