Before the presentation

1. Name three (3) kinds of wild animals you have seen in your neighbourhood. What kind of places do these animals like to live in? (think about things like trees, grasses, ponds, etc.)

2. Review the following vocabulary words:

Adaptation – something that helps an animal or plant to survive in its habitat

Climate – average weather patterns in an area over a long period of time. This includes things like the temperature, the number of sunny days, and the amount of rain/snow.

Habitat – a place where an animal or plant lives and gets its food, water, and shelter.

Hibernation – when an animal sleeps for a long time, and saves energy by slowing down their breathing and heart rate


Migration – when an animal moves from one place to another at certain times of the year

Weather – what it's like outside from day to day. For example, if it's hot or cold, if it's cloudy or sunny, or if there's a thunderstorm!


