METHODOLOGY FOR OUTCOME ANALYSIS

As of June 30, 2022, 51 Indicator Surveys were available and 133 FCSS-funded programs used them to report data to the FCSS Social Inclusion Indicators database (FSII). Many programs use more than one survey.

Collective impact analysis includes all FCSS-funded programs offered by community organizations. This excludes FCSS-funded children and youth programs offered by Calgary Neighbourhoods.

This report includes data for active participants, those with a test date between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022. This includes cases when the pre-test date was prior to July 1, 2021 but the matched post-test date was after July 1, 2021.

A total of **22,397 individual participants** were served in programs using FSII from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 and were counted in the FSII. Some registered for more than one program or took the same program more than once at different times during the year.

There were **24,822 intake surveys** for participants. Associated with these were **34,950 pre-tests**. There are more pre-tests than intake surveys because of programs that use more than one survey. Of the pre-tests, **24,911** (71.3%) had **matching post-tests**. There was **no matching post-test** for **10,039** cases (28.7%), meaning change between pre-test and post-test could not be calculated. Lack of matched pairs might happen because the participant hasn't been in the program long enough or dropped out before the post-test was given.

Change between pre-test and post-test was examined for all surveys with 25 or more matching pre/post test responses. Questions that could be analyzed for statistically significant change were assessed using the Wilcoxon Signed Rank Test. Statistical significance is reported using p-values.

STATISTICALLY SIGNIFICANT CHANGE AND P-VALUES

In the following tables, if the p-value is \leq 0.05, the change between the pre-test and post-test is statistically significant and unlikely to have occurred by chance. Significant change can be positive or negative, as shown (+ or -).

If the p-value is >0.05, the change between the pre-test and posttest is not statistically significant and suggests that the outcome has not improved between the pre-test and post-test.

Overall scores are presented in this summary report for each survey across the four Dimensions. Detailed results for each question on every survey with 25 or more matched pre/post test responses are provided in the collective impact reports prepared for each survey.
