Eren has provided leadership to high profile projects, including facilitating the efficient distribution of Ontario Works to Ukrainian families arriving in Canada under the Canada-Ukraine authorization for emergency travel (CUAET); leading the deployment of key transportation safety initiatives after the Humboldt accident; facilitating relationship-building between the City of Toronto and First Nations in southern Ontario through collaboration in landfill gas utilization projects; and, leading the design and rollout of culturally-sensitive and culturally-safe initiatives fostering employment and training, and gender equality approaches across 28 Urban Indigenous communities in Ontario.

Eren holds a BA in Political Science and Religious Studies from the University of Alberta, and has received extensive training in public administration, public management, business administration, Lean Six Sigma approaches, systemic design and results-based management from a variety of organizations, including Carleton University, Thompson Rivers University and the Canada School of Public Service.
