Project Background

The City of Calgary is building a new dry storm pond on the northwest end of the closed Ogden Dry Waste Landfill and completing the construction of an embankment adjacent to the storm pond, which will be part of the corridor for the future Green Line LRT.

Morgan Construction and Environmental Ltd. is the prime contractor hired by The City to complete the project.

Most of the work will take place from July to December 2020. 24-hour work is being considered to expedite the completion of the project. Landscaping and minor surface works will take place in the spring of 2021.

What we did in July

- ✓ Morgan has moved in all equipment, site office, and other site facilities. They are now responsible for the execution of the work, as well as the safety and environmental aspects of their operation;
- ✓ All applicable permits and authorization to proceed with the work are now in place;
- ✓ Completed baseline air quality sampling, baseline noise monitoring and other environmental measurements in the area;
- ✓ Completed work site clearing and grubbing, and trucked some of that material to the Shepard landfill;
- ✓ Initiated construction of dewatering sumps.

What to expect in August

Morgan will complete the installation of the facilities required to pump out and treat groundwater. It includes sumps, piping, and a treatment system. The success of this project depends heavily on lowering the groundwater and maintaining it low at least until the end of fall.

All groundwater pumped out will be treated prior to discharging into the sanitary system, in compliance with City bylaws.

As these activities advance, there may be some construction noises noticeable during the day. Once the equipment for handling the groundwater is in place, pumping and treatment of groundwater must be maintained 24x7. Provisions are put in place to keep noise and lighting disturbances at reasonable levels specially during the night.
