#### High Park transforms the Beltline canvas

High Park is a new rooftop public park and event space in the Beltline serving as an exciting destination for residents and visitors to the city alike. Built on top of a parkade, the park reimagines the under-utilized rooftop of the City Centre Parkade as public space. The park features a boardwalk, lined with a series of colourful parklets that encourage socially distanced outdoor get-togethers. High Park was developed in partnership by the Beltline Neighbourhoods Association, the Calgary Parking Authority, Public City Architecture and the Beltline Urban Mural Project, with funding from The City of Calgary's Beltline Community Investment Fund.

## LodgeLink Inc. creating 300 new tech jobs downtown

LodgeLink Inc., a digital B2B workplace travel platform that efficiently connects service providers to businesses seeking workforce logistics management, is receiving up to \$3 million from the Opportunity Calgary Investment Fund (OCIF). This investment will support an expected 300 new tech jobs over five years in Calgary. Along with the 300 tech jobs associated with OCIF support, which will include roles in software development and systems/data analytics, LodgeLink expects to hire another 300 non-tech positions in Calgary.

#### **Downtown Ambassadors**

The City of Calgary and the Calgary Downtown Association have partnered, along with other groups like Tourism Calgary and Alpha House Society, to create a Downtown Ambassador pilot for the area around City Hall and Stephen Avenue. Downtown Ambassadors have been connecting Calgarians and visitors to information on services, places and supports in the downtown since September. The primary focus for the ambassadors has been outreach, safety, cleanliness, while providing a presence to the area. The Downtown Ambassador program was initiated through The City's 9 Block Program, an initiative to improve safety and vibrancy in the area surrounding City Hall.

# Downtown Ambassador Pilot Facts:

- 1,302 interactions with Calgarians, including over 350 with members of Calgary's vulnerable population
- 200 referrals to social services
- 80 hand sanitizer, masks and COVID-19 awareness kits distributed to skaters at Olympic Plaza

#### Nordic loop brings skiing to the East Village

The area around Fort Calgary has been transformed into the East Village Nordic Loop a one kilometre-long, groomed cross-country skiing loop. Calgary Municipal Land Corporation, Fort Calgary and the Foothills Ski Club are grooming this downtown and Bow River adjacent loop throughout the winter to give Calgarians a socially-distanced workout space, in the heart of Calgary's centre. Bring your own skis and make use of the onsite waxing station before hitting the trail.

- 1 km loop with access at the Fort Calgary parking lot,
  6 Street S.E. and 8 Avenue S.E., and the Elbow River Traverse bridge
- Free of charge to use



# **Downtown Calgary**

The Bow and Elbow Rivers bind Calgary's Downtown to the north and east and 17 Avenue to the south and 14 Street to the west. It includes communities such as the Downtown Commercial Core, East Village, Beltline, Downtown West End, Eau Claire and Chinatown.

#### **Gross Domestic Product (GDP) Growth**

Measure of the value of final goods and services produced by the economy within the Calgary Economic Region.

# Downtown & Beltline

## **Average Office Net Rental Rates**

A weighted average of head lease rates per square foot across all building classes in a given location (such as Downtown or Beltline). This rate is exclusive of building costs such as operating costs and property taxes.

# Work

#### **Office Absorption Volume**

The net change in occupied space, measured in square footage, over a specified time frame, and takes into consideration newly constructed space. Commonly it is reported from one quarter to the next (for example, from Q3 to Q4 2020).

## **Office Supply**

Total square footage of rental space in office properties, regardless of occupancy or vacancy.

#### **Downtown Crime Count**

Crime count includes incidents of assault (non-domestic), robbery, violence (non-domestic), break & enter, theft of vehicle, and theft from vehicle. It does not include incidents of disorder. Examples of disorder include incidents of disturbance, neighbour disputes, party complaints, suspicious persons, threats, drugs, and fire.
