


Inglewood/Ramsay City Projects Update – May 2020

The 2020 construction season is ramping up and there's lots happening in Inglewood & Ramsay. From 8 Avenue S.E. corridor improvements to 11 Street /12 Street S.E. route improvements to the Inglewood Sanitary Trunk, we're investing in one of Calgary's oldest neighbourhoods to keep it safe, beautiful and vibrant. 11 Street / 12 Street S.E. Route Improvements - Project Update

We are making changes to 11 Street and 12 Street S.E. between 9 Avenue and 26 Avenue S.E. to improve the connectivity, access and mobility for people who travel through Ramsay to connect to the Inglewood community.

Changes coming to 11 Street / 12 Street S.E.

In order to accomplish this, we are implementing the following changes:

- Installing a new asphalt sidewalk and ramps on the east side of 11 Street between 17 Avenue to 19 Avenue S.E.
- Adding a pedestrian crossing across 12 Street with overhead pedestrian flashers and installing a new access at 12 Street and 11 Avenue S.E. to create a better connected experience for people wheeling.
- Installing a new asphalt sidewalk and ramps along the west side of 11 Street between 21 Avenue and 26 Avenue S.E.
- Putting in a new bus pad on the west side of 11 Street just south of 23 Avenue S F
- Adding a wheelchair ramp on the southwest corner of 10 Avenue S.E. and 12 Street S.E. The wheel chair ramp will be smaller than usual to ensure the tree nearby does not need to be removed.

Construction update

The construction work for this project is scheduled to begin this summer and it will take approximately four to six weeks to complete. All construction is weather dependent and it will be scheduled to minimize impacts to businesses and traffic.

8 Avenue SE Corridor Improvements – Project Update

The City has been working with the Inglewood Community Association on a plan to improve the 8 Avenue S.E. corridor. To develop a corridor improvement plan, The City collected data on people who walk, cycle and drive in the Inglewood community. The City also used technical information and collected feedback from the Inglewood residents and stakeholders. The corridor improvement plan was presented to the community at an event organized by Councillor Gian-Carlo Carra at the Wood's Home in early March, 2020.

Changes coming to 8 Avenue S.E.

In order to accomplish this, we are implementing the following:

- Installing a traffic calming curb extension and wheelchair ramps on the west side of 8 Street to improve the safety and connection to the Bow River Pathway.
- Installing traffic calming curb extensions and wheelchair ramps along the southeast and southwest corners of 9 Street, 11 Street and the southeast corner of 14 Street S.E.
- Installing a traffic circle and a traffic calming curb extension on 13 Street S.E. with new crosswalks and wheelchair ramps to make crossing the street easier.
- Installing speed humps between 11 Street and 12 Street S.E., 12 Street and 13 Street S.E. and 13 Street and 14 Street S.E.

Anticipated benefits of the project

These improvements will help to reduce cut through traffic and vehicle speeding, as well as, improve pedestrian, cyclist and vehicle safety along the corridor. Phil Levson, President, Inglewood Community Association provided the following positive feedback on the plan to improve the corridor:

"Many citizens in Inglewood have expressed an increasing concern about the safety of pedestrians and cyclists using 8 Avenue S.E. We have been able to positively engage in a thoughtful and well executed process and collaboration with City staff over the last year to build a very solid traffic calming plan for citizens who use 8 Avenue S.E."

Construction update

The construction work for this project is scheduled to begin this summer and it will take approximately four to six weeks to complete. All construction is weather dependent and it will be scheduled to minimize impacts to businesses and traffic.

Inglewood Sanitary Trunk - Construction Update

We're continuing work at 9 Street S.E. and 8 Avenue S.E. to complete the last section of the Inglewood Sanitary Trunk and connection to the existing Inner City Trunk. To facilitate this work the intersection at 8 Avenue S.E. and 9 Street S.E. will be closed until the end of July 2020.

Construction at 9 Street S.E., south of 9 Avenue S.E. is complete and the road, including access to the back lane parking lots, has been reopened. Minor landscaping work will continue until approximately the end of May.

Canadian Pacific is installing a second rail bridge

Canadian Pacific (CP) is installing a second bridge over the Elbow River adjacent to and south of the existing rail bridge between 7 Street S.E. and 8 Street S.E. Bridge construction is planned for 2020, with additional work on CP property in 2021.

Closure of east Elbow River pathway

The City has closed the east Elbow River pathway under the CP tracks for the construction of the CP rail bridge. People walking in the area can use the pathway detour option that includes 11 Street/12 Street S.E. Pathway detour maps are now posted near the closure and <u>online</u> to help you see how you can continue to travel between Ramsay and Inglewood.

Will more tracks mean more rail traffic?

CP's bridge reconfiguration will improve rail traffic flow through Alyth Yard, enabling CP to process trains more efficiently. CP's rail traffic and train frequency fluctuates with the needs of its customers.
