## BEDROOM WINDOWS USED FOR EMERGENCY ESCAPE

#### Reference: Sentence 9.9.10.1.(1), Sentence 9.9.10.1.(2) and Sentence 9.9.10.1.(6)

**Sentence 9.9.10.1.(1)** "Except where the *suite* is *sprinklered*, each bedroom or combination bedroom shall have at least one outside window or exterior door openable from the inside without the use of keys, tools or special knowledge and without the removal of sashes or hardware. (See Article 9.5.1.2. and Appendix A.)"

Sentence 9.9.10.1.(2) "The window referred to in Sentence (1) shall

- a) provide an unobstructed opening of not less than 0.35m<sup>2</sup> in area with no dimension less than 380 mm, and
- b) maintain the required opening during an emergency without the need for additional support. (See Appendix A.)"

**Sentence 9.9.10.1.(6)** "If the window referred to in Sentence (1) is provided with security bars, the security bars shall be openable from the inside without the use of keys, tools or special knowledge."

#### Question:

Does the dimension and area given above refer to the size of the entire window opening or the size of the moveable panel?

### **Commentary I Relevant Facts:**

It is quite clear from Sentence (2) that the key word is "unobstructed." The intent of this requirement is to provide an alternative means of escape from the bedroom in case of an emergency. Therefore any obstructions which cannot be easily and safely removed or broken through are not acceptable within the area and dimensions specified in Sentence 9.9.10.1.(2).

### **Conclusion:**

The sketch below shows the minimum acceptable standard of the window to comply with Article 9.9.10.1.

Note: If rolling shutters have been incorporated into the window assembly they must also be readily operable with no special knowledge or tools.
