## Yes. Put these items in your garbage.

After reusing, composting and recycling, you will easily cut your garbage in half. Only items that have reached the end of their useful life should go in the garbage.


Mixed packaging and non-stretchy bags Even if it has a recycling symbol.


Plastic plates, cutlery and straws

Vacuum cleaner dirt and dryer lint


Furnace filters


Foam containers or foam packaging Even if it has a recycling symbol.


Painted and treated wood (small quantities)


Small broken appliances

Lotion and toothpaste tubes



Drink lids


## No. Keep these items OUT of your garbage.

For the safety of your collector and to prevent damage to the collection truck, the following items are not accepted in any of your carts.


No household hazardous waste
If an item has a hazard symbol, then it must be taken to a Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off, even if it's empty. Find locations at calgary.ca/hhw


No large electronics or appliances For recycling drop-off locations visit calgary.ca/whatgoeswhere


No automobile waste (ncluding car parts, tires and batteries)



No batteries

## Properly package and bag materials

- Sharp objects (e.g. broken mirrors or needles) need to be put in a puncture resistant container such as a plastic tub to prevent injuries to your driver. Seal tightly and place in your black cart.
- Dusty materials (e.g. vacuum dust) need to be double bagged for dust control. Tie the bag closed and place it in your black cart.
