### **Land Acknowledgment**

We encourage successful grant applicants to include a Treaty 7 Land Acknowledgment within their project. This can be done orally (at the beginning of your event) or on poster board depending on the type of project you are organizing. Why? A Land Acknowledgment is a statement recognizing the traditional territory of the Indigenous people who called the land home before the arrival of settlers, and in many cases still do call it home. It is an act of reconciliation.
