

MOBILITY SAFETY VIDEO CONTEST

CONTEST RULES:

This Contest is open to Calgary residents only and is governed by the laws of the Province of Alberta.

1. CONTEST PERIOD

- 1.1 The City of Calgary (“**The City**”) Travel Safe Video Contest (the “**Contest**”) will commence at 12:00:00 p.m. Mountain Daylight Time (“MDT”) on February 3, 2026, and end at 11:59:59 p.m. Mountain Daylight Time (“MDT”) on April 15, 2026 (the “**Contest Period**”).

2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 All participating students must comply with the rules for consent. A student below 18 years of age must obtain parent or legal guardian permission and consent, sign and submit consent form to participate (“**Eligible Contestants**”).
- 2.2 The Contest is open to residents of Calgary who are students enrolled in kindergarten to Grade 12 in a school or homeschool located within The City limits. Participating students may enter the Contest as individuals, in small groups of between two and five contestants or by entire classroom submissions, guided by the class teacher.
- 2.3 Consent forms are required for ALL group members below 18 years of age that feature in the group video or audio submission. **All Eligible Contestants are expected to have read the [Contest Terms and Conditions](#).**
- 2.4 All entries are subject to verification by The City. The City reserves the right in its sole discretion, to request from any contestant, at any time for the purposes of the Contest, proof of identity and/or eligibility in a form acceptable to The City, including, without limitation, government issued photo identification. Contestants who do not provide such proof in a timely manner and to The City’s satisfaction or do not otherwise prove identity and/or eligibility to the satisfaction of The City, will be disqualified from the Contest.

3. HOW TO ENTER

- 3.1 Eligible Contestants will create a 30-second video on one of these traffic safety subjects:
- (a) Pedestrian safety: Look out for each other, be aware, be safe, and stay alert at intersections and street crossings;
 - (b) Bike safety: Be safe, ride, cycle, or wheel smart and abide by safety rules of the road;
 - (c) Speed; Know the speed limit, drive within it: why speed matters; or



- (d) Distracted travel: which includes all people moving through the transportation network including drivers, pedestrians, cyclists, and other micromobility users who are not fully paying attention to their surroundings.
- 3.2 The submission must be original and created by an individual Eligible Contestant or a group of Eligible Contestants and uploaded on a video hosting website of the Eligible Contestant(s)' choice.
- 3.3 Eligible contestant(s) must send the following information to streetsafekids@calgary.ca.
- (a) the title of the video;
 - (b) the safety topic of choice;
 - (c) the name(s) and grade(s) of everyone in the group and the group submission category (Gr. K-3, 4-6, 7-9, or 10-12);
 - (d) the name of their school (if applicable);
 - (e) the weblink to the uploaded video; and
 - (f) completed consent form(s) for **ALL** group members who are below 18 years of age and feature in the group video or audio submission.
- 3.4 The submission must be suitable for viewing by all ages and must not depict violence, gore, or use of strong language.
- 3.5 The submission must be created in a safe environment and under parental/guardship supervision if the Eligible Contestant is below 18 years of age.
- 3.6 The submission must not include any copyrighted material and/or any third-party personal information. If a third-party personal information is included in the video, such personal information should be redacted or concealed before submission.
- 3.7 Eligible Contestant(s) can only make one submission. Multiple submissions will be disqualified.

4. PUBLICATION, NO AI PROVISION, LICENSE, RELEASE, AND INDEMNIFICATION

- 4.1 By participating in the Contest, the Eligible Contestant(s) and the Eligible Contestant(s)' parent or legal guardian:
- (a) represent and warrant that the Eligible Contestant(s)' submission is an original work, and that the Eligible Contestant(s) owns all right, copyright, title, and interest in and to the submission as of the date of submission or has all necessary rights, authorizations, and/or assignments to submit it and the express permission of all individuals (including parental consent for minors) and the rights necessary to use all content and materials embodied in the submission and to submit it for possible use as provided herein;



- (b) shall not use any artificial intelligence or machine learning to create, modify, analyze, or process any data, content, or submissions under this Contest. All submissions must be created by students. This prohibition does not apply to video editing or enhancement applications.
- (c) grant The City the perpetual, unlimited, and irrevocable right and license, solely for the purpose of the Contest, to use, license, edit, modify, duplicate, and/or create derivative works from the submission, including, but not limited to, the right for The City to publish, display, broadcast, distribute, reproduce, perform, create derivative works from and otherwise use and exploit the submission via the internet or any other interactive media, on television, and/or in print, without limitation and without payment of any compensation or notice of any kind to the Eligible Contestant(s), on its own or as part of any other production, for any advertising, marketing, publicizing or promotional purposes and in any materials related thereto (the “**License**”);
- (d) releases The City, its employees, officials, agents, officers, and representatives (the “**Parties**”) from any claims, demands, losses, and liabilities of any nature arising out of or in any way connected with the submission, and the use thereof as permitted hereunder, including, but not limited to, infringement of intellectual property rights, rights of personality, publicity, or privacy;
- (e) agrees to indemnify and hold harmless The City and the Parties from and against any claim or action brought by a person whose consent was not obtained by the contestant or by any person claiming its intellectual property rights, including without limitation, copyright, moral rights, trademark rights, or its personality or privacy rights;
- (f) by accepting a prize, each winner agrees to the use of their name, photo(s), and submission for publicity purposes in any medium, including on The City’s websites, without additional compensation or permission; and
- (g) indemnifies The City against any loss, damage, or injury resulting from participation in the Contest or the acceptance, use, or misuse of any prize.

5. JUDGING CRITERIA

- 5.1 All Eligible Contestants are enjoined to submit their entries during the Contest Period.
- 5.2 All submissions will be reviewed by a panel (the “**Review Panel**”) including at least five (5) individuals selected from within The City. The Review Panel will review the submissions, which will be discretionarily judged on topic knowledge, content clarity, critical thinking, creativity, and production.
- 5.3 The Review Panel shall evaluate group submissions within similar age and grade category and reserves the right in its sole discretion to move submissions from one category to another to guarantee fairness in evaluation.



- 5.4 Each submission will be judged on the following criteria to determine its score (the Review Panel Score):
- (a) 30%: Topic knowledge and content clarity;
 - (b) 30%: Critical thinking;
 - (c) 20%: Creativity and originality, and
 - (d) 20%: Production quality.
- (Collectively, the “**Review Criteria**”)
- 5.5 The Review Panel will discretionarily apply the Review Criteria between divisions to guarantee greater fairness in evaluation.
- 5.6 Each submission will receive a score expressed in the number of points out of a maximum possible of 10 on each of the four (4) aspects of the Review Criteria.
- 5.7 The total score in the four (4) scores will be added together and weighted according to their percentage importance for a total number of points awarded to the submission.
- 5.8 The submission with the highest score as determined by the most points awarded based on the Review Criteria will be selected as the potential winner at the Review Panel’s sole discretion.
- 5.9 While determining the winner, if two or more submissions finish with an identical score, all submissions receiving the highest score will be selected as potential winners and will share equally in the prize award.
- 5.10 All decisions by Review Panel regarding the Contest are final and without appeal.

6. PRIZING

- 6.1 The Review Panel will confer the winners with the highest score in each of the following categories:
- (a) Division 1 (Gr. K-3);
 - (b) Division 2(Gr. 4-6);
 - (c) Division 3 (Gr. 7-9);
 - (d) Division 4 (Gr. 10-12); and
 - (e) Classroom Prize Category – Depending on the number of classroom submissions received and at the sole discretion of the Review Panel, winners in this category may emerge from each of the Divisions (1 to 4) or from both Elementary(K-6) and Junior/Senior High(7-12)



- 6.2 The winners will be determined by the Review Panel at the public Screening event on April 27, 2026.
- 6.3 Prizes must be accepted as awarded. No assignment, transfer, or substitution of prize is permitted, except that The City reserves the right to substitute a prize of comparable or greater value at its sole discretion, for whatever reason.
- 6.4 The City reserves the right to replace a prize (or a portion thereof) with one of the same kinds and of equivalent value or, at its sole discretion, with the cash value of the prize (or a portion thereof) as indicated in the Contest rules.

7. PRIZES TO WON AND AWARD CEREMONY

- 7.1 The Eligible Contestants whose submissions follow the Contest rules shall make it to the finals (the “**Finalists**”). The Finalist will be invited to a public screening event to be held on April 27, 2026 at the Calgary Central Library.
- 7.2 At the public screening event, the winners of each category listed in section 6.1 above will be announced.
- 7.3 Winners will be able to choose from the following prize options value of up to \$1000 below:
 - a) A gift card/certificate to a local bike shop or sports store to be applied towards a new bike, scooter, or physical activity equipment AND the corresponding safety equipment;
 - b) A family membership to a local Calgary attraction such as the Zoo, TELUS Spark, Activate. Specific attraction to be discussed with winners. Some restrictions may apply;
 - c) AMA comprehensive new driver program course comprising of 18 hours in-class or virtual and 14 hours of in-vehicle instructions;
 - d) A gift card/certificate toward educational electronics, such as an iPad; or
 - e) For the Classroom division, the winning group will receive up to \$1,000 toward field trip transportation and/or additional costs or a class celebration.
- 7.4 To claim prizes, winners will be awarded a certificate at the screening event that will contain instructions on how to claim their prize.
- 7.5 Each Finalist(s) authorizes The City to use his/her name, photo, likeness, a statement regarding the prize, school, and/or voice for publicity purposes, without any additional form of compensation and agrees to execute and return a complete Model Agreement and Release to this effect before the public screening event.



8. PRIZE DELIVERY AND FOREFEITURE OF PRIZES

- 8.1 If any of the winners are absent at the public screening event, they will be notified by email using the contact information provided by the Eligible Contestant(s) at the time of entering the Contest.
- 8.2 If any potential winner(s) does not respond to such notification within five (5) business days, or declines a prize for any reason, they will be disqualified and have no recourse against The City, the prize will be forfeited and, at The City's discretion and if time permits, an alternate potential winner(s) may be selected from among all remaining Finalists.
- 8.3 Notwithstanding any other provision of the Contest rules, The City or its representatives will, in its sole discretion, determine how the delivery of the prize will occur and this may be either by mail or in-person.
- 8.4 Any costs or expenses associated with the prize not specified herein, including but not limited to travel to/from the public screening event or delivery of the prizes after the event will be the responsibility of the winner(s). Delivering the prize will fully satisfy all obligations that The City may have in connection with the award of any prize.

9. RIGHT TO SUSPEND, AMEND, OR TERMINATE THE CONTEST

- 9.1 The City reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to suspend, amend or terminate the Contest, in whole or in part, at any time and without prior notice or obligation or to amend the Contest rules in any way if, in its sole discretion, The City determines that it is necessary as a result of any event which threatens the administration, security, fairness, integrity, or proper conduct of the Contest.
- 9.2 The City reserves the right, in its sole discretion, and without prior notice, to adjust any of the dates and/or timeframes stipulated in the Contest rules, to the extent necessary, for purposes of verifying compliance by any contestant or submission with the Contest rules, or as a result of any technical or other problems, or in light of any other circumstances which, in the opinion of The City, in its sole discretion, affect the proper administration of the Contest as contemplated in the Contest rules, or for any other reason.

10. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 10.1 All submissions are subject to verification by The City. Any submission which is incomplete, fraudulent, submitted late, showing a wrong email address or phone number, or otherwise non-compliant with the Contest rules shall be rejected and will not entitle the contestant(s) to be entered in the contest.
- 10.2 By participating in the Contest, Contestants acknowledge that they have read, understood, and agree to be legally bound by the Contest rules and by the interpretation of these Contest rules by The City. Contestants further agree to be bound by the decisions of The City, which shall be final and binding in all respects without right of appeal, including, without limitation, any decisions regarding eligibility or disqualification of contestants.



- 10.3 The Contest is void where prohibited or restricted by law. Contestants residing in areas where the Contest is void are ineligible to win a prize.
- 10.4 In the event of any discrepancy or inconsistency among the Contest rules and disclosures, representations or other statements made by The City or the Released Parties or contained in any Contest-related materials, including, but not limited to, the Contest poster, website, television, print, online or other advertising or correspondence, the Contest rules shall prevail, govern, and control.
- 10.5 If any provision of these Contest rules is determined to be invalid or unenforceable in whole or in part, such invalidity or unenforceability attaches only to such provision and everything else in the Contest rules continues in full force and effect.
