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
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Map 1 – 2006 Calgary Community Boundaries

Executive Summary

This report contains information on key social indicators of well-being within Calgary's community districts. The purpose of the report is to assist community leaders and service providers in identifying strengths and needs within their own communities in order to respond effectively to local opportunities and challenges. Nineteen indicators have been utilized to provide an understanding of relative well-being for individuals in communities with respect to economic, social and physical dimensions. Data has been drawn primarily from custom tabulations based on the 2006 federal census.

For each indicator, an index value was ascribed to each community to represent the relative position of each community with respect to both the number and percentage of individuals exhibiting the indicator. Communities were subsequently ranked based on their index value. A composite index provides a summary of the relative well-being of communities based on their rank for each indicator as measured against all other communities.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

This document provides an update of the *Indices of Community Well-Being* based largely on 2006 federal census data. Prior to 2006, earlier versions of the report were produced based on 1986, 1991, 1996 and 2001 federal census data*.

The purpose of the *Indices of Community Well-Being* is to provide relevant information regarding the key dimensions of Calgary communities to assist community leaders and service providers in identifying strengths and needs within their own communities. The *Indices of Community Well-Being* report is intended primarily to:

- Provide relevant data to identify incidence and risk of selected social problems for communities and for particular at-risk groups within the community.
- Provide data on key social and economic indicators to inform program planners and policy makers in the City of Calgary and the community.
- Provide a measure of the well-being of Calgary communities relative to other communities and the city as a whole.

Social indicators are statistics selected to represent the social conditions of groups of people. These statistics can be used to compare different people to each other, or to measure how the conditions of a group of people have changed over time (Noll, 1996). Due to the fact that social indicators are intended to measure the welfare of a group of people, the selection of indicators involves value judgements which come from particular theories about social welfare or from public policy goals (Carley, 1981).

In addition to the field of social work, three main disciplines have contributed to current social welfare theory and, consequently, to ideas concerning indicators of social welfare: development economics, public health, and environmental science. Development economics views social welfare as primarily an economic condition, related to an individual or group's command over resources. Public health views social welfare in terms of population health, recognizing that health is more than the absence of disease, but a function of the social and economic conditions of the population. Environmental science introduced the concept of sustainability to describe the relationship between human activity and the integrity of the bio-physical environment. The concept of social sustainability recently emerged from this school of thought, focusing on forms of social organization which are compatible with social stability.

Common to the approaches described above are the concepts of social, economic, health, and environmental conditions as key dimensions of social welfare. This framework provides a holistic view of community that recognizes that the well-being of the individual and the community is defined by the quality of the individual's social relationships, economic situation, and physical environment. Consequently, this report utilizes a framework which incorporates the economic, social, and physical dimensions of community to describe the well-being of Calgary communities (see table 1).

2.0 CALCULATING THE INDICES OF COMMUNITY WELL-BEING

The *Indices of Community Well-Being* examines communities according to the dimensions of economic, social, and physical well-being.

2.1 Description of Indicators

Economic Well-Being

Economic well-being refers to the availability of economic resources and opportunities for individuals within a community, and the equitable distribution of those resources and opportunities throughout the city. Accordingly, measures of economic well-being include indicators of:

- Poverty
- Employment
- Housing adequacy and affordability

An important aspect of community well-being is the equitable distribution of resources and the ability of individuals and families to meet their basic needs. Communities with large numbers of individuals with low-incomes may exercise less economic influence and have a lower capacity to garner resources for collective goods or for local economic development. Further, individuals and families with low-incomes may experience greater risk to their physical and mental well-being. Indicators of poverty include the number and rate of persons in low-income households, children in households receiving provincial Income Support (IS), and seniors receiving the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS).

Employment measures are important indicators of the ability of community members to participate in the social and economic life of the community and thereby to feel connected to the community as contributing members. Of particular importance is the availability of employment for youth who may be vulnerable to low-income and economic marginalization. Accordingly, the number and rate of unemployed adults and youth are selected as separate indicators of economic well-being.

The availability of adequate and affordable housing is a basic human need essential for personal health, and community well-being. The selected indicator of housing affordability is the number and rate of tenant occupied households spending more than 30% of income on shelter costs. Housing adequacy is measured by the number and rate of homes requiring major repair.

Social Well-Being

Social well-being refers to the ability of individuals to engage in healthy and productive social relationships. Accordingly, the following indicators have been selected to provide a measure of social well-being.

- Family stability
- Social inclusion
- Educational attainment

Family stability is important for the nurturing of healthy relationships and for providing economic and social support to both parents and children. The number and rate of lone-parent families are selected as measures of family stability as such families may be more vulnerable to social and economic risk due to a possible lack of shared parenting and resources.

Social inclusion measures indicate the capacity of individuals to participate in community life and receive community support in times of stress. Individuals who lack strong attachment to community may be more vulnerable in times of social or economic stress. Indicators of social inclusion include the number and rate of unattached individuals, recent movers, seniors who live alone, recent immigrants, and individuals who are unable to speak one of the official languages.

Educational attainment provides a measure of the capacity of individuals and the community to exercise influence in society. Generally, an education level of less than high school is associated with lower literacy and numeracy rates, and consequently lower earnings and decreased ability to participate in public life. The number and rate of individuals who have not completed high school has therefore been selected as the measure of educational attainment.

Physical Well-Being

Physical well-being refers to the relative freedom of the individual from risk to their person. Selected indicators of physical well-being include:

- Personal health
- Personal safety

Personal health is generally understood to mean freedom from illness. The indicators of personal health selected for this report include the number and rate of hospital in-patients per community and the number and rate of persons with disabilities*. Although these indicators do not wholly represent the health of individuals in the community and are subject to social and temporal influences, they are quickly understandable and available at the community level.

Personal safety includes the safety of the individual from injury as well as from person crime. Indicators of personal safety selected for this report include the number and rate of emergency room visits, the number and rate of person crime and the number and rate of residential structure fires.

* Due to data availability, this version of the *Indices of Community Well-being* differs from previous versions in that it includes persons with disabilities in place of persons receiving AISH (Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped) benefits.

2.2 Methodology

There are two methodological approaches commonly used in the reporting of social indicators. The first approach is descriptive and provides basic socio-economic data without comparing or interpreting these data. The information provides a social profile of the community and is intended primarily for reference purposes. The second approach is evaluative and attempts to measure differences in well-being between groups of people, or between points in time.

This report takes the second approach, to be evaluative of differences in well-being between Calgary communities.* Variables have been selected according to the conceptual framework developed above (see table 1). Calgary communities are evaluated based on the incidence and risk of the various indicators. Both incidence and risk are expressed as index values. For this document, two types of indices were constructed: an Index of Volume (INV), and an Index of Risk (INR).

The Index of Volume (INV) measures the number of individuals that experience a particular indicator for a particular community. The INV is constructed by summing the number of indicator experiences in each community and dividing by the number of communities to produce a Calgary average. Individual community INV scores may then be interpreted by comparing them to the average INV score, which has been set to a par value of "0".

$$INV = (n / a) - 1$$

where "n" = the number of indicator experiences for each community and "a" = the average for all communities.

The Index of Risk (INR) measures the percentage of individuals that experience a particular indicator for a particular community. The INR is constructed by calculating the percentage of individuals experiencing an indicator for a given community as well as for the city as a whole. The percentage for each community is then divided by the percentage for the city to produce the INR score. Individual community INR scores can be interpreted by comparing them to the average INR score, which has been set to a par value of "0".

$$INR = ((n / p) * 100) / r - 1$$

where "n" = the number of cases for each community, "p" = the population for each community, and "r" = the rate for all communities.

In order to help the reader determine which community districts have the greatest number and rate of the specified indicators, each community has been ranked against all other communities according to its INV and INR scores. Ranking on both scores proceeds from highest score to lowest, with a rank of "1" identifying the community with the highest number/percentage of individuals experiencing the indicator.

* Due to data availability, residual areas and certain industrial areas have been excluded from the calculations. In addition, this document does not include communities that are new since 2006. This includes the following communities: Silverado, Mahogany, Sunridge, Legacy, Royal Vista, Seton, Skyview Ranch, Stonegate Landing, Walden and Westwinds. In 2007, Symons Valley was divided into Symons Valley (renamed to Nolan Hill in 2009), Kincora, Sherwood and Sage Hill. This report represents data from Symons Valley before the division.

In order to provide a summary of the data for the city as a whole, an average Index of Volume (INV) was calculated by summing the INV scores for each variable for each community, and dividing by the number of variables. Community districts were then ranked according to their average INV scores. The resulting average INV identifies communities with the greatest number of individuals experiencing the indicators utilized in this report.

Finally, recognizing that community well-being is a function of both the *number* of individuals in a community experiencing need, as well as the *percentage*, a classification system was developed to classify communities according to both factors. This was accomplished by summing the INV and INR rank for each indicator. For example:

Communities were then ordered according to their total INV and INR ranks from lowest rank score to highest; the lower the score, the lower the need in the community. The INV and INR lists were then divided into quintiles and communities classified according to the quintile range into which they fell, providing a typology (below). Communities that fell within the top two quintiles, on both the INV and INR rank scores, were classified as high-volume and high-risk communities. Communities that ranked within the top two quintiles on the INV and in the bottom three quintiles on the INR rank scores were classified as high-volume, low-risk communities. Communities that ranked within the bottom three quintiles on the INV and within the top two quintiles on the INR total rank scores were classified as high-risk, low-volume communities. Communities that ranked within the bottom three quintiles on both the INV and INR total rank scores were classified as low-volume, low-risk communities.

3.0 ECONOMIC WELL-BEING

A strong economy is a fundamental condition of community well-being. Richardson (1995) states that the economy “should really be seen as that part of the social system that enables certain specific needs to be met (efficiently and equitably, or otherwise)”. A healthy economy enables individuals to gain employment to meet physical and social needs, and provides for an equitable distribution of income throughout the community. This report uses measures of poverty and unemployment as indicators of economic well-being. Poverty indicators include individuals in low-income households, children in households receiving provincial Income Support (IS) benefits, and seniors receiving the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS). Employment indicators include unemployment among adults and youth.

3.1 Poverty

In Calgary, many households have incomes low enough to be considered as living in “poverty”. In Canada, official examinations of poverty tend to use the Low Income Cut-offs (LICO's), commonly referred to as the “poverty line”, as calculated by Statistics Canada. According to this definition of poverty, a household is poor if it spends at least 20% more than the average Canadian household on the basic necessities of food, clothing and shelter. Statistics Canada has determined that the average Canadian household spends 43.6% of its income on these basic necessities. Therefore, a family is “poor” if it spends 63.6% or more of the average income on these basic necessities.

Using this definition, it cannot be taken to mean that a high-income family, which voluntarily spends more than 63.6% of its income on basic necessities, is poor. In order to provide a useful measure, a minimum dollar value is established by calculating 63.6% of the average household income, for each of various household sizes, for each year, taking inflation into account (Giles, 2004). This minimum dollar amount is referred to as the Low Income Cut-off (LICO). According to this definition, a poor household is one with an income below the relevant LICO amount.

- 2 persons family: \$25,867
- 3 persons family: \$31,801
- 4 persons family: \$38,610

The causes of poverty are many. Poverty may result from prolonged periods of unemployment and reliance on government supports (Caledon Institute of Social Policy, 1999), or from employment which is part-time or which provides inadequate wages for the household (Clark, 1995). Some groups that are more likely to experience unemployment and reliance on government supports are youth, seniors, single parents, single women, recent

immigrants, persons who are visible minorities, Aboriginal people and individuals with disabilities.

3.11 Poverty: Individuals Living in Low-Income Households

Households with low incomes are of concern as they tend to be more vulnerable to the fluctuating costs of goods and services, and may not be able to afford basic needs. This may be a threat to both the physical and mental well-being of the person or persons living in low-income households. According to Statistics Canada (2008a), 15.3% of the population of Canada had incomes below the Low Income Cut-off (LICO) in 2006, as compared to 16.3% in 2001. In Alberta, 12.2% of the population had incomes below the LICO in 2006, which was lower than the national rate and slightly lower than the rate of 13.9% recorded in 2001. In Calgary, however, the poverty rate remained higher than the provincial rate in 2006.

Statistics Canada estimated that 138,745 individuals, or 14.2% of Calgary residents, were living in households with incomes below the LICO in 2006, compared to a rate of 14.9% in 2001. Among individual Calgary communities, the number of persons living in poverty ranged from zero in four communities, to 4,545 in the community of Beltline.* On average, 743 residents per community were living in poverty, with nine communities having three times the average (see table 2).


The percentage of persons living in low-income households ranged from 0.0% in four communities, to 56.2% in the community of Chinatown, with an average of 14.2% of the population of each community having incomes below the LICO. Thirteen communities had more than twice the average, with four of these having more than three times the average (see table 3).

The communities of Downtown Commercial Core, Beltline, Falconridge, Forest Lawn, Penbrooke Meadows, and Albert Park/Radisson Heights ranked high in terms of both volume and rate of individuals in low-income households, suggesting a high need for poverty-related services in these communities.



3.12 Child Poverty: Children in Households Receiving Income Support

Statistics Canada reported that an estimated 17.7% of Canadian children and 14.2% of Alberta children under the age of 18 were living in low-income households in 2006 (Statistics Canada, 2008b). In Calgary, over 38,000 children under the age of 18 (15.8%) were living in low-income households in 2006.

In order to alleviate the effects of poverty, each province provides income support programs for low-income individuals and families. While income support programs are designed to provide a basic minimum income, at 2007 Income Support rates, a typical family of two parents with two children received only 50% of the LICO (National Council on Welfare, 2008).

The poverty that persists in spite of Income Support receipt affects not only the individual, but also any children reliant upon that individual. When reliance on social assistance becomes chronic, both short and long term consequences occur. In the short term, quality of life for the recipients and their dependants deteriorates. In the long term, the psychological effects of prolonged dependence on social assistance could adversely affect the children of recipients and may create a group of adults that face a greater risk of social services dependency.

In 2006, 3,646 children, roughly 1.7% of the total population under the age of 18, were living in households in receipt of Income Support benefits (Service Alberta, 2006). On average, there were 20 children per community in households receiving Income Support benefits, ranging from zero in 53 communities, to 199 in the community of Forest Lawn (see table 4).

There were 19 communities with more than 3½ times the average, accounting for 54% of all children in households receiving Income Support.

The percentage of children living in families receiving Income Support varied from 0.0% in 53 communities to 17.6% in the community of Southview. On average, 1.7% of children under the age of 18 were living in households in receipt of Income Support with 14 communities having more than 3½ times the average (see table 5). Communities with high ranks in terms of both volume and rate included Forest Lawn, Dover, Albert Park/Radisson Heights, Marlborough, Southview, Spruce Cliff, Erin Woods and Forest Heights, suggesting a great need for children's services.





3.13 Seniors Poverty: Seniors Receiving GIS

Poverty experienced by seniors is a concern as it is likely to be chronic due to the fact that paid employment, which may alleviate poverty, is less available for seniors than for persons of other ages. Statistics Canada estimated that 14.4% of Canadian, 10.9% of Albertan and 13.9% of Calgary seniors were living in low-income households in 2006 (Statistics Canada, 2008b).

Seniors whose income is lower than what is necessary for survival on a day-to-day basis may receive a supplement from the federal government known as the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS). Even with this supplement, some seniors are left with an income below the poverty level. This may mean that they are unable to purchase the basic necessities of food, clothing, shelter, or other goods and services.

Data obtained from Human Resources and Skills Development Canada indicates that 26,301 Calgary seniors (31.7%) were receiving GIS in 2006 with an average of 147 recipients in each community. Among Calgary communities, the number of seniors receiving GIS ranged from zero in one community, to 601 in the community of Huntington Hills (see table 6).

The percentage of seniors receiving GIS varied across the city from 0.0% in one community, to 95.7% in the community of Chinatown. Nine communities had more than twice the average rate (see table 7).


Communities that ranked highly both in terms of number and percentage of seniors in receipt of GIS included Chinatown, Bridgeland/Riverside, Whitehorn, Downtown East Village, Downtown Commercial Core, Monterey Park, Pineridge and Penbrooke Meadows. The convergence of volume and rate in these communities indicates that a large number of poor seniors live in these areas and that they comprise a large percentage of the seniors population, suggesting a great need for seniors' services.



3.2 Unemployment

Employment is a basic need for individuals in a community. Not only does employment provide income necessary for the purchase of basic goods and services, employment also provides social contact, meaningful activity and positive self-esteem. When people lack employment, they not only lose income but also self-esteem, support, and opportunities for social interaction, loss of which may lead to deeper social and personal problems. The ability of community members to obtain employment is therefore a fundamental component of a community's well-being.

3.21 Unemployment Among Adults Aged 25+

Unemployment among adults is of particular concern as the impact of unemployment transcends the individual by virtue of the fact that individuals in this age group are more likely to have dependents. Possible outcomes of prolonged unemployment include chronic stress, depression, substance abuse, family breakdown, domestic violence and poverty. These conditions will have significant impacts on others, including dependent family members, and may result in reliance on community supports and social services.

There were 15,985 adults (aged 25 and over) who were in the labour force* and unemployed in Calgary in 2006 with an average of 85 per community, ranging from zero in 14 communities to 385 in the community of Beltline. There were nine communities with more than 2½ times the average (see table 8).


The percentage of adults in the labour force who were unemployed ranged from 0.0% in 14 communities to 11.1% in the community of Manchester (see table 9), with an average of 3.1% of adults in the labour force being unemployed. The communities of Forest Lawn, Downtown Commercial Core, Forest Heights, and Mission ranked highly in terms of both volume and rate of unemployed adults.



3.22 Unemployment among Youth Aged 15-24

Not all young people are fully occupied with educational pursuits. Indeed, many do not spend all their time in post-secondary institutions or do not finish high school. These young people tend to be in the labour force, but have greater than usual difficulties in obtaining and keeping jobs. Unemployment rates among youth tend to be substantially higher than the rates for adults, with a national youth unemployment rate of 12.8% in 2006, compared to 6.6% for the population as a whole. In Alberta, the youth unemployment rate was 8.2%, lower than the national average, but higher than the rate for the general population of 4.3%. In Calgary, the youth unemployment rate was 8.6%, compared to a rate of 4.1% for the total population (Statistics Canada, 2008c).

In Calgary, there were 8,915 youth aged 15-24 in the labour force and unemployed in 2006. There was an average of 48 unemployed youth per community, ranging from zero in 25 communities to 245 in the community of Edgemont, with seven communities having more than three times the average (see table 10).



The percentage of unemployed youth ranged from 0.0% in 25 communities to 50.0% in the communities of Eagle Ridge and Roxboro, with 11 communities having more than 2½ times the average of 8.6% (see table 11). Castleridge was the only community reporting a high rank for both number and percentage of unemployed youth.



3.3 Housing

The availability of adequate and affordable housing is an important contributing factor to the well-being of individuals and communities. The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) points out that the cost of housing is “an important factor in the choice of neighbourhood with associated implications for the travel distance to work, choice of schools, family safety, access to community services, and other family concerns” (FCM, 1999:44). Individuals whose incomes are low, relative to the cost of housing, may find themselves in substandard accommodations, or may divert income from other necessities such as food and clothing to cover shelter costs. In the worst scenario, individuals may be left homeless if the cost of shelter is too high relative to their financial resources. This section provides information on the affordability and adequacy of housing in each community. The affordability indicator used is renters spending more than 30% of their income on rent. Housing adequacy is measured by the number and rate of houses requiring major repair.

3.31 Affordability: Renters Spending More than 30% of Income on Shelter Costs

A useful measure of housing affordability is the percentage of an individual's income that is devoted to paying for shelter. Statistics Canada considers housing to be unaffordable if the cost of housing is more than 30% of an individual's income (Rea, Yuen, Engeland and Figueroa, 2008). Using this standard, individuals who spend more than 30% of their income on shelter are deemed to be living in unaffordable circumstances and therefore to be at risk. Of particular importance is the affordability of rental accommodation. Tenants may experience greater financial stress as rent affordability problems are less easily solved for renters than owners. Whereas owners may solve affordability problems by selling their home or otherwise utilizing their home equity, similar financial resources are not available to tenants. In 2006, 40.2% of renters in Canada were spending more than 30% of their income on rent. Among major urban centres in Canada, the number of renters spending more than 30% of their income on rent increased from 35% to 41% between 1991 and 2001, and by as much as 40% in some cities, while the percentage spending more than 50% of their income on rent increased from 16% to 20% over the same period (Federation of Canadian Municipalities, 2004).

In 2006, there were 41,135 tenant households (39.3% of all tenant households) in Calgary living in unaffordable circumstances. On average, there were 221 such tenant households per community, ranging from zero in 15 communities, to 2,875 in the community of Beltline, with nine communities having more than three times the average (see table 12).


The percentage of renters in this situation varied from 0.0% in 15 communities, to 100.0% in the communities of Scarboro/Sunalta West and Shepard Industrial. In 32 communities, at least half of all renters spent more than 30% of their income on rent (see table 13). There were no communities with high ranks on both the INV and the INR for tenant households overspending on rent.



3.32 Occupied Dwellings Requiring Major Repair*

The provision of adequate housing is an important determinant of individual well-being. Housing that is inadequate due to age, neglect, or faulty design, may contribute to poor physical and mental health of the occupant. It may indicate the presence of disease or toxins due to insects, or contribute to respiratory problems resulting from poor air quality. Inadequate housing may also fail to provide a suitable environment for child social and educational activity (Ross and Roberts, 1999). Often, poorer housing is located in less desirable areas, that is, in closer proximity to higher traffic or industrial areas which may compromise health and safety (Canadian Council on Social Development, 1998).

In Calgary, 4.9% of homes were in need of major repair in 2006, which was slightly lower than the rate of 5.6% in 2001. There was an average of 101 homes per community requiring major repair, varying from zero in 15 communities, to 645 in the community of Beltline, with eight communities having more than three times the average (see table 14).

* The need for major repairs is determined by census respondents. Examples of major repairs include repair of defective plumbing or electric wiring or structural repairs to walls, floors or ceilings (Statistics Canada, 2007b).

The percentage of homes requiring major repair varied from 0.0% in 15 communities, to 20.7% in the community of Shepard Industrial, with 18 communities having more than twice the average (see table 15).


Communities that ranked highly on both the INV and the INR for homes requiring major repair included Forest Lawn, Bowness, Penbrooke Meadows and Highland Park. Also of note are the two mobile home communities of Red Carpet/Mountview and Greenwood/Greenbriar, which had a large percentage, although not a large number, of homes requiring major repair.



4.0 SOCIAL WELL-BEING

Social well-being refers to the ability of individuals to engage in healthy and productive social relationships. Individuals require positive social relationships and a sense of belonging. Healthy social relationships are important, not only for the continued mental health of the individual, but also as a support in times of stress. Meaningful connection to the basic social structures of family and community, therefore, is an important dimension of social well-being. In addition, education enhances the ability of the individual to access and control resources, as well as to exert influence in civic affairs. Accordingly, this section examines a set of indicators which reflect the ability of individuals in a community to engage in productive social relationships. Selected indicators of social well-being include indicators of family stability, social inclusion, and educational attainment.

4.1 Family Stability

The family is an important support structure for the individual and community since strong family structures can reduce vulnerability to economic and social stress. In families that are headed by a lone-parent, the entire economic and parenting responsibility is carried out by one parent, increasing family vulnerability to social and economic stress. These stresses affect both parent and child. For a single parent, reliance on a single income may reduce the ability to adequately provide for basic needs. In 2005, 29.0% of lone-parent families in Canada were low-income. The poverty that affects lone-parent families tends to affect women more than men. In 2006, female lone-parent families accounted for 80.7% of all lone-parent families in Canada. Of those, 32.2% were living in poverty compared to 16.0% of lone-parent families headed by males (Statistics Canada, 2008b).

Across Canada, lone-parent families accounted for 25.8% of all families with children in 2006. In Calgary in 2006, 39,770 families were headed by a lone-parent. This represented 23.5% of all families with children, which was steady with the rate of 23.7% in 2001 (Statistics Canada, 2007c). There was an average of 213 lone-parent families per community in 2006, ranging from zero in six communities to 840 in Huntington Hills, with four communities having more than three times the average (see table 16).



The percentage of lone parent families ranged from 0.0% in six communities to 66.7% in the community of Shepard Industrial with eight communities having more than twice the average (see table 17). The communities of Dover, Forest Lawn and Albert Park/Radisson Heights ranked highly in terms of both volume and rates of lone-parent families.



4.2 Social Inclusion

Next to the family, the community is one of the fundamental organizing principles of society. While community can be defined in a variety of ways, geographical communities are important for the development of formal and informal social attachments (Crowhurst-Lennard and Lennard, 1987). Where individuals have strong attachments to community, the residents are more likely to be involved in maintaining the health and safety of the area, are more aware of available resources, and may have a greater sense of control over decisions that affect them (Connolly and Daneluz, 1999).

A feeling of “connectedness” or belonging to a community is an important component of an individual’s social development. Those who lack connection to their community are at risk of social isolation with attendant physical, health and economic risks. This report identifies five meaningful indicators of social inclusion: the number and rate of individuals who have moved within the past year, the number and rate of recent immigrants, the number and rate of individuals without capacity in at least one of the two official languages, the number and rate of unattached individuals, and the number and rate of seniors living alone.

4.21 Individuals Who Moved Within the Past Year

Attachment to a community develops over time as individual and familial relationships are established and engagement in community activities and roles is begun. As a result, communities that have a large number of new residents may have lower levels of attachment. For the individual, this lack of attachment may result in increased feelings of isolation, or an inability to access local supports and resources in times of need due to unfamiliarity with the supports available. Lower levels of attachment may also result in lower levels of participation in community life (Connolly and Daneluz, 1999).

In Calgary communities in 2006, there was an average of 1,054 residents aged one year or more who moved within the previous year, a rate of 20.4% per community. This represents a very slight increase from the rate of 19.3% in 2001. The number of movers varied from 15 in three communities, to 6,495 in the community of Beltline, with six communities having more than three times the average (see table 18).

The percentage of movers varied from under 3.0% in two communities to 100.0% in the community of CFB - Lincoln Park PMQ, with 14 communities having more than twice the average (see table 19). The large percentage of movers in CFB - Lincoln Park PMQ, Auburn Bay, Copperfield, Symons Valley, Country Hills Village, Aspen Woods, Evanston and Cranston can be explained by the fact that these were redeveloped or newly developing communities at this time. The inner-city communities of Beltline and Downtown Commercial Core had high ranks for both the INV and the INR for recent movers.





4.22 Recent Immigrants

Recent immigrants tend to be more socially and economically vulnerable than individuals who have been in Canada for a longer time, often facing social and economic adjustment challenges while lacking the support network or familiarity with resources available to assist them through the adjustment period. Some may also lack the language fluency required to effectively integrate into their new community.

Of a total of 242,745 immigrants in Calgary in 2006, 56,855 (23.4% of all immigrants) arrived between 2001 and 2006, an average of 303 new immigrants per community. The number of new immigrants ranged from zero in 11 communities, to 2,405 in the community of Beltline, with nine communities having more than three times the average and accounting for 22% of all new immigrants (see table 20).


The percentage of new immigrants varied from 0.0% in 11 communities, to 38.5% in the community of University of Calgary* (see table 21). The communities of Beltline, Downtown Commercial Core, Taradale, Martindale, Rundle, Whitehorn, Bridlewood, Falconridge Saddleridge, ranked highly in terms of both volume and rate of new immigrants.



4.23 Individuals Without Official Language Ability

Individuals who lack ability in the official languages of service or the common language of speech face a considerable risk of being socially and economically isolated. Service accessibility is limited and misunderstandings in communication can result in the individual becoming a victim of stereotyping, discrimination, and fraud. While not being able to speak English or French is an impure indicator of this form of marginalization, it can serve as a proxy measure to help guide the targeting of services.

In Calgary, there were 20,590 individuals (2.1% of the population) that spoke neither English nor French in 2006. On average, there were 110 individuals in each community lacking ability in one or both of the official languages. The number of individuals lacking official language ability ranged from zero in 33 communities, to 825 in the community of Rundle, with 22 communities having more than three times the average (see table 22).


The percentage of individuals in each community lacking ability in either English or French varied from 0.0% in 33 communities to 48.5% in the community of Chinatown, with 10 communities having more than three times the average (see table 23). Communities with a high INV and a high INR for persons lacking official language ability included: Chinatown, Rundle, Taradale, Martindale, Sandstone Valley, Coral Springs, Whitehorn, Castleridge, Penbrooke Meadows, Monterey Park, Beddington Heights, Huntington Hills, Saddle Ridge, Applewood Park, Falconridge, and Downtown Commercial Core.



4.24 Unattached Individuals

Unattached individuals are persons who are not part of an economic family, which means that they either live alone or in a household where they are not related to any other member of that household (Statistics Canada, 2007a). Like lone-parent families, unattached individuals are more likely to bear social and economic stress alone, placing them at a greater social, economic and health risk. Unattached individuals are at an increased risk of poverty, with just over 30% of unattached individuals in Alberta and Calgary having incomes below the Statistics Canada Low Income Cut-off amount (Statistics Canada, 2008b).

In 2006, there were 153,825 unattached individuals in Calgary, accounting for 19.2% of the population. On average, a community included 824 unattached individuals, with the number ranging from zero in four communities, to 8,390 in the community of Beltline. Ten communities had more than 2½ times the average (see table 24).



The percentage of unattached individuals per community varied from 0.0% in four communities, to 63.5% in the community of Downtown East Village, with five communities having more than 2½ times the average (see table 25). Communities with high ranks on both the INV and INR for unattached individuals were located entirely in the inner city area. These included Downtown Commercial Core, Mission, Beltline, Bankview, Lower Mount Royal, Crescent Heights, and Sunnyside.



4.25 Seniors in the Community Living Alone

Like other unattached individuals, seniors who live alone may face greater social, economic and health risks due to potentially fewer family supports. In addition, lone seniors may have difficulty accessing essential services due to a higher incidence of disability or frailty. In Calgary, there were 23,145 seniors who lived alone in 2006, 26.1% of all seniors. The number of lone seniors ranged from zero in 17 communities to 845 in Beltline. On average, there were 124 lone seniors per community, with nine communities having more than three times the average (see table 26).



The percentage of lone seniors ranged from 0.0% in 17 communities, to 100.0% in the community of New Brighton, with five communities having more than 2½ times the average (see table 27). Data for New Brighton should be treated with caution as the figures could be distorted by rounding due to its small population. Communities that ranked highly on both the INV and INR for lone seniors were located in the inner-city or inner suburbs and included Beltline, Downtown Commercial Core, Downtown East Village, Bridgeland/Riverside, Lincoln Park, Chinatown, Windsor Park and West Hillhurst.



4.3 Education: Persons Who Did Not Complete High School*

Studies indicate that individuals who do not complete high school have substantially elevated levels of unemployment and low income. Statistics Canada reported that, in 2006, 20.6% of the population of Canada aged 25 years and older had not completed high school. Of those who had not completed high school and were in the labour force, 8.9% were unemployed compared to 5.6% for the total population (Statistics Canada, 2008c). In 2006, 19.3% of the Alberta population aged 25 years and older had not completed high school. Of those who had not completed high school and were in the labour force, 5.0% were unemployed, compared to a rate of 3.4% for the total population (Statistics Canada, 2008d). Since employment is a critical source of income as well as personal satisfaction and self-esteem, completing high school is an important step in preventing poverty and discouragement later on.

* The 2006 figures on individuals who had not completed high school are not comparable to previous versions of *The Indices of Community Well-being*. There are two reasons for this: 1) Previous versions reported figures based on individuals who were not currently enrolled in school, however data on school attendance was not available for the 2006 Census of Canada. 2) Data on education for the 2006 Census of Canada was grouped by age categories that were different from previous years. Whereas, previous versions of the *Indices* reported this indicator for individuals 20 years or older, the current version reports for those 25 years or older.

In 2006, there were 92,820 individuals in Calgary (14.1% of those aged 25 and over) who had not completed high school. On average, there were 497 individuals per community that had not completed high school, ranging from zero in three communities to 2,235 individuals in Penbrooke Meadows, with 14 communities having more than three times the average (see table 28).


The percentage of residents who had not completed high school varied from 0.0% in three communities to 56.8% in the community of Chinatown (see table 29). Communities with high ranks on the INR and the INR for persons lacking a high school education included Penbrooke Meadows, Forest Lawn, Dover, Monterey Park, Abbeydale, Marlborough, Marlborough Park, Rundle, Albert Park/Radisson Heights and Forest Heights.



5.0 PHYSICAL WELL-BEING

Important to the discussion of community well-being is the physical health and safety of the individuals in the community. According to the Canadian Council on Social Development (CCSD), “being in good physical and mental health, feeling safe from accidents and disease, and having access to adequate medical care in times of need are all basic elements that contribute to a person’s sense of physical security” (1999:21). For the purposes of this report, physical well-being refers to physical health as well as safety from accidents and crime. The following indicators were selected to reflect the level of physical well-being of each community:

- Facility utilization rates^{*} provide an indicator of injury and illness of individuals. Facility utilization includes in-patient hospital care and hospital emergency room visits. The rate of emergency room visits provides an indicator of acute illness and injury while the rate of in-patient services provides an indicator of acute injury and chronic illness.
- Persons with disabilities provides an indicator of individuals who have difficulties with daily activities or who have had to reduce their activities due to physical or mental conditions or health problems.
- Crimes in the community provides a measure of the safety of individuals in the community from person crimes.
- Residential structure fires provides a measure of the safety of individuals in the community from injury or death due to residential fires.

5.1 Personal Health

5.11 Hospital In-Patient Service Utilization

Of importance from the perspective of community well-being are the characteristics of hospital users. Research has established contributing factors to hospitalization including mental condition, age, long-term disability, and economic factors (Wilkins and Park, 1997). In particular, hospital utilization has been found to be significantly and negatively related to the adequacy of household income. Other research has established links between chronic illness and socio-economic status due to lifestyle choices among lower socio-economic groups that increase the risk of health problems (Millar and Stephens, 1993).

* While there are various measures of health available, facility utilization is a useful indicator due to its availability and consistency at the community level. While useful, such indicators should be interpreted with caution as the data may reflect differences in a person’s willingness or ability to visit the hospital as well as temporal practices of determining who may access hospital services, rather than the actual health of the person. However, given that a visit to the hospital is most commonly associated with injury or disease, hospital utilization remains a useful proxy measure.

In Calgary, there were 82,869 hospital in-patients* in Calgary in 2006, ranging from 17 in the community of Roxboro to 1,477 in the community of Tuscany. The average number of hospital in-patients per community was 435, with three communities having more than 2½ times the average (see table 30).





5.12 Persons with Disabilities

Disabilities, as defined by Statistics Canada (2007b), refers to “difficulties with daily activities and the reduction in the amount or kind of activities due to physical or mental or other health problems ... that have lasted or are expected to last six month or more”. In 2006, there were 157,615 individuals in Calgary who had disabilities, accounting for 16.1% of the population. Among Calgary residential communities, the number ranged from 20 in Auburn Bay and CFB Lincoln Park PMQ to 2,855 in the community of Huntington Hills, with an average of 844 individuals with disabilities per community. There were three communities with more than three times this average (see table 32).





5.2 Personal Safety

The physical well-being of individuals is governed in part by how safe they are in their homes and communities. Personal safety is generally thought of as safety from injury and accident, as well as the safety of person from crime. Accordingly, the indicators of emergency room visits and incidence of crime were selected to reflect personal safety.

5.21 Emergency Room Visits

The Canadian Institute of Child Health (CICH) reports that injury is the leading cause of death for children age 5–14 years, and the second most important cause of hospitalization (Hanvey, Avard, Graham, Underwood, Campbell, and Kelly, 1994). Of importance from the perspective of community well-being is the correlation between the risk of injury and socio-economic status. The CICH report notes that children in the lowest income neighbourhoods are at the greatest risk of dying from injuries (Hanvey et al., 1994). Health Canada produced a similar report that identified a significant correlation between income status and hospitalization due to injury among children and youth (Health Canada, 1997).

As injuries and acute illness often result in utilization of an emergency room, facility utilization provides a measure of the relative safety of a particular community. Interpretation of the data requires caution as many factors apart from health may contribute to emergency room use. Proximity to a hospital tends to increase emergency room use, for example, and social factors may influence a person's decision to visit an emergency room rather than a family doctor. However, despite these limitations, the indicator is readily understood and can be easily collected at the community district level.

In Calgary, there were a total of 238,277 visits to the emergency room* from residential communities in 2006, a rate of 243 visits per 1,000 persons. The number of visits per community varied from 56 in the community of Roxboro to 3,508 in the community of Whitehorn (see table 34). There was an average of 1,153 visits per community, with four communities having more than 2½ times the average.

The rate of emergency room visits ranged from 96 per 1,000 persons in the community of Downtown West End to 962 per 1,000 in the community of Eagle Ridge, with three communities having more than 2½ times the average (see table 35). The communities of Dover and Forest Lawn had high rank for both the INV and the INR for emergency room visits.

* The number of emergency room visits refers to the total number of visits, rather than the number of unique individuals who visited the emergency room, as a person may have visited the emergency room more than once during a year.





5.22 Person Crime

Since their peak in 1991, crime rates overall are declining in Canada and most of its provinces and territories. However, crime rates remain above the national average in all four western provinces (City of Calgary, 2009).

Crime rates are also declining in Calgary. Total criminal code offences (excluding traffic) in Calgary's census metropolitan area (includes surrounding municipalities of Chestermere, Cochrane, Airdrie, Beiseker, Crossfield, and MD of Rocky View) decreased by 10.8 per cent to 6,202 per 100,000 persons between 2005 and 2007 (Statistics Canada, 2006 & 2008e). In addition, person crime rates declined steadily in the city of Calgary from 1,008 per 100,000 persons in 2004, to 923 in 2006, and 800 in 2008 (Calgary Police Service, 2009).

When interpreting community crime data, caution must be exercised that the total number of crimes refers to reported rather than actual crimes. A variety of social factors may influence the reporting of crime. It should also be noted that person crime refers to the number of crimes committed in a community, not by persons from that community, as crimes are often committed by people from outside the community. Crime data in this report refers to crimes to persons and includes homicide, attempted homicide, robbery, sex-related offences, assault or miscellaneous criminal code offences*.


There were a total of 7,748 person crimes committed in Calgary communities in 2006, contributing to a person crime rate of 7.8 per 1,000 persons. In 2006, there were 7,094 person crimes in the communities included in this study, ranging from zero in seven communities to 552 in Beltline. The average number of person crimes committed in communities in 2006 was 38, with 14 communities having more than 2½ times the average (see table 36).

The rate of crime per 1,000 population in the study communities was 9.7, ranging from 0.0 in seven communities to 354 in Forest Lawn Industrial. As noted before, a high rate of crime in a community may be the result of crime committed by persons that do not live in that community. Seven communities had more than three times the average (see table 37). The communities of Beltline, Downtown Commercial Core, Downtown East Village, Forest Lawn, Albert Park/Radisson Heights, Bowness, Marlborough, Falconridge and Forest Heights had a high rank for both the INV and the INR for person crimes.



5.23 Residential Structure Fires

There were a total of 698 residential structure fires in the communities included in this report in 2006, with an average of four fires per community. The rate of fires in these communities was 0.8 per 1,000 persons. The number of fires ranged from zero in 32 communities to 22 in the community of Beltline. There were nine communities with more than three times the average (see table 38).


The rate of fires per 1,000 population ranged from 0.0 in 32 communities to 4.1 in the community of Eau Claire, with nine communities having more than three times the average (see table 39). The communities of Downtown Commercial Core, Albert Park/Radisson Heights, Downtown East Village, Forest Lawn, Sunalta and Renfrew ranked highly in terms of both the INV and the INR for residential structure fires.



6.0 OVERVIEW OF THE CITY OF CALGARY


6.1 Average Index of Volume

In order to identify communities with the greatest number of persons experiencing need, an average INV score was calculated. The average INV was calculated by summing the INV scores across the 20 variables, and dividing by the number of variables.* The result of this calculation is most easily reviewed by looking at the following summary map. The average INV score ranged from 4.59 in the community of Beltline, to -0.97 in the community of Auburn Bay. The 20 communities with the highest average INV scores are listed in Table 40 below.

6.2 Comparing Volume and Risk

The overall well-being of a community is determined by both the volume (number of people in need) and risk (percentage of the population in need). Communities were ranked according to both aspects and three main need groupings were identified:

- Highly vulnerable communities
- Moderately vulnerable communities
- Least vulnerable communities

For a more detailed discussion of the process used to create these groupings see Section 2.2: Methodology (pp. 5).

6.21 Highly Vulnerable Communities.

There were 41 communities that ranked within the top two quintiles on both the INV and the INR ranks (see table 41). Among these communities, 15 ranked within the top quintile on both the INV and INR rankings and are identified in bold on Table 41.

6.22 Moderately Vulnerable Communities

Moderately vulnerable communities include those that either ranked high on volume and low on risk, or low on volume and high on risk. There were 64 moderately vulnerable communities including 32 high risk/low volume, and 32 high volume/low risk communities.

i. High Risk/Low Volume

Communities with a high percentage but low number of people in need are listed below (see table 41). These communities tended to resemble highly vulnerable communities in their level of need, but were smaller in geographic area with correspondingly smaller populations. As a result, the total number of people in need was lower, although the risk was high.

ii. High Volume/Low Risk

Communities with a large number but low percentage of people in need are listed below (see table 41). In terms of their level of well-being, these communities tended to resemble low needs communities, but have larger volumes of individuals in need due to a larger geographic area and correspondingly larger population size.


6.23 Least Vulnerable Communities

The least vulnerable communities are those that ranked in the bottom three quintiles on both the INV and INR rankings (see table 41). There were 80 least vulnerable communities in Calgary, accounting for 43% of all communities. There were 14 communities that ranked in the bottom quintile for both volume and risk and are identified in bold in Table 41.

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SUMMARY OF CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS VERSIONS

Due to data availability, some changes have been made to the 2006 version of the *Indices of Community Well-being*. These adjustments are highlighted below:

- **Recent Immigrants, page 46.** The 2006 recent immigrant INR as well as the percentage of recent immigrants is not comparable with figures reported in previous versions of the *Indices of Community Well-being*. In the past, these calculations were based on recent immigrants as a percentage of all immigrants, whereas the 2006 figures represent recent immigrants as a percentage of the total population.
- **Person Who Have Not Completed High School, page 62.** The 2006 figures on individuals who had not completed high school are not comparable to previous versions of the *Indices of Community Well-being* for two reasons:
 - Previous versions reported figures based on individuals who were not currently enrolled in school, however data on school attendance was not available for the 2006 Census of Canada.
 - Data on education for the 2006 Census of Canada was grouped by age categories that were different from previous years. Whereas, previous versions of the *Indices* reported this indicator for individuals 20 years or older, the current version reports for those 25 years or older.
- **Persons With Disabilities, page 71.** Due to data availability, this version of the *Indices of Community Well-being* differs from previous versions in that it includes persons with disabilities in place of persons receiving AISH (Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped) benefits.
