


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LOCATION MAP

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PROJECT BACKGROUND

Background:

The Inglewood Transit Study is part of the 17th Ave SE Transportation Planning Study, which The City of Calgary has initiated to identify the future transportation requirements for the corridor.



Purpose of the Inglewood Transit Study:

The overall project purpose is to provide The City of Calgary with a recommended transportation plan for 17 Ave SE, to include reserved bus lanes with a continuous Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) service leading into the downtown through Inglewood.

A BRT is a distinctive, frequent and limited-stop bus service. Reserved bus lanes allow for transit priority at traffic signals.

In Inglewood the study will consider existing and future transit needs of the community, in order to accommodate the BRT service.







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STUDY AREA

The study area includes:

- 17th Avenue in Forest Lawn, from 84th Street to Deerfoot Trail
- 9th Avenue in Inglewood from Deerfoot Trail to the Elbow River Bridge









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STUDY GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

The main objective of the study is to identify a preferred transit route that will provide enhanced service along the 9 Ave SE and the 17 Ave SE corridors.

STUDY PROCESS

The main components of the study process are:

- Collection and analysis of Information about the study area
- Develop alternatives (preliminary route concepts)
- Open House #1 Show potential alternatives & request feedback
- Preliminary evaluation of alternatives
- Identify preferred alternative
- Open House #2 Present preferred alternative and recommendations
- · Finalize preferred alternative
- · Recommendations and report





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EXISTING TRANSPORTATION CONDITIONS

The Community of Inglewood and the 9th Avenue Corridor are an historic area of Calgary, with a mix of residential and commercial land uses. This area has been the focus of extensive planning studies over the past 4 decades.

9th Avenue features:

- Current BRT route for Route 305
- Part of Calgary's primary transit network
- 4 lanes for traffic, including parking on both sides (except in peak hours)
- Signalized intersections at 8th St, 12th St and 17th Ave / 15th St
- A number of accesses to properties and businesses fronting the roadway







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PRELIMINARY ALTERNATIVES

Alternative 1: Existing Alignment Along 9th Avenue

- Uses existing vehicle lanes on 9th Avenue, similar to current Route 305
- 2 potential variations (Alt 1B and 1C) for accessing 9th Avenue from 17th Avenue

Features:

- Fits best into the existing transit service (short to medium term)
- No infrastructure improvements required
- Sharing of common stop locations with existing routes
- · Increase frequency of buses along roadway

Alternative 2: New Alignment Following CPR Right-of-Way

Reserved Right-of-W ay along CP Rail alignment

Features:

- Reserved bus lanes resulting in higher transit priority (no conflicts with other vehicles)
- Potential to increase ridership from the southern community
- No increase of buses within community
- · Added infrastructure requirements
- · 9 Ave would continue to be served by local buses



The two alternatives will be evaluated based on the feedback received and according to the following criteria:

- Safety
- Traffic operations
- Transit and active modes
- Cost
- Social and environmental impacts





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NEXT STEPS
