Historic East Calgary Communities Local Area Plan – Engagement Opportunity

The new draft of the Historic East Calgary Communities Local Area Plan (also known as an Area Redevelopment Plan) is now available engage.calgary.ca.

It is the long-term vision for growth in the Ramsay and Inglewood communities, and surrounding areas. The policies in the new Local Area Plan (LAP) enable and support future planning and growth in the area, so your communities can continue to thrive in the coming years and decades.

When you read the LAP, it must be read with the Guidebook for Great Communities (<u>Calgary.ca/guidebook</u>). The Guidebook provides the foundational framework and policies for creating great communities, while the LAP offers additional local-specific guidance. If you're interested, you can review the <u>final proposed North Hills Communities Local Area Pan</u>, for reference.

We still need some of your time. With the new LAP still in draft form, we're looking for more information from you:

- comments on the formal name of the document
- future investment opportunities for community infrastructure
- thoughts on the draft LAP

From Feb. 12 to March 11, you can provide your input on these topics. Once the engagement is done, we will continue to refine the LAP. Once the final draft is completed, we'll have it available for public review. Currently, we expect to take the Historic East Calgary Communities Local Area Plan to Standing Policy Committee (SPC) on Planning and Urban Development before summer 2021. Green Line Enabling Works Update

Here is update on construction activities:

- At 12 Street S.E. and 17 Avenue S.E., ENMAX has completed their work. Shaw is currently finishing work here and Shaw is scheduled to finish their work at this site by February 15, weather dependent. Then, landscaping work will be completed in May.
- At Blackfoot Trail S.E. and 15 Street S.E., ENMAX, Shaw and TELUS will be working
 in this area until the end of April. This includes a significant amount of work along 15
 Street S.E. between 9 Avenue S. and Blackfoot Trail, as well as, along Blackfoot
 Trail just south of Crossroads Market.
- Existing Transmission poles and lines will be removed from 11 Street S.E. between 17 Avenue S and 26 Street S by mid-May.
