Roles of The City, Developers & Communities

A community experiences revitalization with a rise in redevelopment projects. Population grows as a variety of people move to the neighbourhood.



The City's role

- Review and approve plans for new communities.
- Build supporting infrastructure, like utilities and roads.

The Developer's role

- Build a new community on undeveloped land.
- Invest in marketing activities to attract residents to the new community.

The Community's Role

- Residents move into a new community.

The City's role

- Regular lifecycle maintenance on existing infrastructure.

The Developer's role

- Developer activity reduces as the neighbourhood is established.

The Community's Role

- Residents support local businesses and use local infrastructure and amenities.

The City's role

- Regular lifecycle maintenance on existing infrastructure.

The Developer's role

- Developer activity remains low.
- Developers identify future projects in aging communities.

The Community's Role

- Some residents may move out to match their changing lifestyle needs or reinvest to update their homes.

The City's role

- Approve applications for new development.
- Infrastructure may be replaced or upgraded.
- Invest in public space improvements to accommodate a growing and changing population.

The Developer's role

- Redevelopment projects add new housing and businesses to the area.
- Upgrade public spaces as part of redevelopment.

The Community's Role

- Residents identify local needs and improvements to accommodate growth and change.
