Inglewood Bird Sanctuary Reconnection Project - Engagement Update

Inglewood Sanitary Trunk- Project Update

The Inglewood Sanitary Trunk, which adds four kilometres of additional sanitary pipe to the network servicing Inglewood and Ramsay, completed construction in November 2020.

Upcoming landscape work:

We will be returning to 8 Avenue S.E. and 9 Street S.E. for three weeks starting in mid-June to complete final landscaping. The intersection will be closed for a couple of days during this time to accommodate asphalt repair.

Recent Green Line Announcements - Impact to Your Community

Over the past several weeks, we have made two important announcements on the Green Line project. You might be wondering what they mean for the Inglewood and Ramsay communities?

Beltline/Downtown Utility Relocation project

On May 25, we announced that work would start in the fall to relocate utilities in Beltline east and some parts of downtown to make way for the Green Line main construction. PCL Construction Management was selected to relocate the City sanitary, water and storm water utilities and help us coordinate with third-party providers to relocate their utilities for phone, cable, and fibre optic. As a resident of an adjacent community, you may travel through construction zones in the future and experience some impacts.

Here is what we know now:

- The major impacts to traffic and business access are not expected to happen until spring 2022.
- Once PCL finishes preconstruction planning and we have a firm schedule for construction, we'll [post updates](#) on our web site.
- Our stakeholder relations team will be in direct contact with residents and businesses affected by the utility relocations.
- We are working on traffic management plans to help maintain access to businesses throughout the area.

Refined procurement strategy moves Green Line forward

The Green Line Board is moving the Green Line LRT project forward, with the support of the Government of Alberta, following an extensive project review. The 2020 Council-approved alignment will now be constructed through a new phased procurement

strategy, with the first phase connecting the southeast to downtown and into the existing Red/Blue lines.

Here is what we know now:

- The alignment has not changed and no modifications have been made to the [Ramsay/Inglewood station](#) location.
- Basically, we are combining segment 1 and segment 2A into phase 1—from 126 Avenue S.E. to Eau Claire.
- The start date for main construction will be extended because we have changed the scope of the first [procurement](#). We will reissue the Request for Qualifications and Request for Proposals to the market, and that will take time.
- When we have a revised schedule, we will communicate it publicly to communities and citizens.
