



Protect your roof against hail

Upgrade your roof and apply for a \$3,000 resilient-roofing rebate.

The Resilient Roofing Rebate program incentivizes upgrades from standard roofing products to impact-resistant products to protect homes from severe weather damage.

Eligibility

- My property is a single-family, semi-detached or duplex home
- I am in good standing on my property tax roll
- I have proof that my roof was damaged from a hailstorm in 2020, or I will apply for the program starting January 2022

How to participate

- You must complete the application form by visiting calgary.ca/hail
- You must replace your roofing with a Class 4 rated roofing system that meets the impact rating for UL2218 (Underwriters Laboratories Inc.) or FM4473 (Factory Mutual Approvals). Acceptable roofing materials include, but are not limited to:
 - asphalt shingle
 - metal
 - clay tile
 - plastic/polymer/composite products
 - concrete tile
 - recycled rubber
- You must have a receipt and proof of purchase (semi-detached properties require receipts for the full roof on both homes)
- You must use a contractor (or third-party inspector) who is a member of the Alberta Allied Roofing Association (AARA) or Alberta Roofing Contractors Association (ARCA)
- If you replaced your roof with a Class 4 impact-resistant product and did not use a contractor who is a member of the AARA or ARCA, you must have a roof inspection report that confirms Class 4 impact-resistant product and installation. The City will cover \$300 of the inspection cost in addition to the roofing rebate for approved applications with receipt showing proof of inspection. Contact ARCA to access an approved roofing inspector.

Important dates

- The City will begin accepting applications on June 1, 2021
- From June 1 to December 31, 2021, The City will only accept applications from eligible homeowners whose roofs were impacted from a hailstorm in 2020
- In January 2022, the program will accept applications from any eligible homeowner who replaced their roof (after June 1, 2021), or plans to replace their roof, with a certified impact-resistant product

Resilient Roofing Installation Checklist

The following items must be complete when installing a Class 4 rated roof system.

- Old roof covering was removed
- Contractor repaired and/or replaced damaged roof sheathing as required
- Contractor installed product on clean, dry and fully sealed sheathed deck (taped seams or fully adhered membrane)
- Contractor used continuous underlayment throughout
- Products are a Class 4 rated roofing system that meets the impact rating for UL2218 (Underwriters Laboratories Inc.) or FM4473 (Factory Mutual Approvals). Acceptable roofing materials include but are not limited to:
 - asphalt shingle
 - metal
 - clay tile
 - plastic/polymer/composite products
 - concrete tile
 - recycled rubber
- Starter shingles are used at eave and rake edges to provide a double seal against wind or as otherwise specified by the manufacturer
- There are six nails per shingle or as otherwise specified by the manufacturer
- Contractor removed and replaced damaged drip edges
- Contractor installed valley flashings, as required
- Contractor installed ice and water shield at lower drip edges
