Example Action Plan for Awesome Elementary School

This is an example of what a School Action Plan looks like. It was adapted from a Calgary school that previously participated in the Active & Safe Routes to School Program and can serve as a template to create your own School Action Plan. School Action Plans are living documents created by the Active School Travel Team to address the unique needs of each school. Your school may not need all the actions identified below, as there are many ideas out there for your school to consider.

Schools that are part of the Active and Safe Routes to School Program create travel plans with support from Ever Active Schools and The City of Calgary. The participating school forms their own Active School Travel Team that works with Ever Active and The City to encourage more students and families to choose Active School Travel (AST).

Your school **does not** need to be a part of the Active and Safe Routes to School Program to organize an Active Travel Team or develop an Action Plan. You may use the below example as a template for how to build your own Action Plan. Action Plan items are coded by the following type of intervention:
