
Enmax Legacy Parks Program — Bowness Park Lagoon



Bowness Park Lagoon

Project: Bowness Regional Park is a high-use, year-round park from the early 1900s. The lagoon edge has deteriorated over the last 50 years as the water is raised and lowered to accommodate summer and winter use. While it was originally envisioned that the scope of the work at Bowness was solely lagoon edge work, the timing was right to undertake a comprehensive public design process for the entire park, which was completed in 2009. A full restoration plan for the park now has Council approval and funding.

Budget: \$327K Enmax Legacy Park Program funds the total project.

Timeline: Funding received in the 2012-2014 budget cycle through Community

Investment Funds.

Construction to be phased over 4 years to allow partial park use throughout.

Enmax Legacy Park funds to be used on select lagoon edge projects.

Benefits: This historic regional park was not part of Calgary until the 1960s but has been a park destination for over 70 years. It provides a year round facility for summer boating and picnicking as well as winter outdoor skating. The park is a combination of both a natural and ornamental parkland.
