Toadflax, Yellow Linaria vulgaris Scropulariaceae (Figwort/Snapdragon Family) Category:

Noxious











- Information: Introduced from Europe as an ornamental.
- · Life cycle: Perennial.
- Root: Creeping rhizomes.
- Leaves: Numerous, alternate, pale green to graygreen, individually connected to the stem, long (2 1/2 inches long or longer) and narrow, pointed at both ends, with smooth edges.
- ·Stems: 20-60cm inches tall, usually not branched.
- Flower: Yellow, snapdragon-like flowers with orange throat, 2.5-3cm long with downward spur (1 inch long), on short stalks in dense clusters at top of stems.
- Seed/Fruit: Capsule brown, round to oval with two compartments. Seeds dark brown to black, less than 4cm in diameter, flattened, with papery circular wing.
- Control: Chemical mid august.

Toadflax, Dalmatian Linaria dalmatica Scropulariaceae (Figwort/Snapdragon Family) Category:

Noxious









- Information: Similar to Yellow Toadflax.
- · Life cycle: Perennial.
- Root: Taproot and horizontal roots with adventitious buds, woody.
- Leaves: Leaves and stems waxy, pale green to bluish green. Heart-shaped leaves alternate with smooth edges, and clasp stem.
- ·Stems: Up to 90cm tall, robust.
- Flower: Develop at base of the upper leaves, snapdragon-like, bright yellow with an orange throat and a long spur.
- Seed/Fruit: Irregular angled seeds in twocelled capsule.
- · Toxicity:
- · Control: chemical
